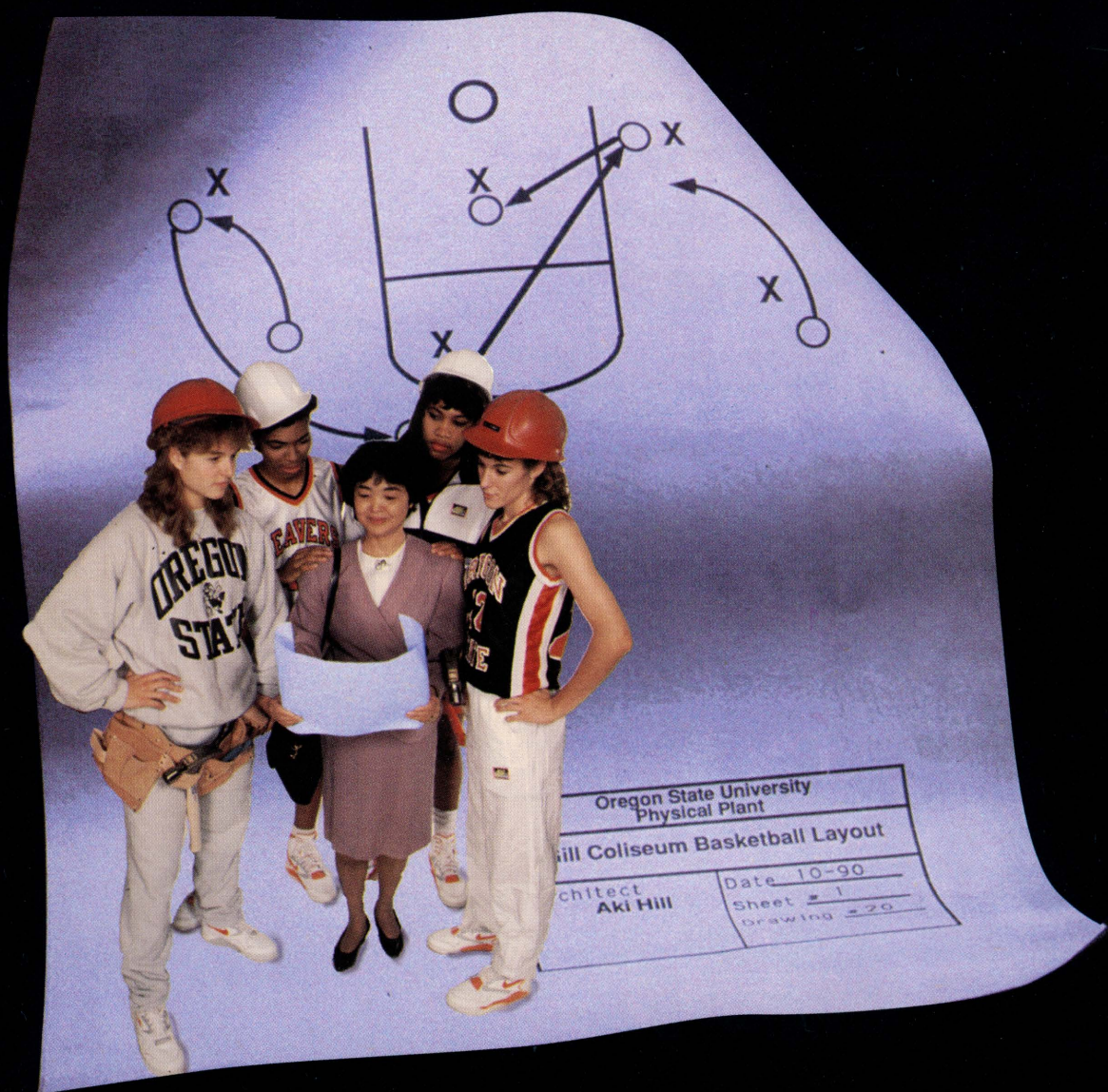

# OREGON STATE OUTLOOK

The Oregon State women's basketball team will take on a different look this season. A total of 14 names grace the 1990-91 roster, nine of which are new faces to the program. One familiar face, however, is OSU head coach **Aki Hill**, now in her 13th season with the Beavers.

