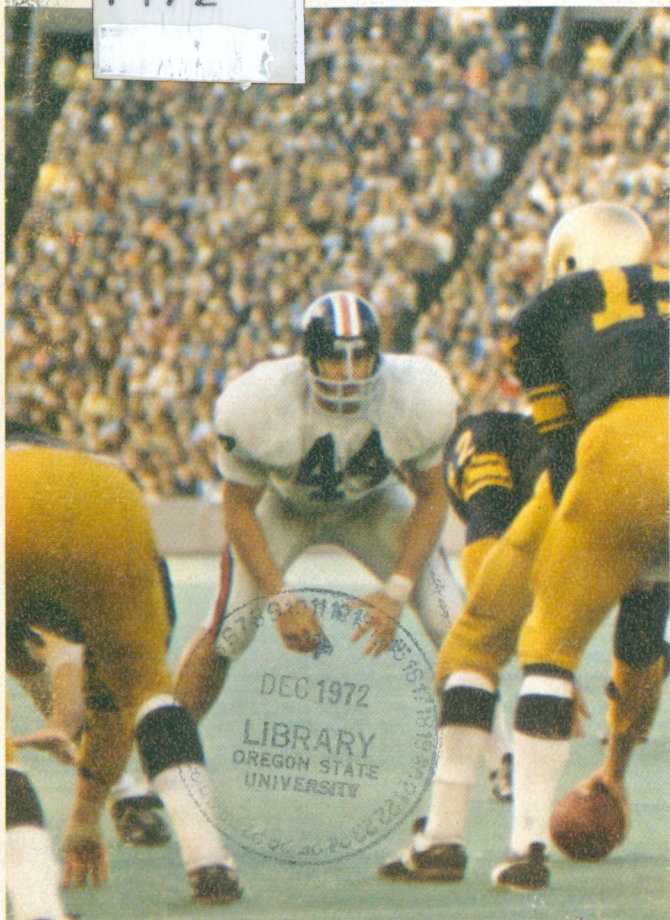

## All-American Steve Brown Linebacker

If there's a better linebacker in the country than Oregon State's Steve Brown, followers of the Beavers would be shocked, surprised and totally disbelieving.

In their opinion, and apparently in the opinion of many others, Steve Brown is that good. The 6-3, 235 pound senior made all of the all-Pacific Coast teams last fall and has already been named to several 1972 pre-season AA teams.

"Pro scouts ranked him as one of the best last year," Coach Dee Andros tells proudly, "and that evaluation would be my own as well. He has the height, size and speed. He proved as a junior he's not only an outstanding tackler, but for a linebacker to have seven interceptions is almost unbelievable."

For the record, Brown tied for first in interceptions in the Pacific-8 conference last fall. Against Rose Bowl champion Stanford, he plucked off three passes, and a fourth was nullified. Also, he intercepted a two-pointer in the end zone, and made 22 tackles against Stanford. For the season, Steve had seven official interceptions. He led OSU in tackles (134), 65 of them unassisted.

"I think you play football on emotions," Andros said. "When you're emotionally ready, you're mentally ready — it makes you quicker. Steve is one of the most emotional football players I've ever coached."

At Porterville, Cal. high school, Brown was a three-year all-league fullback, leading the conference in scoring and rushing as a junior and senior. He gained somewhere between 2700 and 3000 yards in his prep career. After a brief stint at fullback with the OSU Rooks, where he averaged 5.1 on seven carries, he moved to the defensive unit for good.

Other schools that Brown considered were Colorado, Oregon, Washington, California and UCLA. Two of his Porterville pals, Van Smith and Mark Gartung, advised him to enroll at OSU, where they had played football.

He prefers linebacking to playing fullback — "more challenge to stop the ball," he says. Brown has run 40 yards in a football suit in 4.85, and all will admit that's pretty fair for a man his size. He was married to Katherine Mary Reisig in Porterville on March 20, 1971 and is one of quite a number of Beaver football players who are married.

