Mistory B. M. Robinson and Elizabeth Chrisman came to Oregon by wagon train in 1844 were married April 22, 1845 and immediately settled on this land building a log cabin home, lived on property all of their lives, had two daughter one being Eliza Robinson Stilwell who had five children one of whom is Ina Stilwell Taggart. B.M. Robinson died testate April 12, 1902 (Yamhill probate file No.957) devising this property to his granddaughter Ina Stilwell (Taggart) who remains the owner of the property. Devise was"fee conditional at common law" that is:" unto her and the heirs of her body forever" which condition was fullfilled upon birth of her son, Max Stilwell Taggart, who also resides at Ontario, Oregon. Further explanation: Following death of B. M. Robinson in 1902 this property was farmed by other members of the family until 1950. The most recent was J. B. Stilwell Jr, also a grandchild of B. M. Robinson. Upon he retirement of J. B. Stilwell Jr. in 1950 a neighbor was engaged to farm the property under a verbal year-to-year arrangement on share crop basis which agrangement continues to this time. It covers only the 70 acres of farm land. The planting, growing, harvesting and selling of the crops is subject at all times to the approval of Ina Stilwell Taggart and the man who does the farm work, jointly between them.

The remaining 30 acres of farm timber tract has at all times been in the possession and under immediate control of Ina Stilwell Taggart. In 1955 she sold \$1,60.80 in standing timber and in 1956 she sold \$3,699.76 in standing timber which she personally caused to be cut and delivered to the Yamhill Lumber Company, purchaser.



A Malheur Countian has finally qualified in Oregon's century farm program. Mrs. Ina Stilwell Taggart. Ontario, is the owner of 100 acres of farm land in Yamhill County which came into the possession of her grandfather in 1845.

1845. According to Ontario attor-ney Max Taggart. Mrs. Tag-gart's son, Benjamin M. Robin-son and Elizabeth Chrisman Robinson came to Oregon in 1844 and settled on the Yamhill County land the following year. There has been only one trans-fer of record, Taggart explain-ed, and that was from 'Robinson to his granddaughter, Mrs. Tag-gart.
