

Age Doesn't Slow Eugene Woman; She Manages Farm

Mrs. Amos Wilkins of Eugene, honored as the oldest "Oregon Farmer" Tuesday at the first an-

nual Century Farm Day at Oregon State Fair.

Mrs. Wilkins, small and modishly dressed, walked gaily up to Gov. Robert D. Holmes, who was shaking hands with the 351 century farmers who jurned oil, shook his hand, accepted her embossed certificate and sat down to talk over the 97 years with news folk.

She was born at Coburn near Eugene, on Sept 6, 1861. Her father, Mitchell Wilkins, who crossed the plains, coming from North Carolina via Missouri, by covered wagon, filled on a Land Donation Claim at Coburn in 1847. Of the original 640 acres in the claim, all but 33 are now intact. The 33 went for the new Oregon freeway, Mrs. Wilkins said.