With so many new players, the Beavers are looking to the new season with enthusiasm and optimism in hopes of battling back from a dismal 5-26 season in 1989-90.

"This is a very young team," commented Hill. "It was a good recruiting year for us and this will be the first step in rebuilding our program. Only time will tell how quickly the new players can adapt to Pac-10 play and how they come together as a team."

Despite the youth of Hill's squad, they are not all lacking in experience as four of the nine newcomers have spent time in the junior college ranks. Among them is JC All-American **Judy Shannon**, a 6-2" forward/center from Albuquerque, New Mexico. As a two-year starter at St. Gregory's Junior College in Shawnee, Oklahoma, Shannon led her team to a 67-3 record. Shannon joins additional JC transfers **Vicky Jones**, and **Tracy Rome**, both out of Western Texas College, and **Robin Reed** of Northern Oklahoma JC. Jones, a 5-6" guard, was named Defensive Player of the Year for the

West Conference as a sophomore. Teammate **Tracy Rome**, a 6-1" forward, lettered one season at Western Texas before coming to OSU. **Reed**, a 5-10" guard/forward, was a two-time all-conference selection at Northern Oklahoma where she led the nation with a 92 percent free throw average as a sophomore.

The Beavers also welcome five true freshmen to the '90-91 roster, including the 1990 Gatorade Oregon Player of the Year **Anne McShane**. **McShane**, a 5-11" guard/forward from Oregon City, was a first-team all-state selection as a senior and a two-time all-conference recipient. Rookies **Rita Howard**, **Amy Ellis**, **Natalia Mattick** and redshirt freshman **Angela Allen** round out the list of newcomers for the Beavers. **Howard**, a 6-2" forward/center from Fort Smith, Arkansas, earned all-state honors after leading her squad to an 84-11 record over a period of three years. Another all-state selection, **Amy Ellis**, is a 5-10" guard/forward out of Texhoma, Oklahoma. **Mattick**, a 6-4" center from Frankfurt, West Germany, will give OSU some additional height to boost their inside game. **Allen**, a 6-0" forward from Wynnewood, Oklahoma, was also an all-state performer in her playing days at Wynnewood High.

"Our newcomers (**Judy Shannon** and **Natalia Mattick**) will give us the height we've been looking for," said Hill. "We should see a little more athleticism this year with additions to the team like **Judy Shannon** and **Anne McShane**."

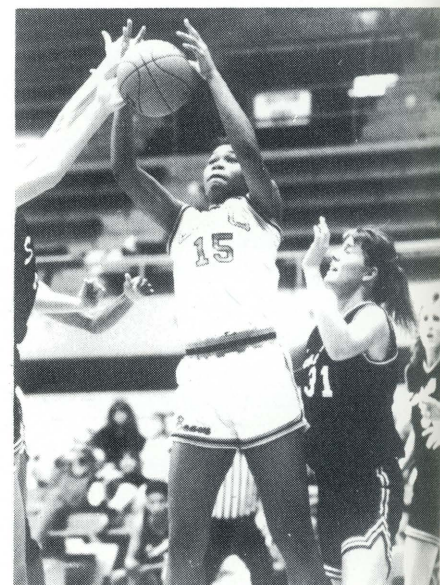
Amidst the dominating number of newcomers there will be five names familiar to Beaver fans. Seniors **Izzy Maryntschak** and 5-9" guard **Kathy Smith** of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

return to the OSU line-up. **Maryntschak**, the lone three year veteran for the Beavers, is a 5-8" guard out of Kitimat, B.C. She was chosen as a member of the Canadian National Team just this last summer and was ranked among the top five in the Pac-10 for both steals and assists.

