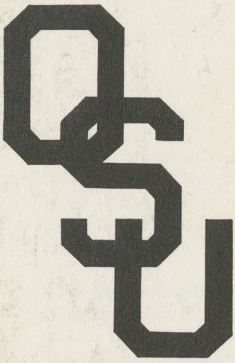

## OSU'S CENTENNIAL OBSERVANCE

### A Year To Remember

The 1968-69 school year will be one to remember. It will be the 100th "birthday" observance of the university.

It was on Oct. 27, 1868, that OSU was officially designated as the state college of Oregon.

And beginning on Oct. 27, 1968, an extensive program of special events is planned to mark 100 years of growth and development and to make plans for the decades to come when enrollment is expected to reach 25,000.

Big-name speakers, exhibits and demonstrations, and programs sponsored by the various schools will all be a part of the Centennial observance. The "Class of the Century" will be graduated in June 1969 with special fanfare.

It all adds up to the most exciting year ever for Oregon State University, the oldest state-supported institution of higher learning in Oregon. In its 100 years, it has become one of the nation's leading educational and research centers.

OSU enrolls more than 13,000 students annually, conducts research programs, and administers the Cooperative Extension Service in all counties of the state. The main campus is in Corvallis, a city of 29,500 people near the center of the Willamette Valley, eighty miles from Portland and fifty miles from the Pacific Ocean. The University also has a Marine Science Center at Newport, a Seafoods Laboratory at Astoria, an ocean-going research vessel docked at Yaquina Bay, thousands of acres of forest lands and branch agricultural experiment stations at several locations in the state.

### A Beautiful Campus

Oregon State has a handsome, well designed campus of about 500 acres -- with several thousand acres of farm and forest lands nearby. The wide lawns, shaded walks, and landscaped gardens of the main campus make this a pleasant place in which to live and study. The new Library is one of the finest in western United States. Other new buildings being constructed, and older ones being remodeled, fit into a newly approved long-range plan for campus development. Classroom buildings are so arranged as to be within easy walking distance of one another and of most of the living groups.

## 1968 FORECAST

The outlook for Oregon State's 1968 cross country season is one of promise. Only five Seniors are on the squad of sixteen men. Six members of last season's undefeated Rook team will join the Varsity as Sophomores, and this year for the first time all Freshmen will be eligible for the Varsity group if they can displace one of the veterans.

The continuing policy of scheduling at least one inter-sectional meet per year will see the Beavers flying to Salt Lake City to meet the University of Utah in the season opening meet. For international flavor, the Vancouver British Columbia Olympic Club will bring both their Senior and Junior teams to Corvallis again this year. This is the last season that the Pacific 8 will not have an official championship meet, and with the addition of the PAC 8 championships in 1969, cross country should become of age at Oregon State.

The young and eager Beavers consisting of a Freshman, Grant Osborne, who entered school last winter term, six Sophomores headed by Spencer Lyman, OSU Rook cross country record holder, and Jim Barkley who improved last year from 4:46 to 4:08.9 in the mile, four Junior including transfer Joe Baisch from Highline College in Washington, and five Seniors, should improve considerably on last year's record. They may approach the excellence of the 1966 team which was seventh in the Nation, the 1962 team which was eighth, or even the 1961 team which won the NCAA title.

## INDIVIDUAL PROFILES OF LEADING RUNNERS

**JOE BAISCH** A transfer from Highline College in Washington. He was the Washington Junior College cross country champion and two-mile champion with the best time of 9:11.5.

**JIM BARKLEY** From Scio High School where he ran the mile in 4:46 and the two-mile in 9:48. Jim improved in his Freshman year at OSU to 4:08.9 and 9:08.8. A tough runner.

**LEW DAHLIN** Missed last year's cross country team season while recovering from a broken back. Ran 9:04.2 in two-mile last spring.

**WAYNE DEY** A member of the undefeated Rooks last season who improved to 4:12.8 in the mile last spring.

**MIKE DURBIN** Holder of OSU's Rook cross country record until it was broken last year. Has potential to be great.

**ED FORD** Last year's cross country and track manager, ran a 1:55 - 880 last spring while working out, just incidently.

**GLENN KNAPP** Last year's number-one man. Competed in the NCAA championships in Wyoming.

**JOHN LILLY** A 1:49.1 half-miler who works hard at the longer distances. He now has the strength to go the distance.

**SPENCER LYMAN** The leader of last year's undefeated Rooks, and OSU Rook cross country course record holder. Must overcome injury problems.

**GRANT OSBORNE** Still a Freshman since he entered school just last winter term. He is a fine prospect from Canada.

**TERRY SCHUKART** Was a member of the fine '66 team. A miler, half-miler, who can go six miles.

**STEVE SQUIRES**, Number-two man from last year's Rook squad, was state of Oregon runner-up in the two mile when a Senior in high school.

**KEN ST. PIERRE** Large for a distance runner. This 6'4" athlete from Milwaukie should have strength now to realize his promise.

**TERRY THOMPSON** Will have to run himself into shape after a summer on his commercial fishing boat. Pacific Eight champion and NCAA runner-up in the 880.

**LARRY ULRICH** A Sophomore from Siuslaw High School, has half mile speed and fine endurance.



## OSU CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

Cross Country had its start as a sport at OSU back in the 1930's when Coach Grant Swan fielded teams against Oregon Colleges and Universities.

In 1948 the University of Portland started one of the few invitational Cross Country meets that existed on the West Coast. This meet was open to any and all colleges and universities in the State of Oregon. Coach Swan's teams led by Beaver stars George Fullerton (later head coach) and Joe Fisher captured the meet title in 1948-49-50.

OSU Cross Country next went through a transitional stage with three coaches at the helm from 1951-57.

Next on the scene was Sam Bell who carried the Beavers into national competition. In 1961 OSU won the NCAA title with 68 points. OSU's Dale Story won individual honors in the 1961 meet and Richard Cuddihy placed 12th to make the All-American team. In the 1962 season the Beavers placed 8th in the NCAA Championships.

In his second season as Head Coach, in 1966, Wagner led the Beavers to a 7th place finish in the NCAA Championships. Tracy Smith won his All-American honors by taking second in this race. Another feature of the program under Wagner is the continued scheduling of top-flight teams from other sections of the country. This year, Utah and the Vancouver Olympic Club are on the schedule.

## KNOW YOUR COACHES

**BERNY WAGNER** Starting his fourth season as Head Track & Cross Country Coach, following a brilliant prep and college coaching career at College of San Mateo. Coached 13 years in prep ranks in California, following graduation from Stanford where he was an 880 man. Attended and ran for Cal Tech in Pasadena, Stanford and the S.F.O.C. Obtained A.B. degree in 1948, M.A. degree in 1949. Coach Wagner is married and has three children.

**BUD CALBREATH** Newly hired Assistant Coach, is a graduate of San Jose State and has spent the past six years teaching and coaching in California. He was at El Segundo High School for two years, at Dominguez High in Compton for three years, and an assistant at Bakersfield Junior College last year. He is currently working on his Masters Degree in Health Education at OSU, is 26 years old and single.

**CHUCK McNEIL** Now in his fourth season for OSU as an assistant to Coach Wagner. Chuck was a standout sprinter at Modesto J.C. and later at San Jose State College. His best marks included 9.6 in the 100, 20.8 in the 220 and 47.4 for the 440. Before coming to OSU Chuck was assistant track and field coach at Bakers-

field Junior College in 1961-62 and Head Coach at South High in Bakersfield in 1963. Chuck is married and is the father of two children.