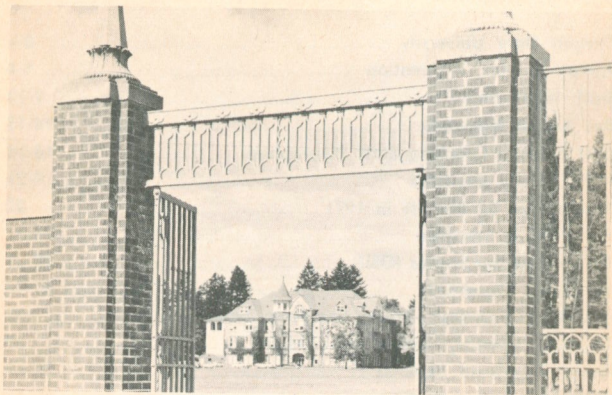

## **A Land-Grant Institution**

Oregon State University was established as Oregon's Land-Grant institution by legislative action on October 27, 1868, the first state-assisted institution of higher learning in Oregon. This date is observed as OSU's Charter Day.

The Morrill Land-Grant Act, signed by President Lincoln July 2, 1862, is still heralded after a century as the most significant action ever taken by this nation in the field of higher education. It brought into being an entirely new concept of higher education in America—a college education for all who have the will and the ability to learn.

The Land-Grant Act established, and the program has continued to foster for more than a hundred years now, colleges and universities that have involved themselves in determining solutions to everyday problems confronting society.

The term "Land-Grant College" originated because of the method developed to help pay costs. To finance the new colleges, the Act gave a grant of federal land to each state on the basis of 30,000 acres for each Congressman. Oregon's share was 90,000 acres.

Current income from a trust fund established through the sale of these lands is now very nominal. But the new educational philosophy that gave America an unsurpassed educational shot-in-the-arm was much more important than the "Land-Grant" income, even a hundred years ago. There are 69 Land-Grant colleges and universities in the United States.

Oregon State's enrollment total has tapered off after rapid growth in the 1960's, with approximately 15,800 now attending the University on a full-time basis. In 1913 there were 1,628 students. By 1938, 25 years later, there were 4,075. In 1950 6,793 students were enrolled and by 1960 the figure reached 7,720. The University passed the 10,000 mark in 1963 with an enrollment of 10,032. In 1970, 15,244 students attended OSU, topping the 15,000 mark for the first time.

## **A Sea-Grant Center**

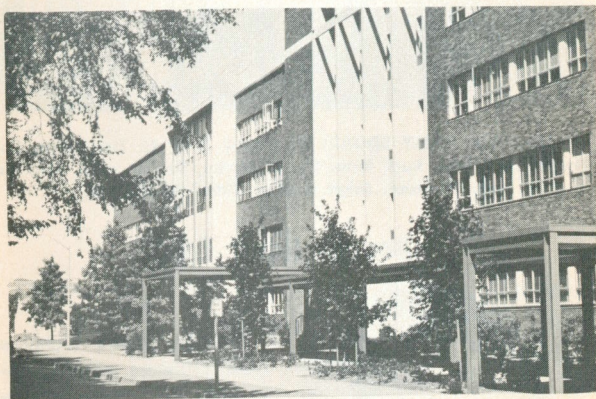
A hundred years after it was chartered as a Land-Grant institution, Oregon State University on February 20, 1968, was designated as one of the first three Sea-Grant Centers in the United State (OSU, Washington, and Rhode Island). Oregon State recently added the School of Oceanography as the eleventh school within the University.



## Some History About Corvallis

In 1846 the settlers of Benton County, Oregon, called their first townsite Marysville, but a few years later when they realized the vitalness of their central location in the Willamette Valley, they devised a new name, Corvallis — "The Heart of The Valley" — to express their good fortune.

