## COMMENCEMENT

Plans for O. A. C.'s forty-ninth annual commencement have just been completed. An attractive program has been arranged including a number of features of special importance and interest to Alumni. The best speakers available have been secured. The second service flag will be dedicated and other special honors conferred on the men in the service. The time and the nature of the occasion is such it is expected that a large number of Alumni will attend.

### Date Changed.

According to the College Catalogue Alumni Day should be Monday, June 3, and final commencement exercises Tuesday, June 4. In order to render it possible for a larger number of Alumni to be present, all of the usual exercises of commencement week have been condensed into a week-end program beginning on Saturday afternoon and ending at noon on the following Monday

### Alumni Day, June 1.

Saturday, June 1, will be Alumni Day. The activities of the day will begin at 2:30 p. m. and continue until 11:00 p. m. The afternoon will be devoted to registration and the annual business meeting. The Alumni luncheon will take place at 6 o'clock and will be followed by the Annual Alumni Ball in honor of the graduating class.

Waldo, pastor of the White Temple in Portland, will be the speaker.

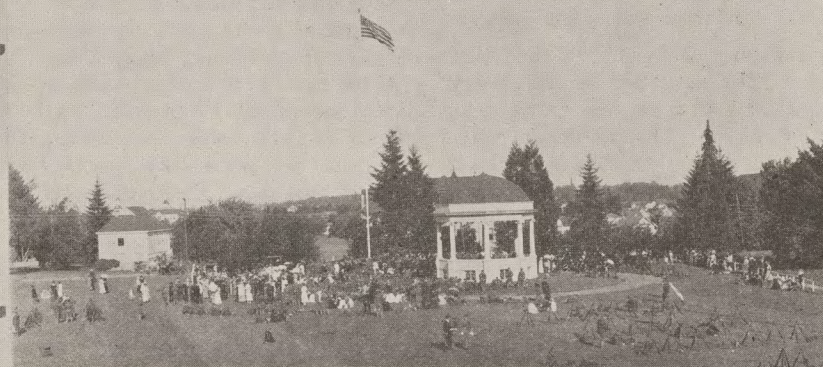
### Will Dedicate the Flag.

The final commencement program will occupy the forenoon of Monday, June 3. At this time the second service flag will be dedicated. The principal address will be delivered by Dr. William Allen White, a speaker with a nation-wide reputation, as an author, journalist, and politician. At the present time he is the proprietor and editor of the Kansas City-Emporia Daily Gazette. He is the author of a number of books and a contributor to a number of leading magazines. Dr. White took a prominent part in the activities of the Progressive National Party in 1912, being a member of the National Committee. He is considered one of the ablest speakers in the entire country.

### Alumni Expected.

The entire commencement program has been planned with a view to enabling alumni and out-of-town guests







to be present. By coming to the campus Saturday and leaving Monday the entire program, which is especially attractive this year, may be witnessed. Several hundred members of the alumni reside within a few hours journey of the campus, and it is expected that many of them will attend, not only for Alumni Day functions, but all of the events of commencement week.

### THE CLASS OF 1918

A tentative list of candidates for graduation in June has just been compiled by Registrar Tennant. As near as can be determined at this time, 152 Bachelor's Degrees and 6 Master's Degrees will be conferred this year. The exceptional decrease in the size of the graduation class is due, of course, to the war conditions. A very large number of Juniors of last year entered the service, and also a number of Seniors withdrew during the first semester of this year to take up various phases of war work.

The number who will be present to receive their degrees will probably not exceed fifty percent of the total number of graduates, as 89 have already met the requirements for graduation and have left the Campus. Twenty-eight of these entered the Fourth Officers' Training Camp, May 15. This year's graduation class represents the various schools and departments of the College as follows: General Agriculture 10, Farm Crops 8, Animal Husbandry 8, Horticulture 5, Agricultural Chemistry 1, Entomology 3, Botany and Plant Pathology 1, Farm Management 8, Dairying 5, Commerce 11, Chemical Engineering 1, Civil Engineering 2, Electrical Engineering 11, Mechanical Engineering 14, Mining 3, Industrial Arts 5, For-

estry and Logging Engineering 7, Home Economics 55, Pharmacy 4.

