THIS INDENTURE, WITNESSETH that A. Chenal and his wife Josephine Chenal for the consideration of the sum of seven hundred and DOLLARS, to her paid, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey unto Mrs. Elisabeth Bauman the following described premises, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the south boundary of the M. Kay D. & S. Co. No. forty three & 8 in section 1 S. 5 south R. 1 West 26. 25' chains from the S. E. corner of said claim & 8 there west along said boundary 37. 75' chains, thence north 13. 50' chains to the division line between the north and south halves of said <sup>div. line</sup> division line <sup>there east along said</sup> 12. 90' chains, thence south 7. 50' chains, thence east 24. 48' chains, thence south 16' chains to the place of beginning. and containing sixty nine 69 acres more or less.

The conveyance is made subject to a certain mortgage held by Elisabeth Bauman the amount is seven hundred dollars the said Elisabeth Bauman to pay said mortgage and deduct said amount as paid from the above consideration of \$ 700.00

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises with their appurtenances unto the said Elisabeth Bauman her heirs and assigns, forever. And the said

A. Chenal do hereby covenant to and with the said Elisabeth Bauman her heirs and assigns, that he <sup>is</sup> the owner in fee simple of said premises; that they are free from all incumbrances and that he will warrant and defend the same from all lawful claims whatsoever.

*On December 24, 1895, Elizabeth Bauman purchased 69 acres of land on the John McKay Donation Land Claim from C. & Josephine Cheval. The farm was then handed down to Elizabeth's son Stephen Bauman in November 1905. It has been operated since 1943 by Stephen's son Clyde Cornelius Bauman. Today, two of Clyde's sons; Thomas Clyde Bauman and Richard Harold Bauman, along with Clyde continue to operate the farm.*

*In 1995 the farm has grown to include over 240 acres owned by the farm with another 100 or so acres being rented and farmed by the family. Some of the crops grown by the farm in 1995 include:*

- *Berries (Evergreens, Logans, Raspberries, Marions, Boysens, Gooseberries, Aurora, Tayberries, Waldos, Sylvans, Currants, Blackcaps, Kotatas, & Strawberries)*
- *Orchards (Filberts, Walnuts, Chestnuts, Apples, Peaches, Plums, Nectarines, Prune, Pears, & Cherries)*
- *Seed Crops (Onions, Swiss Chard, Radish, Cabbage, Burdock, Squash & Parsnips)*
- *Hogs, Chickens, & Ducks*
- *Wheat, Oats, & Buckwheat*

*In Addition to the above the farm also owns and operates a small fruit stand located at Richard's farm on Howell Prairie Road in Gervais, Oregon. The farm grows many of the small fruits, and vegetables to stock the stand, these include; kiwi, peas, beans, corn, cucumbers, dill, potatoes, peppers, lettuce, kohlrabi, cauliflower, cabbage, broccoli, tomatoes, carrots, beets, rhubarb, grapes, honey, ornamental pumpkins, and flowers.*

The number of quarts of canned food you can get from a given quantity of fresh produce depends upon the quality, variety, maturity and size of the produce... whether it is canned whole, in halves or in slices... and whether it is packed raw or hot.

Carrots	2 to 3
Cherries	2 to 2-1/2
Corn	9 to 12 ears
Cucumbers	2-1/2 to 3
Peaches	2 to 3
Pears	2 to 3
Peas, green (in pods)	3 to 6
Plums, prunes	1-1/2 to 2-1/2
Pumpkin	1-1/2 to 3
Squash, summer	2 to 4

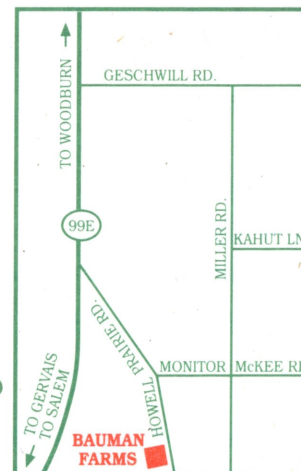
