ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

James D. Buckley was a native of Ireland. He emigrated to Oregon from his native land in 1852. In 1854 he preempted a government homestead of 160 acres in Jackson County.

He was joined in marriage June 13, 1870 to Maggie Riley. She was the daughter of James and Mary (McGovern) Riley, both of whom were natives of Ireland. She emigrated to Oregon with her grandparents in 1869 making the journey down the Atlantic seaboard by way of Panama.

Mr. Buckley added to his original homestead until he was the owner of 350 acres.
