OREGON STATE BASEBALL PREVIEW

Oregon State head coach **Jack Riley** has been anxiously awaiting the 1993 season, after a disastrous 1992 campaign which saw the Beavers finish sixth in the Pacific-10 Conference's North division for the first time in history.

Riley is hoping that his cagey veterans and youthful group of a year ago will bring the program back to the upper echelon of the conference, where Oregon State is accustomed to being.

"We were lacking last year when it came to competitiveness and aggressiveness in key situations," explained Riley. "The lack of those ingredients is a direct result of our inexperience.

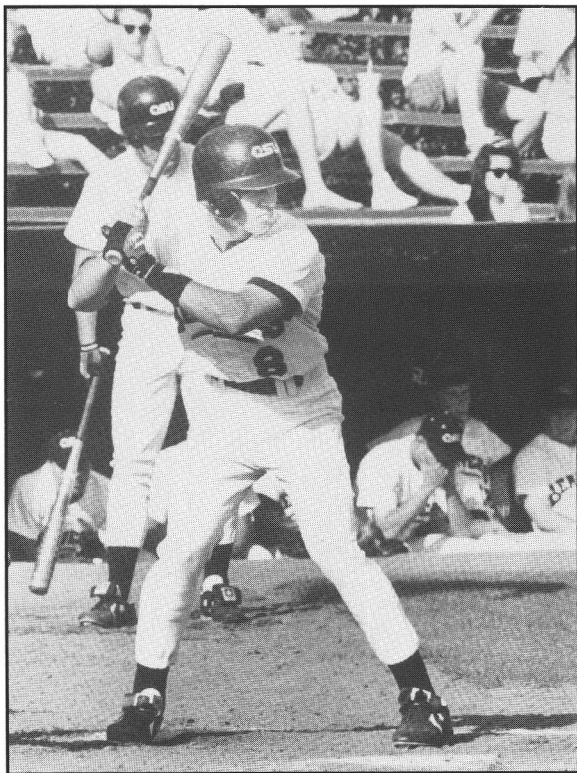
Oregon State had five starting position players and two prominent pitchers who were in their first season of major college baseball. Riley hopes that won't be the case again in 1993, but realizes the need for an influx of talent.

"We don't have a ball club where we know who our nine guys are," said Riley. "We do like our nucleus on paper, but we still are going to have to throw the bat out and look at a lot of options."

A look at Oregon State by position:

OUTFIELD

All three outfield positions are wide open going into the early part of the season. Senior **Jason Akina** (.333, 24 RBI) is the only veteran player listed on the depth chart. Akina is penciled in at left field, although Riley might opt to use him as more of a speciality player.

The cast of newcomers battling for playing time in the outfield include touted community college transfer **Brent Watts** and true-freshman **A.J. Marquardt**. Both players have exceptional speed, an ingredient recent Beaver teams have been lacking. Watts batted .350 and stole 50 bases last season at Chemeketa CC in Salem, Ore., and Marquardt hit .543 with 34 stolen bases at Kennewick (WA) High.

"It's going to be competitive in the outfield," said Riley. "I do think we have shored ourself up defensively with the addition of some speed."

Also in the picture are sophomores **Marc Malloy** (.200, 3 RBI) and **Johnny Dixon** and JC transfer **Tim Kissner**. Malloy played in just five games last season. Dixon did not play and Kissner batted .383 with 28 RBI for Mendocino College.

INFIELD

It's pretty much the returners' positions to lose, as last year's starters are listed No. 1 on the pre-season depth chart.

Senior **Jon Yonemitsu** (.286, 24 RBI) returns as the elder statesman of the club. Yonemitsu, who will play second base, has started nearly every game at OSU. Riley is hoping for more consistency and more of a leadership role from him this season.

Sophomore **Jamie Burke** (.333, 36 RBI) returns as one of the better third basemen on the West Coast. The second team All-Pac-10 pick last season, who also co-led the team in batting in '92, has been tabbed a top pick in the June draft by *Baseball America*.