A trio of sophomores return as well for OSU — 6-11" forward **Sonjhia Fleming**, 5-8" guard **Marlo Cormier** and 5-7" guard **Margo Evashevski**. Both **Fleming** and **Evashevski** emerged as starters for the Beavers in their rookie seasons. **Fleming** led Oregon State at the boards last season with over six rebounds a game and was second in scoring with a 10.2 average. **Evashevski** was OSU's top free throw shooter with a 77.1 percent effort for the season.

"We have a group of highly competitive players coming back," noted Hill. "These kids are all hungry to win and have the desire it takes to do just that. Good things take time but we feel we're on the right track."

Perhaps the winning track in the 1990s.

# OREGON STATE OUTLOOK



## THE "AKI" PHILOSOPHY:

- "Our style of basketball is winner's basketball and that has certainly brought us a number of championships here at OSU. We play a sophisticated, aggressive press defense and transition game. We also emphasize taking the highest percentage shot and working our passing game in a controlled situation.

This style of basketball demands the most out of you, such as intelligence, tough character and quickness, as well as the best body control and highest skill level. We want to pursue the most exciting, sophisticated style of basketball."

- "I don't know of any other woman coach in the United States who has a background of such sophisticated basketball as both a coach and a

player for a total of more than 25 years. I have the knowledge of overall concepts, but also of the small details which can change your play.

I am also very fortunate to have had some of the greatest teachers in basketball. I learned from our men's coach Ralph Miller, John Wooden of UCLA, Mr. Hata of Japan, Hall of Famer Pete Newell and, of course, Stu Inman of the Portland Trailblazers. My association with each of these people has been long and close."

- "We are all together; as a coach I want to motivate and educate my players. They are at a time when they will have just one chance to make the most of an opportunity—to play college basketball. It is a special time, a time to place demands upon yourself, not rely on a coach. I get my greatest satisfaction when my team can go out on the court and achieve things without my guidance. This makes me most happy."

- "Our recruiting philosophy may be low-key, but I am not comfortable with the high-pressure recruiting which so many schools seem to be using. We like to be open and honest and try to provide as much information as possible so that prospective students can make the right decision. This is the start of an open communication and, in the long run, people will understand our philosophy and sincerity and it will help our recruiting."

- "The nicest thing about OSU is the excellent academic program the school offers, yet OSU manages to keep to a good size so students can get very special, individualized care. We have excellent academic programs in many fields. There is a warm atmosphere at OSU and caring people is one of the main reasons I took the job here. The people in the community recognize athletes and are very supportive."

# HEAD COACH AKI HILL



Oregon State head coach Aki Hill heads into her 13th year at the helm of the Beavers. The Japanese native has posted a 196-144 overall record, including eight winning seasons and six post-season appearances.

Hill guided the Beavers to back-to-back berths in the NCAA Tournament, in 1983 and 1984. She has led Oregon State to 20 or more wins in five of the last 12 seasons. She has coached an All-America center, guard and forward during her tenure at OSU.

The 50-year-old Hill is regarded as one of the best women's basketball coaches in the country and has a style unique among collegiate women's teams. Her halfcourt press defense is an Oregon State tradition as is the Beavers' 40 minutes of full-court pressure.

Hatsue Aki Hill is a native of Japan, born July 7, 1940 in Tsugawa, Niigata. She trained under some of basketball's most noteworthy authorities, including the legendary UCLA coach John Wooden. Other mentors of Hill include Tatsuo Hata, a leading Japanese authority on basketball; Hall of Famer Pete Newell; and Stu Inman, former general manager for the Portland Trail Blazers.

Hill has spent the past 29 years playing, studying and coaching basketball. Her U.S. coaching career began in 1976 when she was an assistant at Foothill Community College and Santa Clara University in California.

In 1970, Hill became the first and only woman coach in Japan's 75-team AAU organization. She coached the Tokyo Marine Insurance teams, guiding one to a second place national finish during her final season.

In 1972, Hill took a leave of absence from coaching to study in a special program under Wooden at UCLA. She is one of the few women, or Japanese, coaches to have such an extensive background of training in the United States.

As a player, Hill competed for three years in high school basketball, then seven years on an AAU first division team in Japan. She was a starting guard for the Tokyo Marine Company, the same team she later coached. Her team won the national championship in 1965.