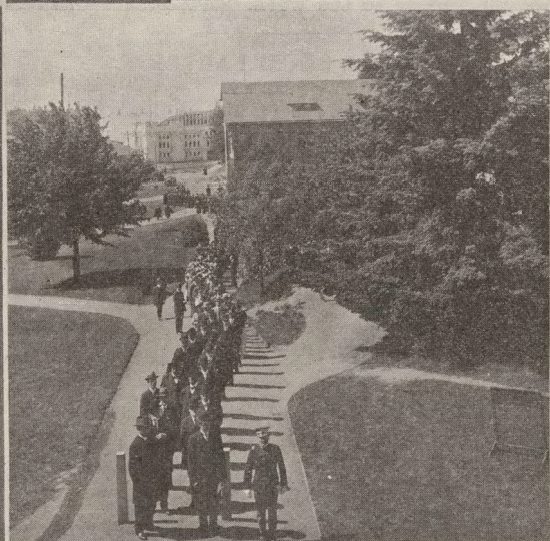

## THE BUSINESS MEETING

Members of the Alumni should make an especial effort to attend the annual business meeting scheduled for the afternoon of Saturday, June 1. Questions of importance affecting the future work of the Association will come up at this meeting. All graduates naturally desire to have a part in shaping the destinies of the Alumni work. It is important, therefore, that they should express their views on important issues.

It is true that the solution of these problems rests with the Board of Directors, but the Directors can act wisely for the Association only when they know the opinions and desires of its members.

Two directors are to be elected by those who attend the meeting, June 1. The term of W. Y. Masters, now president of the Association, expires Alumni Day. His successor will be chosen to serve for a period of five years. There is another vacancy on the Board due to the absence of M. V. Weatherford, who is now in France.

Mr. Weatherford's term does not expire until June, 1920. He offered to present his resignation before sailing for France in order that his place might be filled, but the Board refused to accept it. It is imperative, however, that his work be provided for and it will therefore be in order to elect a new director to serve until Mr. Weatherford returns or in case he does not return before June 1920, to complete the term.

Both of these positions should receive careful consideration and be filled by men capable and willing to do justice to the work.

## THE SECRETARYSHIP

The present Alumni Secretary is preparing this issue of the Alumnus with the expectation of it being the last number to be put out under his supervision. During the past three years we have attempted to make the Alumnus of interest and value to members of the Alumni and to the Association. We realize that the magazine is not what it should be, but it is impossible to improve the situation so long as the work is in the hands of an individual who is required to handle it merely as a side issue. The secretaryship should be placed in the hands of someone who has the time and inclination to develop it to its fullest possibilities. It is too great a task for anyone to take care of during merely spare moments. This is true not only because it is impossible to do the work satisfactorily in such limited time, but also because it is too great a sacrifice to expect one to make. It is hoped that the Alumni Board of Directors will see fit to hire a secretary who can give a certain amount of time to the work and receive a reasonable com-



pensation for his services. The writer knows that the Board of Directors concurs with him in this opinion but in order to carry it out the Board and Association must receive greater financial support from the Alumni generally. Whatever action is taken we know there will be a new Alumni secretary and we therefore desire to make the work more effective during the coming year than it has been during the past.