Benton County was officially established by an act of the Territorial Legislature on December 23, 1847, out of an area once inhabited by the Klickitat Indians. Benton County and the city of Corvallis, the county seat, have grown steadily. Present population for the city of 36,000 ranks Corvallis 4th in the state in population. Today, many consider Corvallis the Valley's cultural, educational and research center and one of the most comfortable residential cities in the Northwest.

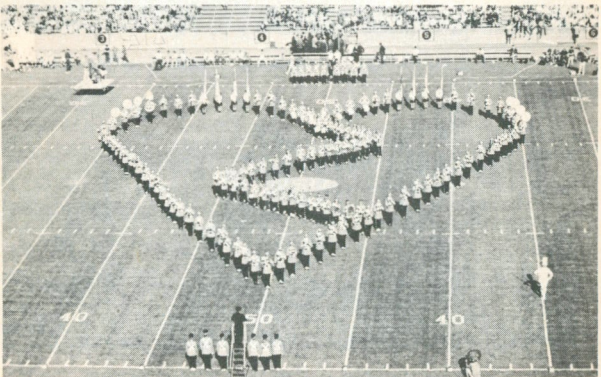

## Beaver Band Tops



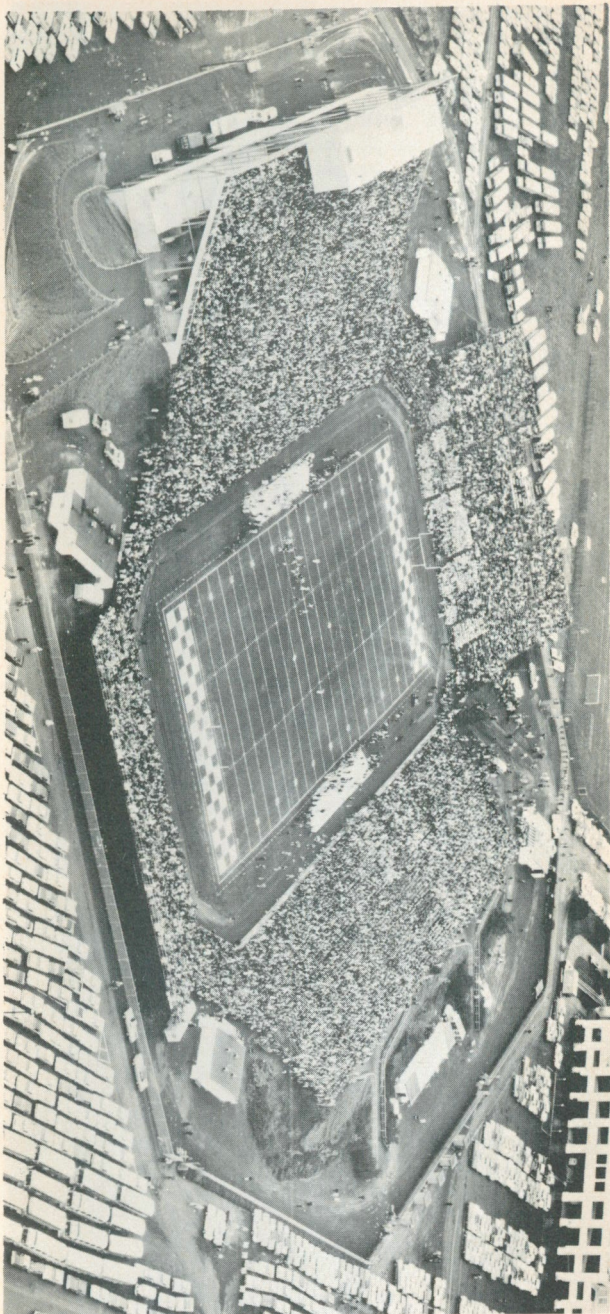

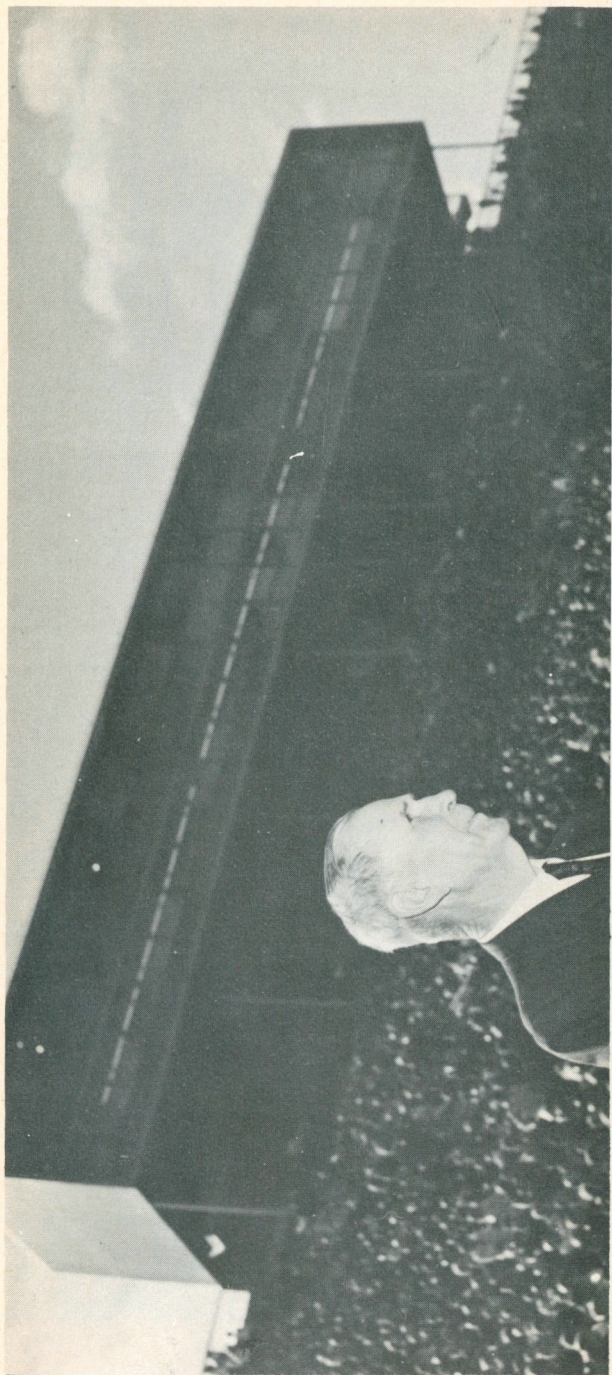

# PARKER STADIUM

## "Home of The Beavers"

Parker Stadium, right in the heart of the beautiful Oregon State University campus, ranks as one of the finest and most up-to-date football plants in America.

Five years ago, they added 9000 west sideline seats, bringing the total capacity to 40,750 seats. An overflow crowd of 41,494, largest then ever to witness an athletic event in the state of Oregon, was on hand to watch Oregon State hand National Champion Southern California its only defeat (3-0).

About 27,500 seats at Parker Stadium are of the sideline variety. There are 82 rows on the west sidelines and 40 rows on the east sidelines, and the entire east sideline of 9000 seats has been turned over to OSU students. "If student interest remains high, and students fill the entire sideline for our home games, there is no reason why this cannot become a permanent arrangement," Athletic Director Jim Barratt said.

Parker Stadium is named for Charles T. Parker, a Portland businessman and OSU graduate who played a major and financial role in its opening in 1953. The stadium was built at no cost to taxpayers, through donations from OSU alums and friends. Original seating was 28,000, which at that time appeared adequate.