"Jamie Burke is a quality competitor with a knack for hitting, and we haven't had that at Oregon State in a while," noted Riley. "His skills are developing and he will be a draftable player."

Sophomores **Jim Champion** (.228, 18 RBI) and **Allen Snelling** (.187, 14 RBI) are the returning starters at first base and shortstop. Both need to improve in their consistency factor for the team to improve.

"Jim has the ability to be an outstanding college player, but we need him to work on his concentration," said Riley. "Allen has developed into a stronger player, but we would like to see his hitting improve."

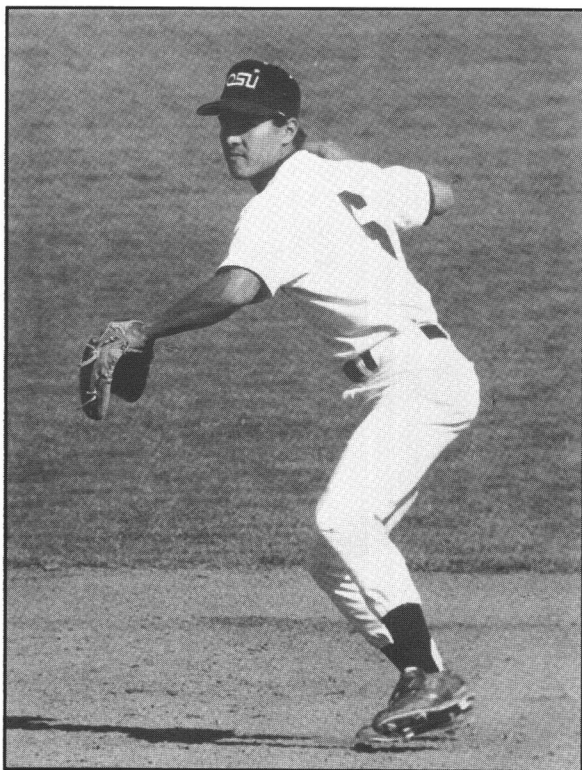
There will be competition in the infield and potential position moves. Los Medanos Junior College transfer **Jason Larson**, who batted .339 last season, appears to have an outstanding chance of unseating a returning starter. Also figuring into the picture are sophomore **Pat Meiwes** (1992 redshirt), and freshmen **Scott Eilers** and **Chi Lee**.

CATCHING

Three-year letterman **Randy Hunter** (.313, 29 RBI) enters this season as the starting catcher, although if warranted he may see action in the infield. Hunter was solid behind the plate last season and has shown signs he may be even better in 1993.

"Randy has definitely shown through winter workouts he is a different individual as far as the mental approach to the game," explained Riley.

If Hunter isn't behind the plate watch for junior **Brooke Knight** (.253, 18 RBI) or sophomore **Eric Lovinger** (.204, 6 RBI) to step in. Knight showed his versatility last season filling in for Burke at third base for 14 games and contributing with some quality offensive games. Lovinger needs to rebound from injuries to become a factor.

PITCHING

For Oregon State to make a run at the 1993 league title, pitching must return after a disappointing 1992 by nearly the entire staff.

Leading the hurlers is junior left-hander **Scott Christman** (6-5, 3.50 ERA), a second team All-Pac-10 North honoree last year who posted the second lowest ERA in the league. Christman looks to be a certain draft pick at the conclusion of the season.

"He's throwing up to 90 miles per hour and he has major league stuff," exclaimed Riley. "His consistency and his maturity are going to have a great deal to do with his success. He is going to be a high draft choice,

there's a lot of interest in him."

Riley knows he has a gem in Christman, but he needs some players with pretty high credentials and unlimited potential to make the next step, or in some cases to return to past performance levels. Junior right-hander **Mason Smith** (2-5, 5.35 ERA) is coming off a poor season and the success of this team could partly hinge on him posting numbers similar to his freshman season when he had a 6-4 mark with a 3.17 ERA.

