## State Fair to Honor 44 on Tuesday as Owners of Century Farms

SALEM, Sept. 7.-The cornerstone of Oregon industry -agriculture, will come in for extra Centennial honors Tuesday at the state fair.

Forty-four more presentday owners of farms continuously productive for a century or more will receive parchment certificates attesting to their uniqueness from Gov. Mark O. Hatfield.

The ceremony is the second successive year owners of 100-year-old Oregon farms have been so honored at the state fair. Tuesday's 44 honorees will bring to 398 the number of the birthday state's Century farms.

**ORIGINATED** last year by the Oregon Historical society and state department of agriculture, Century farm recognition goes only to present farm owners who are descendants of those who established farms that have been in continuous production 100 years or more.

Far from being a simple stunt, the Century farm program is contributing greatly to both Oregon lore and modern agriculture. Since its beginning, state historians have
