Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning, dating back to October 27, 1868. It was established as one of the nation's land grant colleges, receiving federal land grants to help launch its public education-service program.

On September 7, 1971, OSU was designated as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant Colleges, charged to help advance man's wise and orderly use of ocean resources and to provide teaching and research programs related to marine sciences. The Oregon State University Marine Science Center at Newport has become OSU's important "Campus on the Coast." The 177-foot, all weather Wecoma and smaller research vessels operate from there in studying the ocean, estuaries and rivers.

From an initial graduating class of three in 1870, OSU has grown to the point that it now confers about 3,500 degrees each June. Student enrollment during the regular school year is about 16,500; summer term enrollment now tops 5,000.

The main campus covers nearly 500 acres on which there are 100 major buildings. Experimental farms, an arboretum and teaching-research forests, all located within just a few minutes drive of the campus, make up an additional 18,000 acres.

Oregon State provides the research base for Oregon's two largest industries, forestry and agriculture. In addition to university research facilities and forests, a federal Forest Science Laboratory is located on campus. The Agricultural Experiment Station operates a number of branch stations throughout Oregon for work on specialized, regional problems. Coastal research units, in addition to the Marine Science Center, are the Seafoods Laboratory at Astoria and a fisheries culture station at Netarts Bay.

Water, key to the future, is getting special attention, including work in water resource management, water quality and reuse, pollution control, oceanography, fisheries and irrigation. One of the three major National Environmental Research Centers operated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is located on campus, and considerable cooperative research is underway.

Important additions to the research and training facilities of the Northwest are the OSU Radiation Center, Computer Center, Environmental Health Sciences Center, Air Resources Center and the International Plant Center. Other research units include the Engineering Experiment Station, and the Genetics, Nutrition, Science, Water Resources and Nuclear Science and Engineering Research Institutions. The State Fish and Wildlife Commission's Research Division is headquartered at OSU.

Oregon State University is "extended" into every one of Oregon's 36 counties through the extension Service. Extension agents in each county help interpret, adapt and disseminate research findings for practical use and assist in such programs as human and natural resources development. The 4-H Club program, which enrolls approximately 50,000 young Oregonians annually, is a part of the OSU Extension Service. The 4-H program is open to all Oregon youth, ages 9-19.

OUTLOOK

Oregon State returns all its letterman from last years seventh place team at the Pac-10's. The Beavers will have three experienced seniors and five juniors to lead the team throughout the spring.

"Our play in the fall was a real confidence builder," said OSU first year head coach Rick Garber. The Beavers finished in the top four of the five tournaments they played in over the fall, including capturing the OSU Invitational Championship. "We have a good chance of going along way this spring," Garber said.

Oregon State will be looking for big contributions from last years ninth place Pac-10 finisher Dean Claggett. Claggett (stroke average of 75), a junior, competed in all five tournaments, and took the medalist honors at the OSU Invitational. In addition to Claggett, Garber will be relying heavily on seniors Scott Larsen, Scott Kraemer, and newcomer Jeff Jarvis.

Larsen (74) had two top five finishes in the fall, and expected to be near the top this spring. Kraemer (74) had an impressive fall season with three top five finishes, including a second place at the Wolfpack Classic at Lake Tahoe. Jarvis, a JC Transfer from Columbia Basin in Pasco, Washington, is expected to step in help the team immediately.

The Beavers also look for senior Brad Leiken, and juniors Brad Blind, Eric Gifford, and Ross Jesswein, to play a vital role on the team.

Oregon State will face another tough schedule, playing in most of the top collegiate golf tournaments in California.

OREGON STATE MEN'S GOLF COACH

RICK GARBER

Rick Garber is in his first year as volunteer head golf coach at Oregon State. He graduated last year from OSU, receiving a bachelor degree in industrial engineering, and is currently working on his masters in business administration. He was OSU's assistant coach last season.

Garber was a member of the Beavers golf team for four years, and consistently was on the top half of the leader boards in both tournaments and the Pac-10 Championships. Along with his college golf accomplishments, he was last years medalist at the Washington State Amateur Golf Tournament, and was named to the Hudson Cup Team.

The Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan native, began his golfing career at Newport High School, in Bellevue, Washington. At Bellevue he was a four year letterman, and won the district championship his senior year.

"My goals for the Beaver program are simple, keep improving every year. I think we have a good solid base to work with, and its my job to see the team continues to challenge for the top spot in the Pac-10," he said.

MEN'S PROFILES

MARK BOLTON--5-5, 135, 18, Fr., Beaverton, OR (Sunset)

Mark competed in the 1985 Fall Golf Invitational where he shot a 237, with his best round being a four over par 75. He was a three sport athlete at Sunset High School, playing basketball, football and golf. Mark finished in the top five in the state his junior and senior seasons, and was named to the all-Metro league team three times. He also played as the top man on the varsity golf team for three years. Mark is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born April 4, 1967 in Pendleton, Oregon, and is the son of Fred and Joyce Bolton.

BRAD BLIND--6-1, 155, 20, Jr., Eugene (South Eugene)

Brad is expected to make big contributions to this years team. He is coming off a spring season that saw him average 77 strokes over 12 rounds. His best round was a one under par 70 at the Corvallis CC, during the OSU Invitational. He has consistently been in the top five OSU scores, and has led the the team in scoring several times. In high school, Brad was on the all-district team, and was the medalist at the Hogan Cup. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. Brad was born September 23, 1965, in Eugene, and he is the son of Ron and Caroline Blind.

DEAN CLAGGETT--5-10, 170, 22, Jr., Kelowna, B.C. (Spring Valley)

Dean comes into his second full season on the Beavers as one of the most consistent players on the team, and the entire Pac-10. Claggett showed that he was one of the better players in the Pac-10 when he finished in a ninth place tie, and if it wouldn't have been for a poor third round, he had a good chance of winning the championship. After two rounds he was in a tie for third at even par 142. Dean transferred to Oregon State from Linn-Benton CC in Albany, OR., last winter. The native Canadian, was the senior provincial champion, and was named golfer of the year in British Columbia. Along with golf, he was also an outstanding hockey player. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. Dean was born February 2, 1963, and he is the son of Dawn Claggett.

ERIC GIFFORD--5-6, 160, 20, Jr., LaGrande, OR. (LaGrande)

Eric will be looked upon to make contributions to the team this spring. He had a fine OSU Invitational last fall, as he fired a 222, including a round of two over par 73. While at LaGrande High School he was a three year letterman in golf, and appeared in the state championship tournament his junior year. Eric also has to his credit, being named to the all-Intermountain conference team his senior season. He is majoring in electrical engineering at Oregon State. He was born May 5, 1965 in Walla Walla, Washington, and is the son of Bob Gifford and Ruth Stebbins.

TODD GJESVOLD--6-1, 175, 20, So., Omak, WA (Omak)

Todd made his first appearance on the Oregon State team last fall. Gjesvold fired a 228 at the OSU Invitational. He transferred to OSU in the summer from Columbia Basin CC in Pasco, Washington, where he was named to the NWACC Conference Team in both 1984, and 1985, while winning over 90% of all of his matches. At Omak High School he lettered in golf all four years. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. Todd was born July 1, 1965 in Corvallis, and is the son of James and Carol Gjesvold.

JEFF JARVIS--6-1, 165, 20, Jr., Bend, OR (Bend)

Jeff comes to Oregon State, after transferring from Columbia Basin CC in Pasco, Washington. He was highly recruited by many of the southern schools, and he is expected to make immediate contributions to the team. He was a member of the NWACC conference team, that won the championship two straight years. Jeff also was the individual medalist at the conference tournament. His record at Columbia Basin was an amazing 201-9 record over two years. At Bend High School he lettered in golf for three years, and also played basketball for the Lava Bears. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. Jeff was born April 27, 1965 in Corvallis, and he is the son of Jim and Lynn Jarvis.