### RESIGNATION

Since the beginning of the war the College has lost a large number of faculty men, many of whom were holding positions of very great importance. Some of these withdrawals were caused by the desire of men to enter the war service, but probably the larger majority were caused by more attractive salaries being offered elsewhere. It is a very regrettable fact that the College hasn't the money to hold its staff intact not only in these critical times but at all times. It is unfortunate, of course, to have so many changes continually taking place. In spite of this fact, the large number of withdrawals will in no way seriously hamper the work of the College next year. President Kerr has been continually on the look-out to fill vacancies as they occur and is meeting with remarkable success. A number of instructors, all of whom have very excellent records, have already been secured to fill these positions. We have heard it rumored that the College staff will be weaker next year and thus the quality of the work not up to standard. This, however, is far from the true situation and members of the Alumni should take pains to correct any such rumors that get afloat. As a matter of fact it is now

evident that O. A. C. will have an exceptionally strong faculty at the beginning of the next College year. In one department of the College, Chemistry, six resignations have had to be accepted during the year just closing. Nevertheless five of these vacancies have already been filled by men whose records of training and experience are of the very highest character.

## THE SERVICE FLAG

The O. A. C. service flag, in honor of the graduates and former students now in the service, was dedicated at a special Convocation in honor of the occasion April 23. The flag contained 1056 stars of which six were golden, honoring those men who have already given their lives in the cause of the war. Since that time a number of others have entered the service and still others have been located so that the total number of O. A. C. representatives in the various departments of the war service is now over 1200.

An interesting statement in connection with the dedication of the flag was the announcement that nearly 500 of these men are either commissioned or noncommissioned officers. A number of interesting facts of this nature were given by President Kerr in his address in accepting the flag, a copy of which is presented elsewhere in this issue. Another service flag is now being prepared to take care of the large increase in the number of stars and will be dedicated as a part of the regular Commencement exercises on June 3.

The flag, which is the gift of the student body to the College, was prepared by the girls of the Home Economics Club, who presented it, at the exercises, to the student body. It was accepted by the president of the student body, who in turn presented it to the College. President Kerr accepted it in behalf of the Board of Regents and the College.

The flag which is 10x15 feet in dimensions, made of richest satin, is designed to fit one of two large panels in the north wall of the main reading room in the new Library Building. Temporarily it is displayed at Convocations in the Men's Gymnasium.