Some years ago, additional seats in the end zone and corners raised the total capacity to 33,000. Then, in time for the 1967 season, the new west sideline addition raised it to 40,750, and contributions again helped make this possible. Mr. Parker made a sizeable contribution, just as he had in 1953, and his gift was matched. Jack Brandis, Portland and Corvallis forestry executive, headed up a small committee that secured the matching funds. OSU athletic department funds were also used.

In August, 1969, Astro-Turf was installed at Parker Stadium, also new lights for night football and other events. Asphalt base and general work cost \$69,361, lighting cost \$52,168, and the Astro-Turf \$202,505. Miscellaneous and contingency made the estimated total figure \$350,000.

Chief architect for the new addition was Dan Zarosinski, Portland engineer. Zarosinski received his B.A. and M.A. degree in Engineering at OSU and played three years of varsity football for the Beavers (1949-51).

Parker Stadium is picturesque, as well as practical. There's a lot of parking space, within close walking distance of the stadium. Every seat is a good seat, with no posts. From some of the higher rows, one has a beautiful view of the McDonald National Forest, Mary's Peak and the Coast Range of mountains. Dressing rooms for players are located in close-by Gill Coliseum, less than 100 yards from the playing field.

### PRESS BOX PRAISED

The press box, high atop the west sideline stands, is one of the most workable to be found anywhere. It's big, the view is terrific and it's practical.

First floor is strictly for members of the working press. There are 56 seats in the front row, and 52 seats in the elevated back row, with lots of walking room in between. Nobody is crowded.

Another big working area is located back of the two press rows, where Western Union machines and operators are situated. Also, there is a lunch bar, with tables, chairs, etc., plus cheerful employees anxious to serve the media. The Memorial Union Building catering service provides tasty dishes, such as fried chicken, roast beef, etc.

The second floor is reserved for radio and TV media, plus home and visiting coaches (phones to field). Two huge TV and photography booths are 22 feet 6 inches across each, and 27 feet deep. Ten smaller booths, each 11 feet 3 inches across and 27 feet deep, are used by radio, coaches, statisticians, etc. Under good weather conditions, the press box roof also could be used for TV or photography purposes.

One of the best additions is the press box elevator, which was made possible by a donor who prefers to remain anonymous. The elevator runs from the lower level to all floor levels.

# ATHLETIC STAFF

## JIM BARRATT — Athletic Director

Athletic Director at Oregon State is personable Jim Barratt, who, over a long period of time, worked his way up through the ranks of athletic hierarchy at OSU.

Barratt, 47 years of age, was appointed to the post in 1966, following the death of Slat's Gill.

Barratt is Oregon State personified, and his roots are deep. As an undergraduate at OSU, he was editor of the school daily paper, The Barometer, and extremely active in campus affairs. Following graduation in 1950, he became assistant alumni director, and a year later moved over to the athletic department as ticket manager.

Next came the role of athletic business manager, and when Gill became athletic director in 1964, Barratt moved up to the post of assistant athletic director. Then, immediately after Gill's death, Jim became acting director, prior to the final permanent appointment.

A native of Heppner, where he was raised and graduated from high school, Barratt later enlisted in the Navy for World War II and saw a lot of overseas duty. In 1946, when he entered OSU, he married his childhood sweetheart, the former Dorothea Wilson. They have two daughters and one granddaughter.

Barratt handled all ticket sales for many years and his never-ending enthusiasm and attention to details helped establish him as one of the top men in the field. As chief aide to a pair of fine athletic directors, Spec Keene and Gill, Jim helped with virtually every affair of the department and learned his apprenticeship well.

The athletic boss for the Beavers has been well-trained for his job and has the personality and business-sense to go with it. Oregon State is in an era of sound athletic accomplishment under his guidance. He is extremely active in the PAC-8 Conference and in the NCAA, being a member of the NCAA TV committee. He also serves as university Division representative for district 8 of the NCAA.

