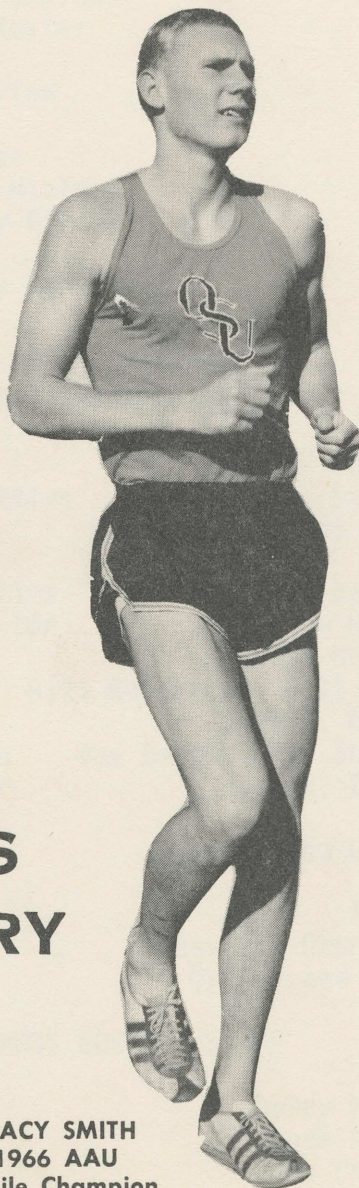

## OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY

Oregon State University is the oldest state-supported institution of higher learning in Oregon. It is now in its 98th year with a record enrollment of approximately 13,000. This is 1000 more than a year ago and 3,000 more than 1963. OSU is one of the nation's Land-Grant Colleges, started by the Morrill Act of 1862 to make educational opportunities available to all Americans who have the will and ability to learn.

OSU Schools of study, in order of student enrollment, include Sciences, Engineering, Education, Business and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences, Agriculture, Home Economics, Pharmacy and Forestry. Eighty separate departments are included in the nine schools.

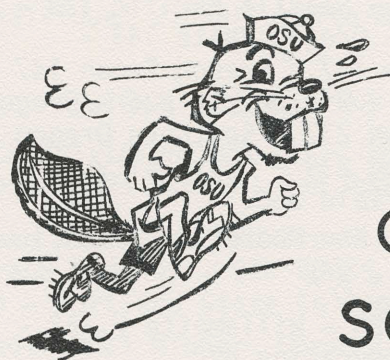
The number of students working for advanced degrees--masters and doctors degrees--has doubled in the past 10 years. Today, about 11 per cent of the students at Oregon State are in the Graduate School.

Nearly 100 major buildings are located on the 400-acre OSU campus. Approximately 4,000 acres adjoining the main campus are owned and used by the University for research and instruction, and 24,000 acres more are utilized by Branch Experiment Stations for research.

Oregon State University is nationally known for many of its major specialized fields. Students from every county in Oregon, 47 states and 63 other countries attended Oregon State last year.

OSU is the West's top center for science-mathematics teacher institutes sponsored by the National Science Foundation. It was one of the first 16 U.S. universities selected to give the teacher training.

## 1965 SEASON IN REVIEW

In Coach Wagner's initial year at Oregon State, he led a young Beaver squad to a fine 6-4 record.

The Beavers opened the season on October 9th with a win over Willamette and Oregon College of Education at Salem. OSU's Clyde Hunt led Oregon State to the tape with a 20:52.5 clocking.

In their next outing, the varsity placed 2nd in the Annual Portland University Invitational on October 16th at Portland. The Rooks defeated Clark College the day before at Corvallis.

Next up was a meet with Portland State, Utah and Portland University at Corvallis. The Beavers were edged for first place honors by Utah 27-34.

On October 29th the annual Oregon vs Oregon State dual Cross Country Meet took place at Eugene with the Ducks coming out on top 19-39.

The following week at Portland OSU bounced back and won the Portland State Invitational with 26 points. Although the Beavers didn't capture individual honors, the young squad showed depth and desire in winning the title.

The first NCAA District #8 Cross Country Meet was hosted by OSU on November 13th at Corvallis and OSU placed third in both the NCAA and Open Divisions behind WSU and Oregon.

On November 20th at Portland, OSU rounded out the season by again coming up with the needed depth to capture the Oregon AAU Championships. The Beavers placed 3-4-5-6-8 to win over a strong Portland State track club with 26 points.



## 1966 PROSPECTUS

The fall of 1966 should see Oregon State return to national prominence in Cross Country. Last year's team was just one man short of being a group of national caliber and four of the top five from that squad are back.

One man who could certainly make the difference in 1966 is Tracy Smith (pictured on cover), national AAU 6-mile champion and runner up in the 3-mile. He is not the only addition, however, who will greatly strengthen the 1966 OSU edition. Two fine junior college transfers, Fred Crowe from Pasadena City College, and Glen Knapp from Mount San Antonio College, both in Southern California, plus several outstanding sophomores up from last season's fine Rook squad will give the Beavers depth and the necessary competition for team positions to push them toward the top.

In the sophomore group, Lew Dahlin, the State of Oregon High School 2-mile record holder and Keith Munson, a fine Rook runner last year will lead the youth movement.