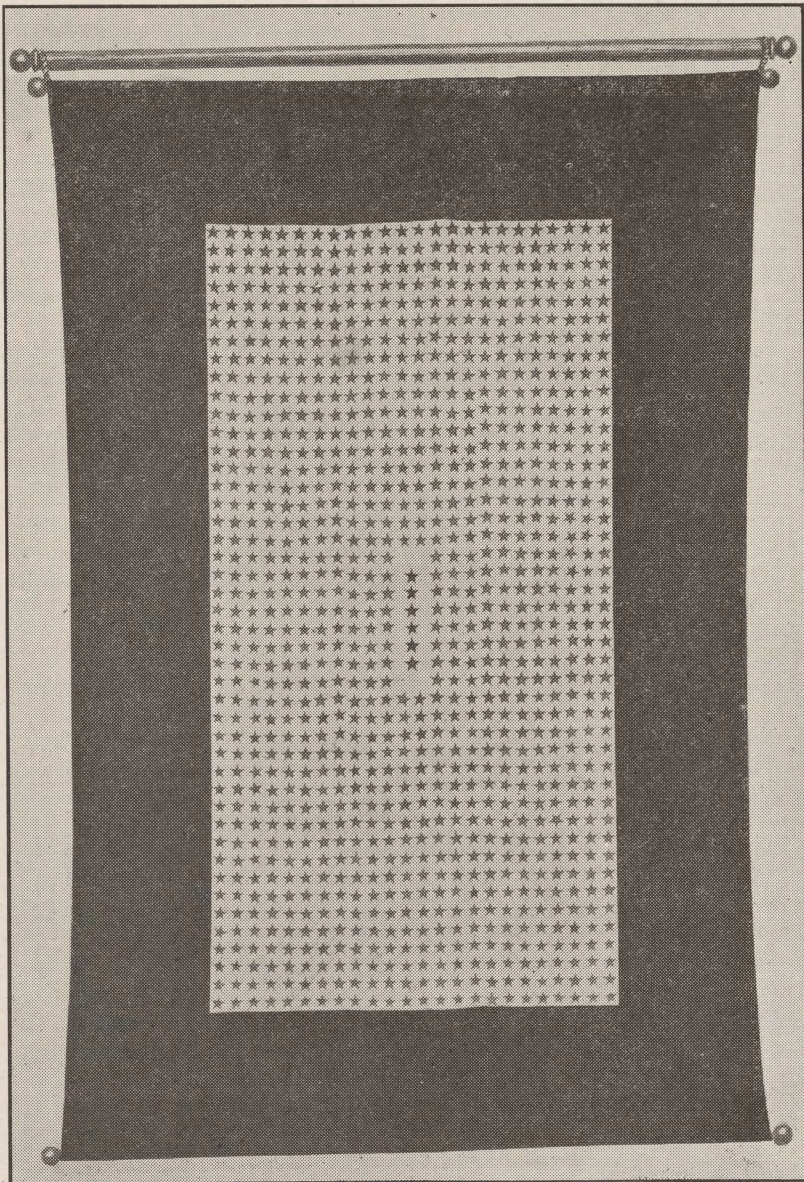

**FULL TEXT OF PRESIDENT  
KERR'S SERVICE FLAG  
ADDRESS, APRIL 22**

Mr. Cramer, President Student Body, and Students:

It is a privilege and an honor to accept for the College from the students this beautiful flag. I want to compliment the student body upon the spirit which prompted you in presenting this flag. I want to congratulate the members of the Home Economics Club for the artistic and perfect work which they did in preparing this flag. To me this is an inspiring occasion—sad, impressive. This flag will serve as a constant reminder to all of us of the sacrificial service of our representatives—students, graduates, faculty—in the cause of our country and of freedom. This flag will serve as a constant reminder to us of our duty to country and humanity. There are on this beautiful flag 1,056 stars. The number, faculty, graduates, and students, representing this Institution now in the service reaches 1,108. Material for another flag has already been purchased by the student body, that provision may be made for stars representing those for whom there is no room on this flag. The new flag will be completed and brought up-to-date in time for final presentation at Commencement.

**1108 Men in the Service.**

You will observe that already, though we have been in the war but a very brief period, there are on this College flag six golden stars, each representing one dear student of this Institution whose life has been sacrificed in the service. Will you all rise and with me give a brief moment to silent prayer in honor of these our six beloved departed.

You will be interested in knowing

that those who have gone into the service occupy various positions in practically all divisions—infantry, artillery, aviation, the navy, engineers, hospitals, medical, signal, cavalry, and a few in miscellaneous lines of service. There is one colonel, there are two lieutenant-colonels, four majors, 18 captains, 89 first lieutenants, 128 second lieutenants, 101 sergeants, 87 corporals; altogether, in official position of one kind or another, 457. The total number is 1,108.

**A War of All the People.**

The time is not opportune nor is this the occasion for a lengthy address by me. I should like, however, in accepting this splendid flag, to call attention to two things: This war, the greatest, most destructive, devastating war in history, is not, as has been true of previous wars, largely, if not entirely, a war of the military. It is now recognized not only by the Allies with whom we are fighting, but by the opponent nations as well, that this war is a war of all the people, and can be won only through the sacrificing devotion and determination of all the people. We, the American people, are in this war because we regard it as a most righteous war. We are in this war as a nation and as individuals, because we believe it is a war for freedom, not alone of the small European countries, but of our own country, a war for the perpetuity of our free institutions. We are in this war because we believe that involved in the outcome is the entire future welfare of humanity.

**Opposing Warriors Quoted.**

May I read two brief statements: The following is an excerpt from an address by Kaiser Wilhelm to the German soldiers: "When you meet the foe you will defeat him." That,



of course, is to be expected in war, but listen: "No quarter will be given, no prisoners will be taken. Let all who fall into your hands be at your mercy." Now with this in mind, recall the accounts repeated so often by eye witnesses of the inhuman, barbaric atrocities perpetrated by the soldiers of the Central Powers upon innocent women and children, and then listen to these words from the man in charge of the American troops in Europe. Addressing his soldiers he says: "You are now in France to expel an enemy that has invaded this beautiful land. Your first duty is to fight against this foe and protect our Allies." That also would, of course, be expected, but now note these words: "You are here also to lift a shield above the poor and invalid; you will be courteous to all women and never have so much as an evil thought in your mind. You will be very tender and gentle with little children. You will do well, therefore, to foreswear the use of liquors. You will do your duty like brave men. Fear God, honor your country, defend liberty. God have you in his keeping."

