William L. Finley, Nationally
Known Naturalist, Here Thursday

AT NORMAL AUDITORIUM

Lecturer on Wild Life Here on Pro-
gram of Student Council

William L. Finley of Oregon, nationally known naturalist, author, photographer and lecturer on wild animal life, will appear in this city tomorrow night at 8 in the Cortland Normal School auditorium under the auspices of the Normal Student Council.

Mr. Finley's talk will be illustrated by what are said to be the most remarkable films of their kind. The pictures were made last summer when he explored the southwest mountains for wild animal life.

For the past 20 years he and Mrs. Finley have cruised the coastline of the Pacific from Alaska to Mexico, and their travels have produced 200,000 feet of motion picture film and 20,000 still negatives, which are said to constitute the greatest photographic record of American wild animal life ever made.

As an author Mr. Finley has published articles in the Nature Magazine, the National Geographic, the Atlantic Monthly and other National publications. Through his efforts three large Federal game bird reservations were created in Oregon by special executive proclamations by the late President Roosevelt.