Hill has been nominated for national Coach of the Year honors four times in her 12 years at Oregon State. She has to her credit a pair of National Women's Basketball League crowns and has a NorPac championship.

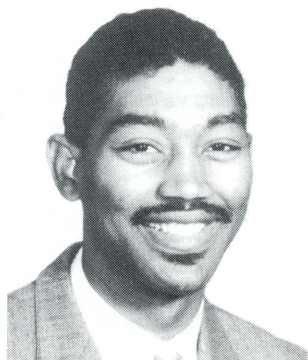

# ASSISTANT COACHES



## **DANNY EVANS (Oregon State '88)**

Former Oregon State basketball standout Danny Evans begins his first season as an assistant coach for the OSU women's team. Evans has spent the last five years playing professional basketball overseas.

In his five years abroad, Evans has played for four different pro teams. Most recently, he played

for KFUM Uppsala, a pro team in Sweden from 1989-90. In 1988, he was a member of Basket Everux in France and from 1985 to '86 he played in Belgium for R.U.S. Mariemborg. He began his pro career in 1986 when he played one year for Vaxjo Basket in Sweden.

Evans was a member of the Oregon State basketball team from 1980-83. He averaged 8.2 points and 2.0 rebounds per game in his career including a career best 11.3 point average as a sophomore. In his four seasons at OSU, the Beavers made three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Oregon State advanced to the final eight in 1982 before losing to Georgetown.

Besides his playing experience, Evans has also spent some time in the coaching ranks. He coached the Vaxjo Basket women's team in Sweden and Bryant Junior High School's boys' team in 1987.

Evans, 29, obtained a degree in graphic design at Oregon State in 1988. He and his wife, Sheila, have two sons, five-year-old Desmond and year-old Danny Jr.

## **MICHAEL ABRAHAM (Portland State '84)**

Joining the Oregon State basketball coaching staff for his first season is Michael Abraham. Abraham comes to Corvallis from Long Beach State where he spent the last six years as an assistant coach of the 49er women's basketball team.

As recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State, Abraham was responsible for the signing of several All-American athletes. Long Beach State was among the nation's Top-10 teams each of the six seasons, including a No. 2 AP Poll ranking in 1989. Twice they advanced to the NCAA Final Four. In Abraham's six years as an assistant at Long Beach, his teams combined for a 147-21 overall record.

Prior to his assistant coaching position at Long Beach State, Abraham was the head coach at St. Mary's Academy in Portland, Oregon from 1978-84. Abraham guided his team to the State 3A championship in 1984 with a 23-0 overall record. St. Mary's Academy boasted a record of 81-13 overall and 51-1 in league play with Abraham at the helm.

Abraham, a native of Portland, has also worked several basketball camps and clinics over the years, including the Jack Ramsey Basketball Camp and the Long Beach State 49er Basketball Camp. He formed the Blues Basketball Clinic in Portland which he directed from 1979-84. Abraham also serv-

ed as head coach of the Nike-Portland Tanners AAU squad and the Oregon Basketball Congress Invitational All-Stars, in 1984.

Abraham, 31, graduated from Portland State in 1984 with a bachelor of arts degree in English.

## **TODD ABRAHAM Graduate Assistant**

Todd Abraham, 23, is a graduate assistant for the Oregon State women's basketball team. Todd is in the process of obtaining a bachelor's degree in broadcast media at Oregon State. He plans on pursuing a career in sports reporting or the music entertainment business. Prior to attending Oregon State, Todd graduated from Portland State University with a degree in speech communication in 1990.

