## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Captain Frank Shedd, left Preemption Illinois, accompanied by his family, to make the long journey across the plains to

Oregon, on May 2, 1864.

After five months of weary travel he reached the Willamette Valley about the 1st of October, and located at Boston for the winter, this being the site of the Boston Roller Mills, erected in 1858, and now known as the Thompson Flouring Mills.

In Feb. of 1865 Capt. Shedd purchased the farm which was

the original land claim of Joseph Hite.

In 1871 Mr Shedd donated a strip of land sixty feet wide thru his farm for the right of way of what was then known as the Oregon and California Railroad. The land on which the original town of Shedd was built was donated by Mr. Shedd, and deed by him to Lawrence Higgins for this purpose on June 23, 1871. Mr Higgins laid out the town adjoining the Shedd farm, and dedicated it to the public on Oct. 30, 1871.

About this same time Mr Shedd replaced the older buildings with a two story fourteen room house and a very commodious barn.

These buildings are still standing and are being used.

An interesting anecdote of these early days was thisIn 1874 Capt Shedd was elected to the legislature and of course
was obliged to travel to and from the State Capitol. The railroad
passed thru his apple orchard, and many a time the train stopped
and the crew filled their sacks with apples, and were quite
welcome. It was not a one sided gesture however, for whenever
Grandfather Shedd wanted to take the train, he simply stood by
the gate, the train stopped and he went aboard, and upon returning
they allowed him to alight right in front of his house, and in a
matter of minutes he was again reunited with his family. That
is one convenience, which we, in this fast moving era, are not
priviled to enjoy.

In addition to farming Capt. Shedd operated a shop, in which he did repairing and blacksmithing, along with woodworking. Neighbors came from far and near his services. Much of his own furniture was turned out on a lathe in this shop, with one of his boys turning

the large wheel to operate the lathe.
