ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The barn on this farm, which is still in use, was put together with wooden pegs, and the sheeting has square nails in it. The shop is one of the original buildings erected on this farm. There are a few sections of rail fence still standing.

This farm has been in the Miller family since 1863 and it has always been operated by one of the members. The generations of this family have always tried to keep the spirit of progress that Simon Miller started over one hundred years ago.

Conrad Miller, a brother of Simon Miller, settled near Union in 1861 and is credited with planting the first fruit trees in Union County.

The history of Simon Miller, Simon Edward Miller and the story of Conrad Miller are all published in the History of Union and Wallowa, a book published in 1902.

It is interesting to note that Mrs. Rodney Miller is a granddaughter of George and Catherine Gekeler, who came to Union County and settled near LaGrande with the Yount Train in 1862.

Simon Miller

Simon Miller was born in Switzerland and came to America in his youth and soon afterward to Oregon, living for a time in the western portion, then came to the eastern portion in 1863. He settled on the farm which is now owned by Rodney Edward Miller and his wife Alma Miller. Simon Miller married Juliet Ann Galloway on August 8, 1858. Mrs. Miller was born in Indiana and came with her parents to this coast in 1834, settling in Columbia county, Oregon. Mrs. Miller passed away in 1885 and Mr. Miller in 1887.

Simon Edward Miller

Simon Edward Miller was born in Union, Oregon on September 26, 1876. At the age of seventeen he started raising stock and doing general farming. In 1899 he purchased 180 acres of land near Union, which was a portion of his father's estate. He and his wife operated this land until ill health forced him to turn over some of his holdings to his sons. At this time, his son Rodney was deeded 80 acres on which the buildings were situated and upon the death of his parents, he was willed the other 80 acres.

Rodney Edward Miller

Rodney Edward Miller was born in Union, Oregon on May 20, 1914. He was associated with his father in ranching all his life, except the years he was a member of the armed forces. He and his family moved to the original farm in 1947 and they are still residing there. His two daughters make up the fourth generation of Millers which have lived on this farm.
