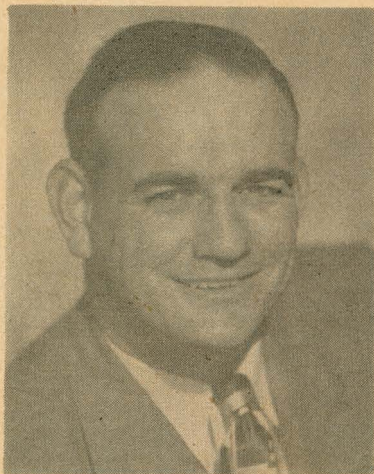

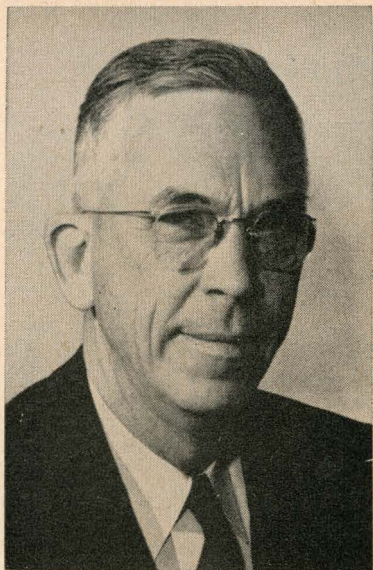

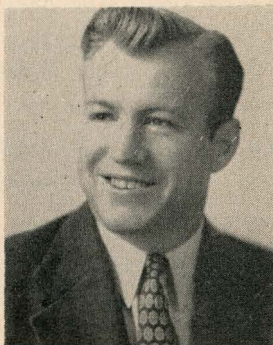

# Athletic Staff

**ROY S. "SPEC" KEENE**, athletic director, is the man who has brought Oregon State college into the national spotlight in all sports. Since he took over as athletic director in 1947, the Beavers have faced many of the nation's top teams, and under Keene's able guidance, Oregon State now has one of the finest all-around athletic plants in the country.

Through Keene's foresight and planning, OSC now has a new football stadium with a 27,000 seating capacity—the newest in the Pacific Coast conference. Since he took over as athletic boss here, a beautiful basketball Coliseum was constructed—one which seats over 10,000 and has been the site of the Western Regional NCAA tournament for the past four years.

Popular "Spec" was student body president in his undergraduate days at OCS, and became head coach at Corvallis high after graduation. His next step up was to that of assistant coach for the Beavers, where he remained until 1926. At that time, Keene became head football coach at Willamette university in Salem. His Willamette athletic teams completely dominated the Northwest conference for 15 years and many of his players were named to Little-All-America teams. Willamette became the strongest small-college team in the Pacific Northwest, one of the best on the coast.

Keene replaced Percy Locey as athletic director at OSC in 1947, after serving as a lieutenant-commander in the navy in World War II. Because "Spec" Keene had faith that it could be done, Oregon State college now has a great all-around athletic plant.



**JIM BARRATT**, athletic business manager, has the patience and skill necessary to handle his job in top-flight manner. He always manages a smile despite sometimes trying circumstances and is one of the most popular young citizens of the Corvallis Community. Originally from Heppner, he finished at OSC in 1950 and became assistant alumni manager. He left that position at the close of the 1951 football season for his present job. He is a Navy veteran and is varsity golf coach for the Beavers.



**BILL ROBERTSON**, athletic trainer, is well known as "the friend of the athlete." At OSC, on his present job since 1946, Robertson has become almost a tradition in Beaver athletics. After four years of military service in Italy and the Aleutians in World War II, "Robby" returned to OSC to complete his schooling. Because he is always willing to aid any athlete, he's well liked by all. Great at poetry, and recitations, often he is called upon to deliver bits of oratory.



**JOHN EGGERS**, athletic publicity director assumed his post on July 1, 1952, after serving two years as assistant to his predecessor, Irwin Haris. Eggers was an all-state basketball player at Pendleton high school and a prep teammate of Lew Beck, who later became an OSC all-American. He played one varsity season at Willamette before entering the Navy in World War II and after discharge attended OSC from 1946-1949. Eggers worked for a year on the sports staff of The Oregonian in Portland before returning to his alma mater.

. . . Assumed job early in 1924, the first full-time athletics publicity director in the United States. The calm and cool type and a Stanford man all the way.

### **VIC KELLEY, UCLA**

. . . Took over on August 16, 1945, succeeding Ben Person. Polished as he is efficient. Smooth is the word.

### **ART LITCHMAN, OREGON**

. . . Began job on July 1, 1946. First full-time man for Webfoots since Bruce Hamby was there in 1941. A southpaw, but mistakes are far and few between. A perfectionist.

### **KEN HUNTER, IDAHO**

. . . Assumed post on June 25, 1947, succeeding Don Carlson, who was a student at Idaho. Older than most of the others, but getting younger all the time.

### **BOB RUBIN, CALIFORNIA**

. . . Took office on April 9, 1951, succeeding Norrie West. Well-versed, well-heeled and a walking encyclopedia. High pitch of sincerity.

### **DON FARIS, WASHINGTON STATE**

. . . Began duties in April, 1951, succeeding Dave Stidolph. One-time high school football coach with strong knowledge of the game. Quite dapper.

### **H. D. THOREAU, SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA**

. . . Assumed job on July 1, 1952, succeeding Tom Lawless. One of nation's foremost sports authorities, especially in track. Witty, wily and willing.

### **JOHN EGGERS, OREGON STATE**

. . . Took over on July 1, 1952, succeeding Irwin Harris. Was assistant to Harris two years previous and worked for a year on The Oregonian sports staff in Portland.