#### **Words of Scott and Daniels Repeated.**

The second thought I have in mind is in connection with the statement that this is a war of all the people, combatant and non-combatant alike. Listen to these words of Major General Hugh L. Scott, which appeared just yesterday:

"It is imperative that the shipyards, the munition shops, the farmers in the field, and the workers at the benches keep steadily to their tasks if we are to win."

Again, may I read one sentence from a recent statement by Secretary of the Navy Daniels, in his address delivered to several thousand shipbuilders:

"You men will march in line with the men who fought in the trenches

and stood on the decks of the destroyers, when the war is won. Every day we delay in sending a destroyer we are delaying the redemption of the world. \* \* \* We should all be dedicated to the task before us. The command to everyone in America is: 'Full speed ahead!'"

#### **Industrial Service Discussed.**

We must have ships—destroyers, merchant ships, battleships, ships of all kinds. We must have them as rapidly as possible if we win. We must have munitions, artillery, clothing, food. We must not only produce food, we must also conserve food. All these will involve sacrifice, effort, determination, on the part of the people. Now, if we have ships, if we manufacture all of the various things required, if we produce food, if we conserve food, we shall require specialists in all divisions of engineering, of agriculture, of forestry, of home economics—and the men and women in these different divisions of the service, called because of the imperative demand for material required in this great war, material which otherwise cannot be produced, are as much in the service of their country as are those who are serving in any other capacity. While not subjected to the dangers confronting the fighting men, their work is no less important in achieving final victory. It has therefore occurred to me that this Institution, so peculiarly adapted to the training of the men and women required in all these divisions of service, might consistently have also an industrial service flag, that suitable recognition might thereby be given to those representing the College in an important way as specialists in different divisions of industrial war work.

And now, while we honor those who are represented on these flags, may we not here resolve, even more firmly



than ever before, that we shall do our full duty, as we know they will do theirs, in this great crisis, in helping to win the war for freedom and humanity.—Reported by Mary Bowman Hull.

## LETTERS FROM MEN IN THE SERVICE

---

The following are extracts from a letter written by Captain S. E. Brett, '16, to Professor Newins of the School of Forestry. He was with the first American troops to reach France.

"Right now we are having the time of our sweet young lives. We have met the people on the other side of the wire several times now, and it is always the same tale; they are either killed, captured, or driven back. The spirit of our men is wonderful. You know the average American boy has a natural aversion to a Dutchman, and this aversion has not been diminished a particle since we have landed. Now that the mystery of the whole game has been cleared away from their eyes they are wild to get at them and finish the game, and believe me they will do it.

"Met Ballin the other day. Went spinning along the road on a motorcycle when I passed a familiar face. I stopped, and durned if it wasn't the old boy himself. He is a sergeant in one of the engineer outfits over here. He told me that several of the other fellows were over here and that they were all making good.

"Tried to climb a tree with my motorcycle the other day, but only got as far as the lower branches. Also pulled another stunt about a month ago which cost me eight days in the base hospital, but everything is lovely now."

John R. Brooke, Jr., ex'18, is now a captain of infantry stationed at Camp Walter R. Tiliaferro, San Diego, Cal.

He writes: "There are several O. A. C. fellows in this regiment or around here. Albert D. Foster, a First Lieutenant, John Flint, '15, is a corporal in "F" company and was sent to the R. O. T. C. at Camp Kearny recently. Leigh Churchill, ex-'18, is a sergeant of the Medical Corps here. I have seen quite a number running around in sailors' uniforms. Also quite a number have passed through the Aviation school at North Island."