"Mason has had to work on some mental adjustments," said Riley. "He was kind of wild in spots last season, but he has the talent to help this team."

A pair of right-handers, junior **Kevin Hooker** (2-2, 5.66 ERA) and sophomore **Mike Thurman** (1-0, 5.06 ERA) could fill in the starting rotation. Hooker, who was a first team All-Pac-10 first baseman as a freshman, also needs to put a less than optimal 1992 behind him and become the pitching force that Riley envisions he can be. Thurman showed signs he is a "prospect" for the future after being effective in relief.

"Kevin's stuff is good and he should be helped by the fact he has made some definite physical improvement," said Riley. "Mike is one we feel is going to be a 'can't miss.' He has very good mechanics and he could very well become one of our top pitchers."

The Beavers have a trio of newcomers in junior college transfer right-hander **Jason Myers**, and true-freshmen left-hander **Ryan Heinrich** and right-hander **Jess Sitterud**, who look to be able to contribute right away. Myers was 14-4 with a 2.50 ERA over two years at Linn-Benton CC in Albany, Ore., Heinrich was 9-0 with 0.84 ERA at Pendleton (OR) High and Sitterud was 9-2 last year at Oakmont High in Roseville, Cal.

"All three pitchers have to make the transition to this level, but I expect they can help us this season," said Riley.

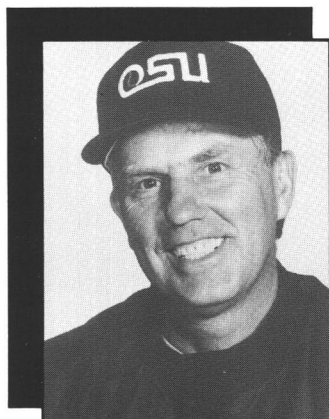

JACK RILEY Head Coach (21st Year)

Jack Riley enters year No. 21 as the head coach of one of the most successful programs on the West Coast. Under the direction of the 54-year-old Linfield College graduate, the Beavers have posted

winning marks 15 times, including seven 30-win campaigns. His career total entering this season is 548-369 (.598).

The 1993 season will be historic in Oregon State baseball, as Riley will undoubtedly become the school's all-time winningest baseball coach. He is just 12 wins shy of the legendary Ralph Coleman for victories. Coleman was the head coach from 1923-31 and 1938-66.

"Well, I don't think you can compare my record to Coleman," says Riley in his usual low-key approach to such records. "Baseball has changed a lot in the last 30 years from the number of games to the resources. But I guess if you are around long enough this kind of thing (about the record) can happen."

During the Riley tenure Oregon State has produced a winning percentage of nearly 60 percent and has four Pacific-10 Conference Northern Division titles. Riley has been named the league coach of the year three times (1982, '83, '86) and the Regional Coach of the Year in 1982.

Riley's hard work and dedication is evident in all aspects of the game, from the very beginning of his tenure in 1973 to the current day. In his first five seasons, Oregon State posted a winning record three times, and in his last eight seasons, the team has posted 30 victories five times. Riley led the Beavers to a school record 39 wins and a third place finish in the Midwest Regional in 1986.

Riley's record speaks for itself, but he also has many tangibles that don't show up in the records and statistics -- he's a teacher and a motivator. He is known by his former players and coaches as a great communicator at a group or individual level.

Those teaching skills are something Riley learned at an early age as a players and young coach. He was a two-time first team All-Northwest Conference outfielder at Linfield College in McMinnville, Ore., and went on to sign a contract with the Los Angeles Dodgers. After a three-year stint with the minor league Salem Dodgers, he accepted the head basketball coaching position at Jefferson High School in Portland.

Riley then moved on to Lower Columbia College and got his chance to coach his first love, baseball. He coached baseball at the Longview, Wash., school for six seasons, compiling a sparkling record of 93-29 (.762). He also served as the school's athletic director.