**COMM HENNESSY**, athletic business manager, has been with the athletic department since February 1, 1961, after serving nine years with the physical plant at Oregon State. He was born in Fontana, Kansas, but came west to Oregon in 1946. When he joined the athletic staff, he took on the duties of ticket manager and handled that role until he was moved up to athletic business manager and top accountant for the department. Hennessy is well-versed in all financial matters and proved as ticket manager that he has the personality and charm to get along well with people. Among other duties, he is athletic office manager and in charge of grounds and maintenance.

**DENNY HEDGES**, assistant athletic director, is an invaluable aide to Barratt. Hedges, an OSU graduate, has a solid athletic background, having been a student aide to Barratt while in school. Later, he was manager of Multnomah Civic Stadium and assistant manager of Multnomah Athletic Club. Prior to that, he was assistant admissions control supervisor at Memorial Coliseum in Portland. His responsibilities there included handling of tickets, pay roll, scheduling employees and other management. At OSU, he is in charge of promotions, game management and travel arrangements.

**PAUL VALENTI**, assistant to the director, is now on the administrative end of the athletic department and is the head tennis coach. Paul came to OSU in the fall of 1938 as a student, and except for World War II service in the Navy, has been a Beaver ever since. He played basketball under the late Slat's Gill from 1940-42, and then returned as his assistant in 1946, following discharge. When Gill retired from coaching in 1965, Valenti took over as head coach at OSU and promptly led the Beavers to a Pacific-8



championship. Valenti voluntarily resigned at the close of the 1970 campaign, and coached the tennis team to a fine 36-8 record over the last two years.

**BILL ROBERTSON**, head trainer, has been chief of the OSU tape brigade for 26 years, and long has been one of the most popular citizens in the Corvallis community. Famous for his always well-received vocal rendition of "Casey At The Bat" and dozens of other recitations, Bill is much in demand at banquets and social gatherings. The athletes call him "Rope-sole", and his reputation as an athletic trainer ranks right near the top of that field. Robertson originally is from Vancouver, B.C., but became an American citizen many years ago and has lived in the Pacific Northwest ever since. He served in the army in World War II, and saw duty in both Italy and the Aleutians. Bill is a graduate of OSU. He was voted into the Helms Hall of Fame for athletic trainers.

**LOREN SOLUM**, assistant trainer, is a 1965 graduate of the University of Idaho. He also obtained his master's degree at OSU in 1969. Originally from Wallace, Idaho, Solum played football at Idaho and later was assistant trainer for the Vandals. He coached three sports at Kellogg high following graduation, in addition to teaching biology and physical education.

**JOHN EGGERS**, sports publicity director, recently observed his 22nd anniversary on the athletic staff at OSU. He joined the staff on July 1, 1950, as an assistant to director Irwin Harris, and was moved up to the top spot on July 1, 1952. Eggers was born and raised in Pendleton, the "Round-Up City" of eastern Oregon. He was an all-state basketball player at Pendleton high, a prep teammate of Lew Beck who later went on to win all-America fame at OSU and play in the Olympic Games. Eggers played one varsity basketball season at Willamette while only a freshman before enlisting in the Navy for World War II. After discharge, he attended OSU from the fall of 1946 through 1949. Before returning to the OSU staff, he worked for one year as a sports writer on The Oregonian in Portland.

**ROD COMMONS**, assistant sports publicity director, is a 1966 graduate of OSU and was editor of the Newberg (Ore.) Graphic. He also specializes in photography. Originally from Nashville, Ore., Commons graduated from Siletz high school. He joined the OSU staff on May 1, 1968, and assists Eggers in all phases of the Athletic News Bureau operation, in addition to taking all department pictures. Commons is in charge of a photography dark room located right next to the office of he and Eggers in Gill Coliseum.

# "THE GREAT PUMPKIN"

## Dee Andros

Newspaper men affectionately named Dee Andros "The Great Pumpkin" as this colorful coach has led his Beavers from one unexpected victory through another. When Dee arrived in San Francisco as a coaching aide for the West team against the East, the S. F. Examiner promptly ran a banner headline titled "Great Pumpkin Here." His colorful coaching apparel includes bright orange jacket, orange and black tie, orange and black shoes, and orange socks.

