**Conflict Between Federal Agencies
 to Be Ironed Out; Oregon**

Areas Eyed.

July 30, '34

William L. Finley, representative of the northwest area on the advisory board on migratory birds, will attend the annual convention of the board in Washington, D. C., July 10, leaving here Monday, he announced yesterday. Mr. Finley will make a fight for preservation of wild life in Oregon, especially in the southern Oregon section.

This board, appointed by Secretary of Agriculture Wallace and containing representatives from all sections of the country, makes recommendations for federal laws covering migratory birds and wild life.

There is a conflict between the reclamation service and the biological survey, Mr. Finley stated, with one attempting to destroy breeding places of wild fowl and the other attempting conservation. The advisory board members have investigated and found much of the destruction of feeding and breeding grounds to be unnecessary and will make a stand to correct the situation.

In Oregon there is the southern Oregon section of lower Klamath and Malheur lakes wherein, through natural causes, the lakes began to dry up and then were assisted through reclamation work. Mr. Finley pointed out that this region was poor agricultural land, yet with its attempted use as such has curtailed the breeding grounds for many thousands of migratory birds. He will make a fight at the annual board meeting to save this territory.

Oregon at one time had the greatest natural resources for migratory bird development in the Union, Mr. Finley pointed out, but now is losing its re-

sources through reclamation development. Both are necessary, he adds, but one should not completely hide the other.



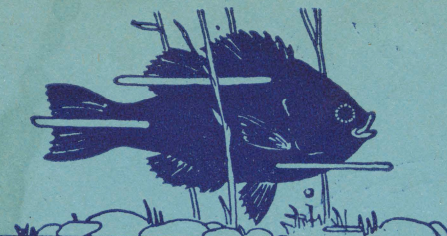
