


GIRL SCOUTS OF PORTLAND LEARN OF NATURE AT BEAUTIFUL CAMP WILDWOOD ON MOLALLA

Groups Receive Valuable Instruction in Daily Programs Aimed at Development of Character, Ability to Do, Service to Others and Play; Tasks Add Interest to Life at Summer Home.



FOR inculcating the five-point creed of the Girl Scouts—character, ability to do, service to others, health and fun—no more beautiful spot than Camp Wildwood, on the banks of the Molalla river near Canby, could be chosen. These groups of girls have been receiving this valuable instruction in daily programs embracing the essentials taught by the organization, for the last five weeks, with two more weeks to go. It is a part of the constructive work of the Portland council of Girl Scouts, of which Mrs. Otis B. Wight is commissioner, and which is sponsored by other prominent women and assisted by volunteer teachers on special subjects.

Camp Wildwood is the big summer camp activity of the Girl Scouts and during the seven weeks of its operation it averages about 56 girls every two weeks, and they have the time of their young lives, with just enough work on their daily programs to make it interesting and worth while, for there is nothing like having something constructive to do interspersed with the fun features, which include everything from early-morning "sings" to big bonfires at night. Every girl is given sufficient "duty" to strike a nice balance between outright fun and education. Classes, which meet beneath the tall firs under romantic surroundings, embrace study of birds and trees and other