In 1967, Andros was elected "West Coast Coach of The Year" and also was runner-up for the National Coach of The Year honors to John Pont of Indiana. He was head coach for the West team against the East in the annual Coaches All-America Bowl game at Memphis. He has been on the East-West game staff and on the Hula Bowl staff. Dee will be head coach for the West in the next Shrine game.

Some of Dee's more well-known teammates at Oklahoma included Jim Owens from Washington, Darrell Royal from Texas, Bert Clark (ex-WSU) and Jack Mitchell (ex-Kansas). Dee played football under the late Jim Tatum and Bud Wilkinson at Oklahoma.

He's had lots of experience with Bowl games. While a player at Oklahoma, he went to the Gator Bowl once (they whipped North Carolina State), and to the Sugar Bowl twice (they beat North Carolina and Louisiana State). As an assistant coach at Texas Tech he made it to the Sun Bowl. While with Pete Elliott at California, he got to the Rose Bowl one year.

Andros traditionally charges out on the playing field ahead of his team prior to game time. He admits it's getting to be a bit tougher every year, though. Also, it's tough for the players to not pass him.

---

As a Marine Corps sergeant on Iwo Jima in World War II, Dee Andros was awarded the Bronze Star for valor in battle. Here's the inscription on his plaque:

"For heroic achievement in connection with operation against the enemy while serving with the Marine Infantry Battalion on Iwo Jima volcanic island from 13 March 1945 to 25 March 1945. Field Cook Andros volunteered for two combat patrols against enemy resistance pocket. As a member of these patrols, he acquitted himself with distinction in the face of accurate machine gun and rifle fire. His devotion to duty was in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

Andros is in great demand as a public speaker and key figure at civic affairs. He was "King of Fun" at Portland Rose Festival in 1969, also Grand Marshall of the Miss Oregon Pageant. Also has been Grand Marshall for Lebanon Strawberry Festival and Philomath Frolic. He loves crowds and he loves people.

Other "Orange" items in his repertoire: a basement bathroom at his home completely decorated in orange, orange electric golf cart, orange office desk, orange golf bag, orange scarf, and orange shorts (allegedly).

## The Coaches . . .

### DEE ANDROS, Head Coach



Born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on October 17, 1924. Attended Central High there, graduating in 1942. Went directly into the Marine Corps for service in World War II. Won Bronze Star for valor at battle of Iwo Jima. Was discharged in February of 1946 and enrolled at University of Oklahoma in Norman. Freshman year played varsity football under late Jim Tatum and went to the Gator Bowl, beating North Carolina State. Next three years played under Bud Wilkinson, and twice went to the Sugar Bowl. The Sooners beat North Carolina in 1949 and Louisiana

State in 1950. Among his teammates were Darrell Royal (Texas); Jim Owens (Washington); Jack Mitchell and Bert Clark. Graduated from Oklahoma in 1950 and was assistant on Oklahoma staff in 1950-51-52. Line coach at Kansas in 1953. Went to Texas Tech in 1954 and 1955, and team went to Sun Bowl. Moved to Nebraska as assistant to Pete Elliott in 1956. Also was at California with Elliott in 1957-58-59, team going to Rose Bowl on January 1, 1959. When Elliott became head coach at Illinois in 1960, Andros joined him there and was at Champaign in 1960 and 1961. Andros became head coach at Idaho in 1962 and served three years before taking the head job at Oregon State. In 1963, the Vandals posted a 5-4 season for their first winning campaign since 1938 when they were 6-3. They also beat Washington State in 1964 for first time in 10 years and only the third time over a 32-year span. Idaho, in 1964, almost upended Rose Bowl-bound Oregon State, losing out to the Beavers, 10-7. Vandals narrowly lost to Oregon (14-8) and to Iowa (35-25). Andros is married, and he and his wife Luella have one daughter, Jeanna, aged 15.