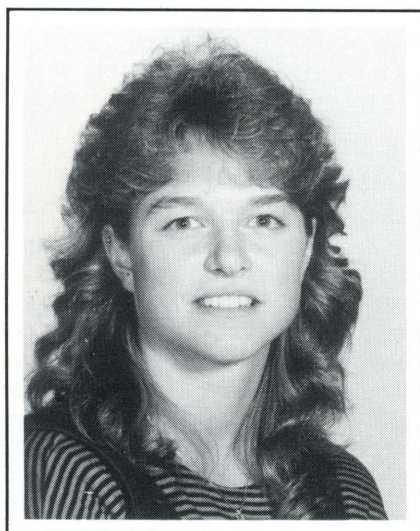

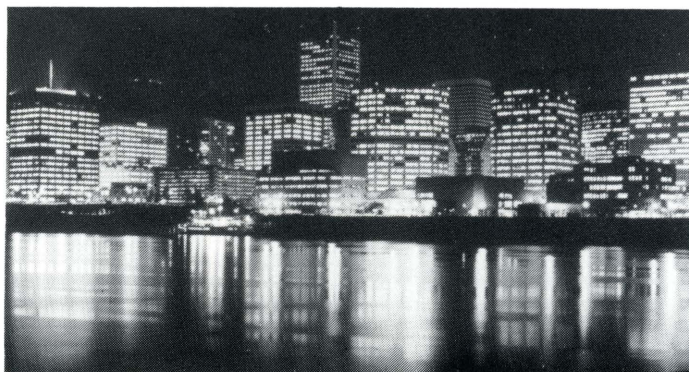
Many times, OSU students like to drive to Portland for a weekend, a pro basketball game or a major concert.

The Valley is the heart of Oregon and Corvallis happens to be in the heart of the Valley. It will remain the most favored region in Oregon for a long time to come.

On Oregon's Pacific coastline you can stroll along unspoiled public beaches or spend hours browsing in tiny shops — and on the Newport waterfront you can drop in at Mo's for a bowl of famous (and truly superb) clam chowder! In the Southwest you will find such attractions as Crater Lake National Park, Oregon Caves National Monument, and historic Jacksonville where you can tour authentically preserved 19th Century homes. In Ashland you can attend one of the premier Shakespearean theaters in the nation.

And all of this is within a few hours drive of Corvallis!

# OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY



Oregon State University, located in an attractive college town in Oregon's lush Willamette Valley within an hour's drive of both ocean beaches and the beautiful Cascade Mountains, and only 90 miles from metropolitan Portland, is the perfect setting for academics and athletics.

Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning, dating back to October 27, 1868, OSU was established as one of the nation's land-grant colleges, receiving federal land grants to help launch its public education-service program.

From an initial graduating class of three in 1870, OSU now confers about 3,200 degrees each June. The 16,000 regular and 4,000 summer-term students enjoy a spacious 500-acre campus on which are located more than 100 major buildings. The college of science and the college of liberal arts are the largest academic units. Other colleges include agricultural sciences, business, engineering, forestry, health and physical education, home economics, oceanography, pharmacy, veterinary medicine, and education.

Distinguished alumni reflect the diversity and excellence of OSU's academic programs. Dr. Linus Pauling, OSU chemistry graduate and twice winner of the Nobel Prize, recently made OSU the official repository for his papers and medals. Art department graduate Harley Jessup received an Oscar for special effects for the movie "Innerspace" at the 1988 Academy Awards.

Oregon State provides the research base for two of Oregon's leading industries, forestry and agriculture. In addition to university research facilities and forests, a federal forestry sciences

laboratory is located on campus. The Agricultural Experiment Station operates a number of branch stations throughout Oregon for work on specialized regional problems. Coastal research units, in addition to the Marine Science Center, are the Seafoods Laboratory at Astoria and a fisheries culture station at Netarts Bay.

On September 7, 1971, OSU was designated as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant Colleges, charged to help advance man's wise and orderly use of ocean resources and to provide teaching and research programs related to marine sciences. The Hatfield Marine Science Center at Newport is OSU's important "Campus on the Coast." The 177-foot, all-weather Wecoma and smaller research vessels operate from there in studying the ocean, estuaries and rivers.

One of the three major National Environmental Research Centers operated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is located on campus. Also important to the research and training facilities of the Northwest are the OSU Radiation Center, Computer Center, Environmental Health Sciences Center, and the International Plant Protection Center. Other research units include the Engineering Experiment Station and Genetics, Nutrition, Science, Water Resources, Nuclear Science and Engineering Research Institutes. The State Fish and Wildlife Commission's Research Division is headquartered at OSU.

