 19. Thence E. 4000 chains; thence South 2000 ft. thence N.
 4000 ft. thence N. 3000 chains to the place of beginning contain
 ing 320.00 acres more or less. To have & to hold the same
 to the said party of the second part his heirs & assigns
 forever & all the appurtenances & every interest therein

Farm in family for 100 years

"Yes, I've lived in Yamhill County most of my life except for seven years in eastern Oregon," Mrs. Alice Burdett told reporters Thursday morning in her room at the Careousel Convalescent Center. Mrs. Burdett will be 90 years old in February. "I was a Leap Year baby and I'm very proud of that," she chuckled.

But the main reason for reporters to be on hand was the arrival of State Agricultural Director Irvin Mann, who presented Mrs. Burdett with a handsome certificate acknowledging that the family farm, with Mrs. Burdett as the sole heir, is a Century Farm, an honor reserved for farms

owned by the same family for 100 years at least.

The farm, now only about 80 acres, was first settled by her grandfather, Jonathan Stout, in 1864 and later was inherited by her father, Frank Stout. Her grandfather came to Oregon from Ohio in a wagon train and arrived in Portland in the spring of 1852.

"The house, a fine old antique building, burned down," Mrs. Burdett explained. "There are no buildings on the land at present but it is being farmed. A county road completely encircles the property which makes it very valuable."

Mrs. Burdett has never lived on this particular piece of property, but on a farm nearby. She now makes her

home in an attractive room at the Convalescent Center and has her own phone for conversations with friends and family. Very alert, with a good memory, the handsome woman recalls things from years gone by with apparent ease.

She has two sons, James Burdett of Hillsboro and Dan Burdett of Trout Lake, Wash. She also has seven grandchildren and enjoys a grandmotherly pride in their lives. "All these pictures you see around the room are of my family," she told us proudly.

Accepting the Century Farm Certificate from Director Mann, Mrs. Burdett said firmly, "This is a real honor."