Coach Wagner has made real strides in upgrading the Cross Country Program at Oregon State University in his initial year with the Beavers. Last year's meet with Utah and this season's meet against Arizona State U. is only the start of a fine intersectional Cross Country program that is being built here at Oregon State.

With this year's attractive schedule and with sights set on the national championships, plus the top competition close at hand in the excellent distance running area of the Northwest, 1966 should be a banner year for the Beavers.

## INDIVIDUAL PROFILES

EARL BELCHER A Jamaican who represented his country in the Central American and British Empire games last summer. Jamaican national record holder in the mile.

WILL BRADSHAW A sophomore with promise. Could be a big surprise in the coming cross country season.

FRED CROWE A transfer from Pasadena City College of Southern California. Ran 4:15 last spring for the Lancers fine track team.

LEW DAHLIN In second year of cross country having never run in high school. Was top Rook runner last year.

ED FORD A smooth running Junior from New Jersey who should come into his own this fall.

LYNN HARMON A hard-working member of last year's top seven.

DICK HENTZE The 1965 OSU squad's number six man.

STEVE HETZLER Showed much promise as a Sophomore. A medal winner in the 1965 Oregon AAU Championships.

GLEN KNAPP A transfer from Mt. San Antonio Junior College in Southern California where he ran for the number two team in the state. He was fourteenth in the state meet.

JOE MacDONALD A novice who can run forever. May turn out to be the year's top surprise.

PETE MEWETT A consistent placer on last year's X-country team. Ran under 4:10 in the mile both indoors and out before contracting mononucleiosis last spring.



KEITH MUNSON The state A-1 2-mile champion in '65. Was the Rooks number two man last year.

BING OTT Did not run cross country last year. Was a member of the Rook track squad.

TERRY SCHUKART Number three man on the Rook cross country team last year. Top half-miler and co-captain of the Rook track squad.

TERRY SMITH Tremendously improved in both long and middle distances. Placed fourth in the Oregon AAU championships last season.

TRACY SMITH Returning to Oregon State after a one-year layout. Was OSU's top cross country man two years ago. Is national AAU six-mile champion and one of the top ten distance runners in the world.

KEITH SOUKKALA An extremely dedicated runner. One of last year's top cross country men.

MIKE SOUKKALA Lacks experience, but showed much promise last year.

DOUG SWEET A half-miler on last season's Rook team. Doug should be a valuable asset to this year's varsity squad.

CHRIS TAPP A 440 man who has shown a great deal of aptitude for distances.

STEVE WARNER A much-improved Sophomore from Indiana. Is expected to help beef up the OSU squad.

DAVE WOLFE Upset many runners with better previous times on last year's Rook squad. A fine competitor. Dave will make a fine addition to this year's varsity.

## OSU CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

Cross Country had its start as a sport at OSU back in the 1930's when Coach Grant Swan fielded teams against Oregon Colleges and Universities.

In 1948 the University of Portland started one of the few invitational Cross Country meets that existed on the west coast. This meet was open to any and all colleges and universities in the State of Oregon. Coach Swan's teams led by Beaver stars George Fullerton (later head coach) and Joe Fisher captured the meet title in 1948-49-50.

OSU Cross Country next went through a transition stage with three coaches at the helm from 1951-57.

Next on the scene was Sam Bell who carried the Beavers into national competition. In 1961 OSU won the NCAA title with 68 points. OSU's Dale Story won individual honors in the 1961 meet and Richard Cuddihy placed 12th to make the All-American team. In the 1962 season the Beavers placed 8th in the NCAA Championships.

Last year in his initial season at Corvallis, Coach Berny Wagner led a young OSU squad to the Portland State Invitational Crown and the Oregon AAU Title.

Coach Wagner upgraded OSU's program by adding an intersectional meet with Utah to the 1965 schedule.

## KNOW YOUR COACHES

**BERNY WAGNER** Starting his second season as OSU Head Track & Cross Country Coach, following a brilliant prep and college coaching career at College of San Mateo (Calif.) Coached 13 years in prep ranks in California, following graduation from Stanford where he was an 880 distance runner. Attended and ran for Cal Tech in Pasadena, and Stanford. Obtained A.B. degree in 1948, M.A. degree in 1949. Last year in his first season at OSU he led the Beavers to a 6-4 record while capturing the Oregon AAU Title and the Portland State Invitational Crown. Coach Wagner is married and has three children.

**CHUCK McNEIL** Now in his second season for OSU as an Assistant to Coach Wagner. Chuck was a standout sprinter in his undergraduate days, first at Modesto J.C. and later at San Jose State College. His best marks included 9.6 in the 100, 20.8 in the 220 and 47.4 for the 440. Before coming to OSU Chuck was assistant track and field coach at Bakersfield Junior College in 1961-62 and Head Coach at South High in Bakersfield in 1963. Chuck is married and is the father of two children.

**JOHN CHAPLIN** Will be assisting Coach Wagner this year while working toward his Master's Degree. Chaplin was a star sprinter for Pasadena City College and Washington State University. He has listed marks of 9.4 in the 100, 20.6 in the 220 and has run a 46.3 440. For the past three years he has been Head Cross Country and Track Coach at Wapato High School in Washington where his teams were among the finest in the state, winning 58 out of 63 dual meets.