OSU's Extension agents serve every one of Oregon's 36 counties, helping to interpret, adapt and disseminate research findings for practical use and assistance in such programs as human and natural resources development.

## THE PACIFIC-10 CONFERENCE Conference of Champions

The Pacific-10 Conference has long enjoyed the reputation of being the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate athletic conference in the country. The reputation is well deserved.

Indicative of the strength of the Conference is the fact that Pac-10 members have won 187 NCAA team championships in men's sports, far and away more than any other conference (the Big Ten is runner-up with 131). Pac-10 men's programs have won at least four NCAA team titles in 16 of the last 18 years, a feat unprecedented in intercollegiate athletics.

The NCAA has been conducting women's championships for six years and Pac-10 members have won four team titles four times. The total of 21 NCAA team titles won by Pac-10 members far outdistances any other conference (the Southwest Conference is runner-up with 12). Included in the NCAA team titles are all seven tennis crowns, three out of six championships in track and field and softball.

The roots of the Pacific-10 conference go back over 70 years. On December 9, 1915, the Pacific Coast Conference was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Oregon. Original membership consisted of four schools — University of California, University of Washington, University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University).

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916. One year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the PCC, and Stanford University joined in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California and the University of Idaho. Montana joined the Conference in 1924 and in 1928 the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-team league until 1950 with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II somewhat curtailed athletic competition at the university level. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and joined the Mountain States Conference. The PCC continued as a nine-team conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC dissolved and a new conference was formed called the Athletic Association of Western Universities. Original AAUW membership consisted of California, Stanford, Southern California, UCLA, and Washington. Washington State became a member in 1962 with Oregon and Oregon State joining in 1964. In 1968, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality.

# GILL COLISEUM

The 10,000-seat house that Slat Gill built is the house that Ralph Miller filled to the point of mandatory expansion.

Gill Coliseum, Home of the Beavers since the 1949-50 season, expanded 400 vital seats and a wholesale sprucing up in 1984 giving Oregon State one of the most ideal facilities for the viewing of college basketball.

New lighting, floor and wall coverings, additional, more comfortable seating and improvements in meeting rooms, concession stands and rest rooms were all part of the 1.6 million dollar project. No state funds were used for the renovation as all the money was raised through seat options and booster donations.

The site of the NCAA Western Regionals in 1952, 1953, 1954, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1964, 1967 and 1983 (nine times total) was named after the late Slat Gill, head basketball coach at Oregon State for 36 years (1929-1964) and later the school's athletic director. The building is perfectly suited for basketball. It is not a fieldhouse. There are no posts obstructing vantage points and 85% of the seating is along the sidelines.

The structure covers one and one-third acres. The peak of the coliseum is 83 feet above the floor; equivalent to a four-story building. The framework consists of 12 fabricated steel arches. In all, there are 1,000 tons of structural steel and 14,000 cubic yards (over 70,000 sacks of cement) of concrete in Gill Coliseum. In addition, more than 14,000 pumice blocks were used for partitions and finishing work.

Some of those blocks have been knocked out with the renovation enabling Gill Coliseum to accommodate approximately 10,400 fans now and host many more events with additional meeting rooms behind the new collapsible theater seats on the arena floor.

The largest crowd to witness a game at Gill Coliseum arrived in 1962 to watch the Oregon State men defeat rival Oregon, 82-66, 11,709 showed up that day, but fire marshall regulations prevent that figure from being surpassed unless additional expansion occurs.

# UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION

Long before Dr. John Byrne was named president of Oregon State University in 1985, OSU's leader had taken an active interest in the role of athletics within the university.

He is a competitor himself and cherishes certain moments of his own athletic accomplishments. By his own admission, when his son shunned fishing for dirt biking as a recreational outlet, "to keep up with him, I had to buy one, too. I learned how to ride a dirt bike and had never been on a motorcycle before."