He is now in his 8th season at OSU and has compiled an impressive 43-28-1 overall record. Under his leadership, the Beavers have been runnerup in the tough Pacific-8 conference four times, as recently as last year. His "Giant Killers" of 1967 electrified the grid world by beating No. 1 ranked USC. Andros has never lost to powerful Arizona State or traditional-rival Oregon.

### SAM BOGHOSIAN, Assistant

#### Offense Coordinator



Born in Fresno, California, on December 22, 1931. Attended Fresno High School, and was all-Northern California guard. Also all-Valley in baseball. Played at UCLA in 1951-52-53-54, and was starter on national champions of 1954. All-Coast, Scholastic All-American 1954. Played in 1954 Rose Bowl game and also in the Shrine East-West game. **RED SMITH, Assistant**



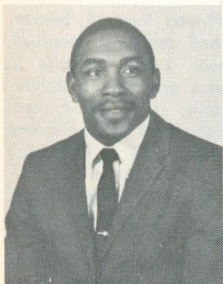

## General Outlook

Dee Andros has never, in his seven previous seasons at Oregon State, coached what one could refer to as a "bad" football team.

Chances are good again for another strong club, despite the loss of a good many veteran performers. Just how strong it will be, of course, remains to be seen.

The Beavers are missing a host of offensive starters from a year ago, in fact most of them. Defensively, however, there's a bit more experience available and the Beavers should be strong both up front and in the secondary.

There should n't be many problems at linebacking, where OSU has one of the best in the business and some good other ones, too. If Steve Brown stays healthy, he's headed for all-America honors and a bright pro future. Brown has it all — size (6-3 and 230), speed and determination. "Playboy" magazine picked him on its pre-season all-America team.

There are some big "ifs" at the quarterback position. Speedy Ray Taroli, who led the nation in kickoff return yardage last fall as a sophomore, looked great at quarterback in spring drills. He won the position from two sophomores — Scott Spiegelberg and Tom Hickey. But in the final spring "game," he suffered a serious knee injury and had to undergo surgery. It's doubtful if he can play this fall, leaving the chores to the pair of hustling young sophs.

Fans will see more speed in the OSU backfield this year than they have for some time. Fleet Wilson Morris, a 9.5 sprinter and state of Washington prep sprint champion, will be at wingback, backed up by veteran Jerry McBurney. And there's Mike Maestri at halfback, with good speed, plus Ralph Show and some others.

Fullbacks Mike Davenport and Jim Leston are not as big as recent Andros fullbacks have been, but they are faster, likely to make longer gains.

The defensive secondary situation appears bright, and followers will be quick to note that Andros has changed his defensive alignment from 6-2-2-1 to 4-3-4. Returning vets like Jim Lilly, Bruce Fry and Bill Bartley should fit into the program perfectly.

The Beavers have the experience in the defensive line, too, where still available are Scott Woods, Mike Shannon, Billy Joe Winchester, Fred Hauck, Duane Defrees and Jim Mott. Fine linebackers are Brown, Butch Wicks, Chris Lunde and Gordie Webster.

Key offensive line performers include Greg Mobley, Dan Ellis, Kurt Jurgenson, Rob Jurgenson, Don Pinkham, Doug Doyle, Terry Nimz, John Todd, Rod Petersen, George Lefever and others.

Andros has experienced only one losing season in his seven years at the Beaver helm, and he's determined it won't happen again. So are his players.

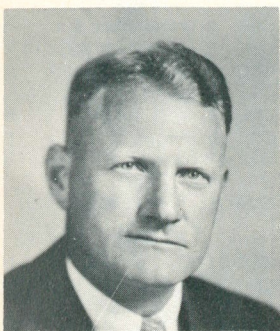
