## Century Farm On State Fair List

Part of a donation land claim north of Molalla, settled in 1850, by the late "Uncle" Billy Vaughn and his wife, is listed among the 18 in various parts of the state, as having been in one-family ownership for more than 100 years, the owners of which are to be honored at the State Fair. Each of the Vaughns took up a section of land that was divided among their children in later years.

Part of the Longstreet Vaughn land was purchased by Jack Vaughn, now deceased, and this land is now under the ownership of his daughter, Mrs. Bertha Vaughn Johns, route 2, box 539, who will be among the Century Farmers to be feted at State Fair.

## Fox Resident Earns Honor

Mrs. Clyde (Bertha Vaughan) Johns of Fox is one of 18 Oregon residents slated to receive Century Farm honors this year under the program sponsored by the Oregon Historical society and the Oregon State Department of Agriculture. Eight counties are represented in this year's list of Century Farmers.

Initiated three years ago, the program has now enrolled 416 farms that have been owned or operated continuously in the same family for 100 years or more. Named as Century Farmers this year were persons owning lands in Clackamas, Douglas, Lane, Linn, Marion, Multnomah, Polk and Yamhill counties.

The Grant county woman's Century Farm is located near Molalla in Clackamas county. The farm was known as the William Hattchett Vaughan donation land ciaim a century ago. Mrs. Johns' father the late Jack Vaughan, was a grandson of William Hattchett Vaughan, a native of Tennessee. Jack Vaughan, prior to his death last year, was the only descendant of the pioneer Vaughan family who owned any part of the original claim and estate near Molalla. Provisions of his will made his daughter. Mrs. Johns, the owner of his holdings, part of the original Vaughan land claim.

Mrs. Johns' farm is listed this year as the oldest in the entire group of Century Farms. Her farm was first settled in 1844, or 116 years ago. The "youngest" farm, owned by Raymond S. Kirk in Linn county, was settled in

As in past years, the Century Farm program will climax this year at a special program at the Oregon State fair. This will be held September 6 with Gov. Mark Hatfield slated to present the Century Farm parchment scrolls to the honored farmers, whose applications were certified by their respective county courts. Joining in this year's ceremony will be Century Farmers named in 1958 and 1959. A special luncheon honoring the Century Farmers at the state fair will be sponsored by the Oregon-Washington Farmers union, the Oregon State grange and the Oregon Farm Bureau federation.