He fondly recalls his days as a reserve on the lacrosse team at Hamilton College ("The little things you remember—screening out two opponents enabling us to score.") and also his progression through four years of intramural hockey ("learning how to skate, playing goalie as a freshman, left forward as a senior scoring a hat trick—again the little things you remember.").

Byrne is familiar with the OSU campus and the Beaver athletic program. He spent 21 years at Oregon State before he was nominated by President Ronald Reagan and confirmed by the U.S. Senate in 1981 as administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

He returned to Corvallis three years later to lead the university into the latter portion of the 20th century succeeding Robert MacVicar at Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher education.

Byrne began his science and teaching career as a laboratory instructor at USC in 1953. In 1955, he entered the private sector as a research geologist until he joined the Oregon State faculty in 1960 as an associate professor in what was then the department of oceanography. He became department chairman in 1963, was promoted to full professor in 1965 and was selected dean of the OSU school of oceanography in 1972 (the program is now the college of oceanography).

After four years as dean of research and, concurrently, one year as acting dean of the OSU graduate school, Byrne was appointed vice president for research and graduate studies in 1980. His responsibilities included direction of the OSU research program, which then involved more than 800 separate projects with a total annual support base of \$40 million, and the graduate school with its 2,500 master's and doctoral students.

Byrne and his wife, Shirley, have four children, Donna, Karen, Lisa and Steve.

Dutch Baughman (pronounced Balk-man) was named the 10th athletic director in the history of Oregon State University athletics on April 30, 1990, succeeding Lynn Snyder. Dutch was promoted from senior associate athletic director, a position he started in Oct., 1989.

The hiring of Baughman was a very popular choice among Oregon State coaches and athletic department staff members. In his short tenure as senior associate director of athletics he was very successful in improving the morale and overall operating procedures of the athletic department. When Baughman was hired as senior associate, his immediate task was to be primarily responsible for budget preparation and control, personnel, supervision of coaches for non-revenue sports and compliance with NCAA and conference regulations. Baughman, a stickler for detail, passed his first test with flying colors as the Oregon State athletic department completed the 1989-90 fiscal year with an athletic budget in the black for the first time in six years, and the credit has to go to Baughman.

Baughman's management style in his short tenure at Oregon State has been very successful and one of the big keys to his success is his tremendous ability to communicate.

Dutch came to OSU in October, 1989 with outstanding credentials. He brought with him 16 years of previous experience in top athletic administration, including athletic directorships at Furman University (1979-83) and Virginia Tech in 1988. Dutch also served as assistant and associate commissioner of the Southwest Conference from 1983 to 1987.

In addition to his athletic administration experience, Dutch has also served as a high school football coach and as a graduate assistant football coach under the highly successful Woody Hayes at The Ohio State University.

Although Dutch was born in Columbus, Ohio and graduated from Columbus West High School in 1967, he spent the majority of his adolescent years in Texas where he calls home.

Baughman earned his B.A. in Physical Education from Ohio State in 1971 and his M.A. in Athletic Administration from Ohio State in 1976. In addition, he spent six years on the United States Sports Academy's national faculty and he has completed additional graduate work toward a doctorate at Ohio State. Dutch is also a graduate of the Ranch Management Program at Texas Christian University in 1988.

After receiving his B.A., Dutch was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps in 1971 as an infantry officer. He was discharged in 1974 with the rank of Captain.

In addition to being Athletic Director at Furman and Virginia Tech, Baughman also spent two years as associate athletic director at Northwestern University from 1977 to 1979.

As an athlete, Dutch earned two letters in football as a linebacker, one in basketball as a guard and three in baseball as a catcher at Columbus West High School and he earned three letters in lacrosse at Ohio State and he was a member of The Ohio State University football team during his collegiate tenure, but he did not letter.

Dutch and wife, Jacqueline, a former elementary teacher, have one son, Eric (12/26/77).