Riley is a 1960 graduate of Linfield with a B.S. in physical education and earned a master's degree in education in 1971 from Oregon State. He and his wife, Jean, have one daughter, Pam, and two sons, Mike and Mickey. Mickey will work as an assistant coach with the Beavers this season.

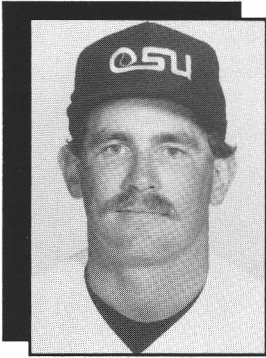

Coaching Career: Kemp is in his sixth season as an assistant coach at OSU. Before his second coaching stint at OSU, he served as an assistant coach at Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Ariz., from 1984-87, and

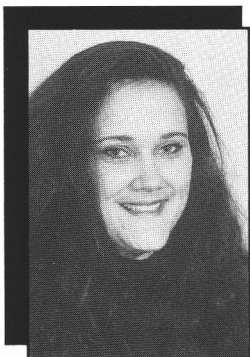
helped lead the Roughriders to the 1986 Junior College World Series in Grand Junction, Colo. He also served as the junior varsity coach and graduate assistant at OSU during the 1983 season.

College Athletic Career: Kurt was a first team all-league and second team all-region selection in 1979 and '80 at Linn-Benton Community College in Albany, Ore. He led the Roadrunners to back-to-back Junior College World Series appearances. In 1981 he played third base and catcher at Portland State and in 1982 he was a third baseman and shortstop at Southern Utah State.

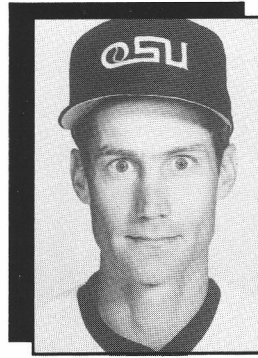
Prep Athletic Career: Kurt earned four letters while playing shortstop for Corvallis High School. He was an all-state selection as a junior and senior. He also was part of Corvallis' 44-game Valley League winning streak. Kemp lettered twice in football and once in basketball for the Spartans as well.

Education: Kurt graduated from Oregon State University in 1983 with a B.S. in business administration. He is a 1978 graduate of Corvallis High School.

Personal: Born September 2, 1960. He is married to the former Marcie McCauley. Kemp also serves as the commissioner of the Noon Basketball League (NBL).

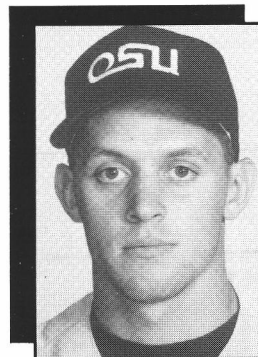
Coaching Career: Mickey is a player/coach for the Perth Heat of the Australian League, playing second base. Riley served as a graduate assistant at Oregon State for three years

from 1989-91, working with the infielders. The son of the OSU head coach was previously in Australia assisting with the national baseball program.

College Athletic Career: The 1983 all-division and all-region second baseman started four years at Oregon State, contributing to the 1982 and '83 Northern Division titles. He batted .374 during the '83 season, his junior year, and completed his Beaver career with a .299 average. Riley ranks in the top 10 at OSU in several career categories, including at-bats (565), hits (169), runs (118), doubles (31) and stolen bases (34).

Prep Athletic Career: Riley earned All-Valley league honors as a senior at Corvallis High after hitting .323. He spent his first three years at Crescent Valley High, also in Corvallis.

Personal: Born August 8, 1961. He has one son, Skyler, and one daughter, Britney.

COLEMANFIELD

Oregon State plays its home games at Ralph Coleman Field, located on Washington Way, next to the Dixon Recreation Center and one block from Gill Coliseum on the OSU campus.