### **JOHN THOMPSON, WASHINGTON**

. . . Began duties on June 1, 1955, succeeding Bert Rose. Newest member of circuit, with big shoes to fill. Personable, capable and a welcome addition to the league.

# *The Coaches*

## Tommy Prothro

### Head Football Coach

Oregon State's new head football coach, 34-year old J. Thompson "Tommy" Prothro, Jr., is one of those individuals you often read about but seldom find. He carries all the qualifications to be a fine football coach; yet, at the same time, packs that all-important human touch that quickly endears himself to everyone.

Those close to the scene firmly believe that the personable Tommy eventually will bring Oregon State out of the football depths into a new era stocked full of new hope. He doesn't plan to set the world on fire overnight, or sweep a one-way path to the Rose Bowl. Instead, Prothro hopes for steady improvement that one day will place Oregon State again on a football pinnacle of success.

A four-sport man, Tommy competed in football, basketball and track for Memphis, Tenn. Central high school in the years 1934-1935-1936. He was in all those sports at Riverside Military Academy in 1936-1937-1938. At Duke university, Prothro was a blocking quarterback, winning two top awards during his career.

He won the Jacobs award as the best blocker in the South, and the Mills award as the best blocker in the East. He played against Oregon State in the "transplanted" Rose Bowl game of January 1, 1942, at Durham, North Carolina. The Beavers, heavy underdogs to lose, surprised Prothro's club and won, 20-16, in a thrilling game.

Tommy also participated in baseball and lacrosse at Duke from 1938-1942. In 1942, he joined the navy and in 1945 was discharged as a Lieutenant. Tom coached the Vanderbilt university "B" squad in 1946 and in 1947 became backfield coach under Red Sanders at Vanderbilt. Shortly before entering the service, he was line coach at Western Kentucky.

He went to UCLA with Sanders in 1949 as backfield coach and remained there until his appointment at OSC. He generally is credited with developing such top ball-toters as Paul Cameron, Primo Villanueva, Bob Davenport, etc. He was married to the former Shirley Seagle of Memphis, Tenn., last summer.

Tommy is the son of the well-known baseball figure, Thompson "Doc" Prothro, One-time manager of the Philadelphia Phillies and other clubs. He is the nephew of General Clifton B. Cates, former commandant of the U. S. Marine Corps.

## TERRY DEBAY

### Assistant Coach

The name of Terry Debay, Tommy Prothro's youngest coaching aide, is one well remembered by Oregon State football followers—especially those who watched the Beavers absorb a 61-0 trouncing from national-champion UCLA last season at Parker stadium.

It was Debay who as signal-caller and blocking quarterback led the 1954 Bruins to the mythical national collegiate championship. The 22-year-old native of Canoga Park, Calif., is generally regarded as one of the finest blocking backs in Pacific Coast conference grid history.

Debay earned four varsity awards at UCLA, after twice being named on the all-city team as a prep ace. He played for the Bruins in 1951, 1952, 1953 and 1954, and for the last three seasons was regular quarterback under Red Sanders. His last season at UCLA probably was his best, however, and he won the Los Angeles county American Legion football trophy which goes annually to the most valuable player on the UCLA team.

Terry appeared on state of Oregon gridirons several times during his college career. He played in the 1951 Multnomah stadium against OSC, when the Beavers lost, 7-0. In 1953, he led the Uclans to a victory over Oregon at Hayward field, and then last year guided UCLA to the convincing victory over OSC at Corvallis.

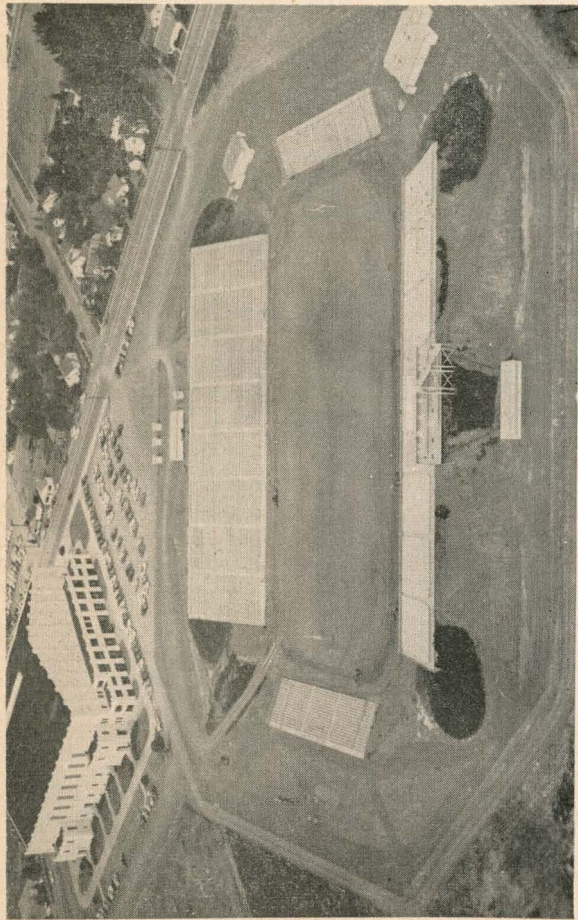

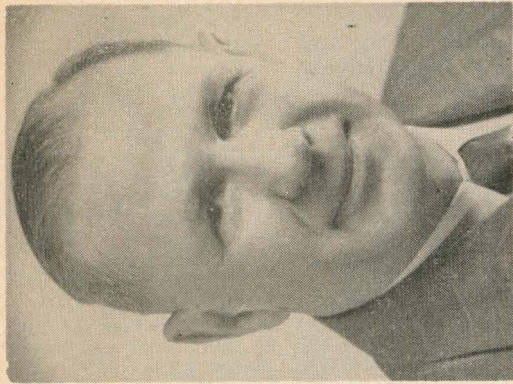