Dear Sir:

The student body of O. A. C. would undoubtedly be interested to know how some of her loyal sons fared after their unusual experiences on board the S. S. Tuscania—the torpedoed ship.

The catastrophe occurred at 5:50 p. m., just as the day was ended. I had finished my supper, and was on deck when the ship took a sudden jar. The explosion occurred instantaneously.

As each company had its particular lifeboat, the scramble and confusion was not so great as might be expected. With a few exceptions the lowering of the boats was done in good order.

As soon as it was thought safe to venture near, the rescue ships came. Three torpedo boats carried away 500 men each.

The O. A. C. men that were saved were "Dug" Pine, C. E. Johnson, C. L. Johnson, G. T. Beven, Harry J. Cole, Jas. Clarke, a Beaver club man of two years and myself.



We all had our experiences and hope to be able to tell you about them some day.

Tell the O. A. C. student body that we are not downhearted by the incident but are more determined to win the war. Yours sincerely,

A letter received from J. E. McCollum, '17, from "over there" is here given in part:

"Christmas Day. Snowing, and everybody happy. We are having a Christmas tree this afternoon for the children from the nearby villages whose fathers are in the trenches. The hat was passed and the boys shipped in to the amount of 650 francs, a little more than \$125, with which we purchased candies, toys, etc.

"We are fairly settled here and are working right along. My company had the distinction of cutting the first log ever cut by an American forester in France."

"Am at a French artillery school, learning the artillery game from the French standpoint. The French, without doubt, have the best and most perfect system in the world, and the best of it is being taken by our own Government. I am on the go from 6 a. m. until 10:30 p. m., when I am glad to turn into bed, dead tired.

"Have lots of horseback riding, gun practice on the range, wireless, map work, surveying, and all the technical part of making guns and ammunition; ballistics, and also a lot of hippology, and also some physical training.

"There is hardly a course that I took at O. A. C. that is not helping me at this game. My manual training is helping me in my fortification work and the building of gun platforms. My math. and drafting is

helping also. My pedagogy and teaching experience are certainly going to be of great help in the next six months. I expect to have to do a large amount of instruction work, in the new field artillery regiments that are coming over now.

"The country is like Portland, Ore., and Seattle. Firewood is very scarce, so is pastry, candy and tobacco. It is rather cold, but we feel it very much on account of the dampness.

"Have been here about three weeks now. Have received no mail from the U. S. for a month or more, as the mail service is very poor at present, but is improving very rapidly. Uncle Sam's soldiers are taken care of 200 percent better than the other Allies' soldiers.

"I saw Lieutenant Ben Shubert, of the Theta Chi house, at O. A. C., '17, in England. Some of the boys there may remember him. Harry Belknap, ex-instructor in Physics at O. A. C., is here going to school with me. He is a First Lieutenant, and is going strong.

"Expect to be here about two months more. Then I will go out to some outfit.

"Well, I must close.

Mrs. Kidder, librarian, has received a letter from David McCamant, now in France with the 162nd Infantry. Mr. McCarmet was a student here last year. His letter follows:

"Dear Mrs. Kidder: From Camp Green, where I last wrote you, we went north to Camp Mills near New



York City. We stayed there about five weeks, training intensively from daylight to dark and then departed for the A. E. F.

"Over here we are Americanizing France, modeling our army after theirs, and their railroads and buildings after our.

"The French and Americans seem to have a great feeling of comradeship for each other and if it weren't for the difference in our language—even as it is the French soldiers will do anything for an American, and give him anything in their power to give.

"On one occasion when we were stranded in a little French village with our ration car lost and with no hope to a little French guardhouse near the station and soon told the French soldiers our dilemma. They at once gave me a fine hot cup of coffee and thrust three loaves of bread on my lap and

a good cream cheese. I spent a very pleasant day with these French guards and I will never forget it as it was one of the first incidents on French soil.