ROSS JESSWEIN--5-9, 160, 21, Jr., Grants Pass, OR (Grants Pass)

Ross played in the OSU Invitational last fall, and shot a 223 over the 54 holes. At Grants Pass High School he played number one man all four years. He was the OGA Champion twice, in the 12-13 and 14-15 age groups. In addition to winning the OGA, he also competed in the Hogan Cup for three years. Ross is majoring in journalism at Oregon State. He was born December 8, 1964 in Grants Pass, and he is the son of of Ross Sr. and Marilyn Jesswein.

SCOTT KRAEMER--5-9, 140, Sr., Vancouver B.C. (St. Georges)

Scott averaged an impressive 74 strokes per round over five tournaments in the spring. His best individual round came at the Incline and Stockton Country Clubs where he shot a 69. Scott's top performance in the fall was a second place finish at the Nevada-Reno Wolfpack Classic, where he shot a 218. Last spring he finished in a tie for 23rd at the Pac-10 Championships with a 295 total. Scott has consistently been one of the top Beavers in his career at Oregon State, and will be looked upon to be a leader this spring. While at Menlo High School in Vancouver, he was part of the team that captured the Canadian Junior Golf Championships, while he finished third individually. Scott is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born May 17, 1964 in Edmonton, Alberta, and is the son of Ivan and Sharon Kraemer.

SCOTT LARSEN--5-11, 165, Sr., Eugene, OR (South Eugene)

Scott had two top four finishes in the fall. He finished fourth at the Air Force Invitational, and in a tie for fourth with teammate Scott Kraemer at the OSU Invitational. His best round in the fall was a 68 at the Stockton Country Club. He averaged team tying 74 strokes per round over the 5 tournaments. Scott finished 26th at last seasons Pac-10 Championships, and will be looked upon to make bigger contributions this spring. In past seasons he has several top five finishes, and has consistently been one of the top players on the team. At South Eugene High School he lettered in golf all four years. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. Scott was born on December 2, 1963 in Eugene, Oregon, and is the son of Theodore and Shannon Larsen.

BRAD LEIKEN--6-4, 215, 22, Sr., Eugene (South Eugene)

Brad averaged 75 strokes per round over the fall season, and shot three rounds of 71 for his best marks of the fall. He has had several finishes in the top five throughout his four years at OSU. Leiken is usually one of the busier players on the team in the spring, playing in nearly all the tournaments. At South Eugene High School he lettered in golf all four years, and finished in sixth place at the state tournament in his last year. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born on October 24, 1964 in Roseburg, Oregon, and he is the son of Peter and Glenda Leiken.

BOB McCALLISTER--5-9, 140, 19, SO., Redding, CA (Shasta)

Bob competed in the OSU Invitational last fall, and shot a 222 over the 54 hole event, including a two under par 69. He gained some valuable experience last season, competing in about half the tournaments. At Shasta High School he lettered in golf three years, and one was the number one man his junior and senior seasons. Bob also competed in basketball, football, and wrestling at different times in his high school career. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born August 8, 1966 in Pomona, California, and is the son Bob McCallister and Terry Kemple.

MIKE McKENNON--5-9, 155, 20, So., Lake Oswego, OR (Lakeridge)

Mike was a member of last years team that finished seventh in the conference, and like teammate Bob McCallister played a number of rounds as a freshman. He played in the OSU Invitational last fall, and shot a 222, with a consistent 75 stroke per round average. At Lakeridge High School he lettered in golf all four years, and finished in the top 10 in the state each year. Mike was also named to the honorable mention all-American team his senior year. He is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born in Corvallis on December 13, 1965, and he is the son of Loren and Ardath Flomer.

ROB NELSON--5-11, 165, 18, Fr., Bend, OR (Bend)

Rob was letterman in all four years for the Bend High School golf team. In those four years, he played as the number one man his junior and senior seasons. He was also named to the Intermountain all-conference team twice, and took the medalist honors in his district. Rob is majoring in business at Oregon State. He was born in Corvallis on July 7, 1967, and is the son of William and Kathleen Nelson.