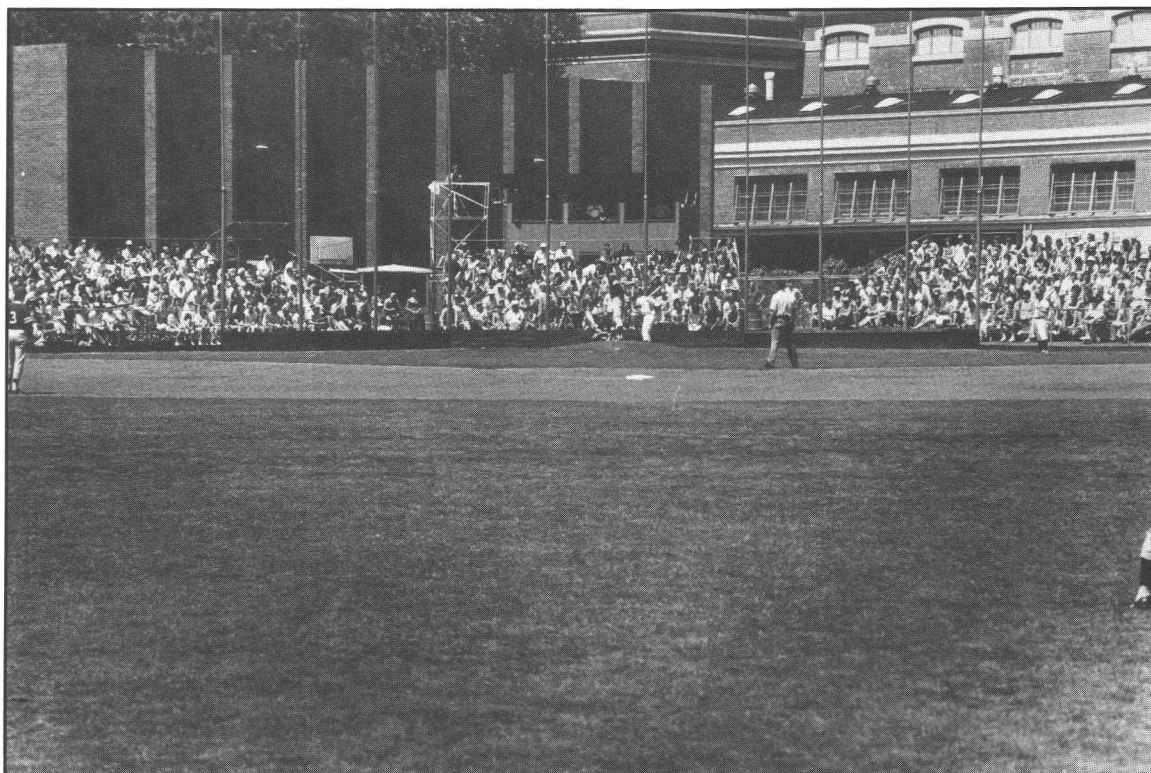
Coleman Field underwent a change during the offseason as the left field fence was moved closer to home plate to its current position of 330 feet — 355 feet was the old distance. In addition the fence was lowered from 25 feet in left field to six feet. The dimensions are now 330 to left and right field, 365 to left-center and right-center field, and 400 to center field.

Coleman Field has a seating capacity of in excess of 3,000 and features one of the finest natural grass surfaces in the Northwest.

In 1981, the Ralph Coleman dedication honored

the Beaver alum and head coach of Beaver baseball from 1923-31 and from 1938-66 — 36 years as head baseball coach and 47 all told with the OSU coaching staff. Coleman compiled a record of 560-317, a winning percentage .639.

Further improvements to the field have been accomplished through the hard work of staff, players and various generous donations. The Corvallis Beaver Huddle support group and the Pastega Bottling Company of Corvallis provided the Scott Halbrook electronic scoreboard. The scoreboard is in dedication to the memory of the 1981 freshman outfielder, who died in a freak accident just three days prior to his first season with the Beavers. His inspiration spurred OSU to the next two Northern Division crowns.
