Dear Rex:

My cousin, M. Maude Boone, advises me you are interested in learning of sheep ranches where wool was raised in pioneer days and which places are still held by the families. Mrs. Boone owns 35 acres of land southeast of Aumsville in the William Porter Donation Land Claim, which has always been in the family, she having acquired the property from her father, Henry C. Porter, and he having acquired it from his father (Mrs. Boone's grandfather), William Porter. The claim was taken up by William Porter in either 1848 or 1849 and Mrs. Boone has the diary of her grandfather wherein there is an entry made in 1860, whereof he speaks of his sheep and wool.

Also for Mrs. Boone, I am enclosing an application for century farm honors. It deals with the same piece of property above mentioned, which property is described on the application. While the patent was not issued until 1866, the land claim was actually taken up and occupied by William Porter in either 1848 or 1849. The Marion County Deed Records indicate that Mr. Porter bought an adjoining piece of land, in the Zebuzaradan Coffey Donation Land Claim, in 1855, the deed having been recorded on March 3rd that year, Book 1, Page 114, Deed Records for Marion County.
