# Descendants Still Farming Land Claim

Editor's Note — This is the second in a series of articles on Century Farms in Yambill county.

d WEBFOOT — A century sounds like a long time, but as I sat with at Mr. and Mrs. Russell May in their et lovely, modern home while she recalled watching her grandmother ad weave and spin, somehow it didn't seem so long ago.

Mrs. May was among the century farmers honored this fall at the state fair. Her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Abram Coovert, armived in the Willamette valley by wagon train in the fall of 1851. The group wintered at Peach Tree hill, near Salem, and in the spring of 1852, Mr. Coovert established his home here. Mrs. May's mother Ida Coovert Harris, was born in 1858 and remained on the home place until live genth in 1908.
