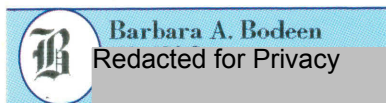
Dear Ron,

I started reading these papers this morning and found the proof of:
Darling (DARLING) Smith purchased his first property in Yamhill (and Washington) Counties 18 February 1859.

I knew that he had moved his family to Yamhill County 1859-1860. He built a new log house and moved his family into it. Also Darling raised timothy and clover seed to sell, as well as hogs. This above is all part of the story of their lives that my grandfather Pleasant had told to my mother when she had married my father.

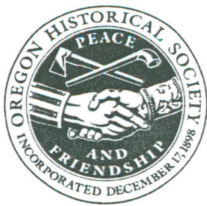