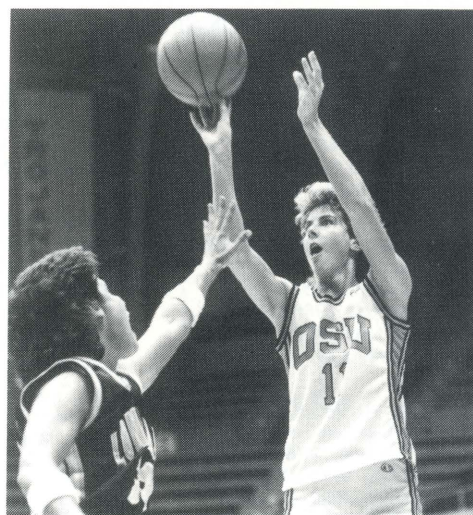

Women's basketball at Oregon State actually got its start before organized men's competition began. The first women's game was played in 1898; the first men's contest in 1901.

That game bore little resemblance to modern day basketball, however. The court was divided into three zones, each containing two players from the two teams. The divisions included areas for guards, centers and forwards. A center jump was held after every basket and no one was allowed to leave their zone.

Scores were low in that era — in 1914, for example, Oregon State beat Oregon by a 10-8 score.

By the 1930's, there was a change in philosophy in women's sports. Competition, per se, was discouraged. On the other hand, mass participation via class instruction and intramurals was encouraged. That philosophy prevailed until the early 1970's although women's basketball was organized as an extramural and club sport in the late 1950's.

No school in the Northwest was quite as successful as Oregon State University. Competing against clubs from other schools, Oregon State teams went undefeated from 1959 to 1966.

Basketball became an intercollegiate sport for women in 1972, when the newly organized women's athletic department started competition as a charter member of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW). Teams competed in the Northwest College Women's Sports Association (NCWSA), Region 9 of the nine-division AIAW.

Accurate records, however, were not kept in women's basketball until the 1976-77 season, when Mary Covington coached the Beavers.

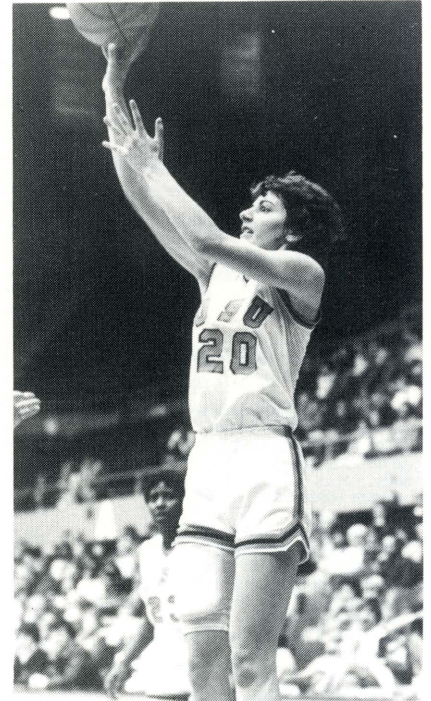

## CAROL MENKEN-SCHAUDT: OSU's Golden All-American

Carol Menken came to Oregon State unrecruited by anyone else in the state. She had grown up in nearby Jefferson, Oregon, played a year of junior college ball at Linn-Benton Community College and was ready to move up to the NCAA level. No one was willing to take a chance with her except the OSU coaching staff of Aki Hill and Ross Cook.

Three years later, Menken left Oregon State as one of the top basketball players in the country. She was named a Kodak All-American during her senior year and led OSU to a sparkling 22-6 record in 1980-81. Menken also led the country in field goal percentage, hitting 363 of 484 shots, an incredible .750 shooting percentage.

Menken still maintains her amateur status and was selected for the U.S. team at the 1984 Olympics. She contributed to the U.S. gold medal winning team at Los Angeles.

The honors go on and on and Carol Menken is still making a name for herself. She played AAU basket-

ball in Turin, Italy, where she was among league leaders in scoring and rebounding. After six seasons in Italy, Carol played in Tokyo. International basketball is nothing new to Menken, however. She played in the World University Games for the United States in the summer of 1981 and toured Romania, Yugoslavia and Cuba.
