The farm was purchased by James Benton Jenks in the fall of 1866, after crossing the Oregon Trail.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

He arrived with four small children and six more children were born on this farm; 9 boys and one girl in all. All of the boys purchased farms in the Tangent area and farmed there all of their lives.

Enoch Jenks, our father, who was the youngest son of the family remained on the home place and farmed it all of his life. He passed away in November, 1969, at the age of 89.

The following is a quotation from the Jenks Centennial Book published in 1966 on the 100th anniversary of the family's arrival in Oregon.

"After a long, teresome trip beset with many dangers, the trip was at last completed. They landed, as was the usual expression, at the old Watson place, near the scene of the present Linn County Poor Farm, situated 3 to 4 miles southeast of Albany. The family was very tired and hungry and very much appreciated the kind hospitality of Mr. Watson, who plentifully supplied them with food and other things.

It now became apparent that a home must be selected. They were too late to take up homesteads. Some of the earlier homesteaders took up a section of land as was the case with Perry Knighten, anear neighbor bordering the farm on the south. The place selected was the original homestead of Charles Williams and wife, Lucy Ann Williams, located one-half to one mile south of the present town of Tangent. This homestead was taken up under Notification No. 2004, and was designated as Claim No. 52. The boundary was, and is in our possession. The part of this original homestead as described above was purchased from Jas. W. Savage and C. W. Savage, his wife, and comprised 139 acres. The price paid for this was \$1,000.00 and was bought December 26, 1866. This tract of land comprises the west part of the old home."

James Benton Jenks and his wife located on this farm in the late fall of 1866. They raised a family of nine sons and one daughter. All of the sons bought farms and located in the Tangent area. Enoch Jenks, the youngest son, remained on the original home farm.

Enoch has two sons, Marlowe and Melvin, who are in partnership on this farm. Enoch Jenks established a poultry hatchery in 1910 on this farm and started the original Jenks Hatchery. This hatchery is now the largest and oldest operating chicken hatchery in the Northwest and produces almost five million chicks annually.

Enoch Jenks is now 85 years of age and is still moderately active in the farm and poultry operation. State Department of Agriculture Oregon Historical Society
