I further swear that upon his death the property was heired by his daughter, Caroline Attridge, and his half-brother, Robert Everson.

I further state upon oath, that my father, W. H. Ingram, who was a son of William Henry Ingram bought out the heirs, and lived on said property until his death, in 1927.

I further swear that upon the death of my father, William Henry Ingram, the property was divided equally between nine children. This property consisted of 320 acres at the time of his death.

I further state that I, Grace Gunderson, whose maiden name was Grace Ingram heired 80 acres of the original property, and at the present time own and manage said farm.

I further state that this property is located in Sec. 8 and 17 T. 13 S.R. 1 W, Linn County, and has been in the Ingram family continually for more than 100 years.
