Living on a Century Farm has meant helping with the books, putting up her family's food supply for winter, and working with 4-H. It's also meant sharing skills with other homemakers, like the times she's demonstrated how to churn butter at OSU mini college.

Hazel-Jean's recipes are packed with down-on-the-farm goodness

It's a century farm — a 100-year-plus place farmed by members of the family and handed down from one generation to the next — and it's where Hazel-Jean Pugh has made her home for the past 34 years.

The farm — Pugh Century Dairy Farm — rests in the rich lands between Halsey and Shedd. Of the original 640 acres only 130 remain in the family. But that's enough pasturage to keep 140 milking cows content.

While some of the old buildings dot the farmland, Hazel-Jean and her husband live in a newer farmhouse on the property. Her in-laws still live in the old farmhouse. John Pugh and his son, John, work the place. The younger took over the dairying end about two years ago and Pugh hauls hay. Mrs. Pugh keeps books.

While the kids were growing up she not only kept books but worked the farm too, put up the family's food supplies for winter, worked as a volunteer and had time for her own pursuits. Today, she's still active in the Oregon Dairy Wives (she's state chairman of the organization), the Linn County Extension study program and other groups.

A former 4-H'er and 4-H leader, Mrs. Pugh has a long-time interest in cooking.
