Rice's father, and that James Norval Rice first settled on his Donation Land Claim, March 10, 1053, and that he died on February 26, 1909, and my husband, Clifford G. Rice, at the time of his father's death, heired a part of the original D.L.C. and that part being 160 acres, located in T. 14 S.R. 1 W., Sec. 23, consisting of two parcles tp-wit: 74.41 and 86.14 acres. This part of the old D.L.C. has remained in the family continually, since it was taken up by James Norval Rice in 1853.

I further state upon oath, that my husband, Clifford G. Rice died October 13, 1953, and at his death, I, Jennie M. Rice, heired said property, and at the present time I am and have been living on said property, continually, since his death, and I am operating said farm as an owner and manager.
