Early history of Mumm Ranch , homesteaded in 1879.

Jurgen Mumm homesteaded in 1879 according to family history. We hold a deed of 1884 at which time he proved up on this homestead. (See attached.) Mumm, age 29, was an immigrant from Jevenstedt, in Schleswig-Holstein, on the Danish-German borderlands. He was one of the first of several young men and families who immigrated from this German village to pioneer in north Umatilla County and shared a claim shack with neighbor, Hans Struve, on the original homestead grounds. In 1884 he returned to Jevenstedt for his betrothed, Katharina Nickols. Together they developed a farm-site complete with house, barn, numerous other out-buildings as well as an orchard on additionally acquired ground. (See picture attached.) The locale, on the rolling bunch grass plain north of Pendleton, is still sparsely settled and devoted to dryland wheat growing. It is situated in the headwaters of Despain Gulch, whose channel lays 3/4 mile to the south. The old main road, north out of Pendleton, is nearby but the farmstead is 3/4 mile from the Holdman Highway (now #37, north).

In 1895 the original barn and large wagon shed burned to the ground and, along with them, that season's hay crop. (See picture of original barn as well as farm house.) A new barn was built the same year (1895) and is used and maintained today. (Also pictured).

One of the first on-farm grain elevators was built in 1916 and is still standing, although no longer used for grain storage.

The farm is currently owned and operated by a granddaughter descendant of Jurgen Mumm (Jean Milne Westersund) and, in addition, is the homesite of a grandson, Robert Jurgen Mumm, whose home is on the site of the original farm house. Other descendants own portions of ground acquired subsequent to the original homestead. (A plot plan is attached.)

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Jurgen Mumm
and to his heirs, the said Tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Jurgen Mumm and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

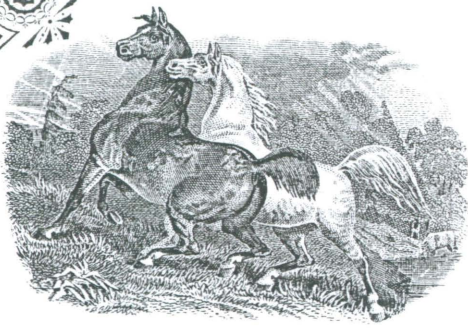

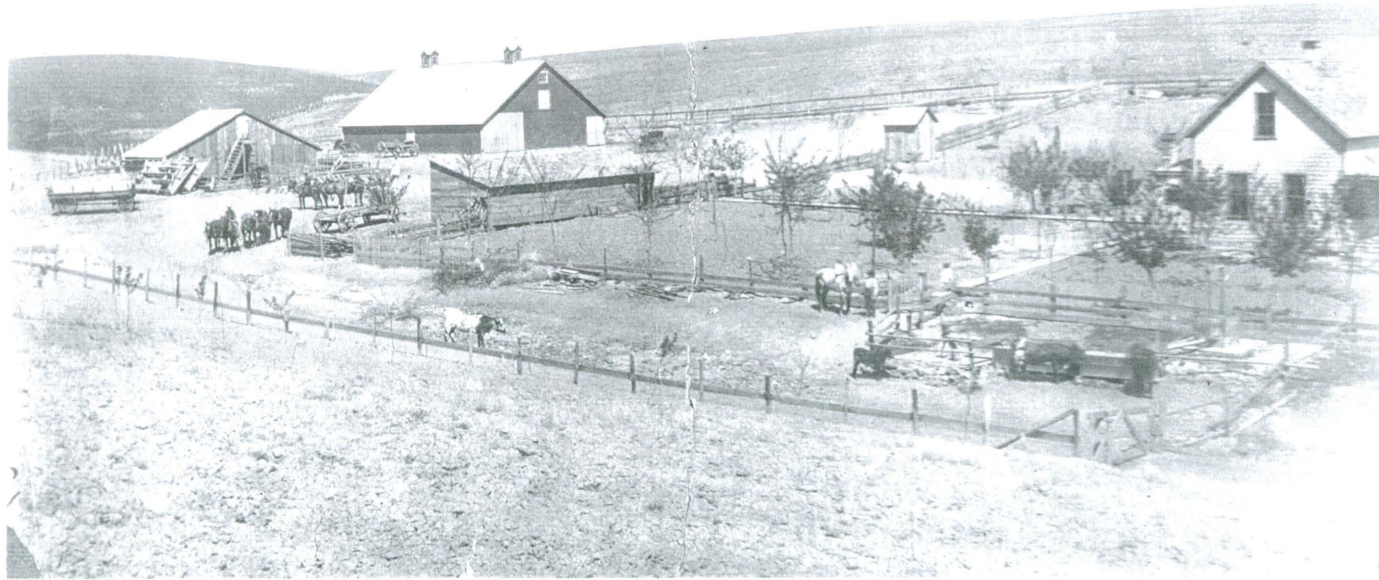

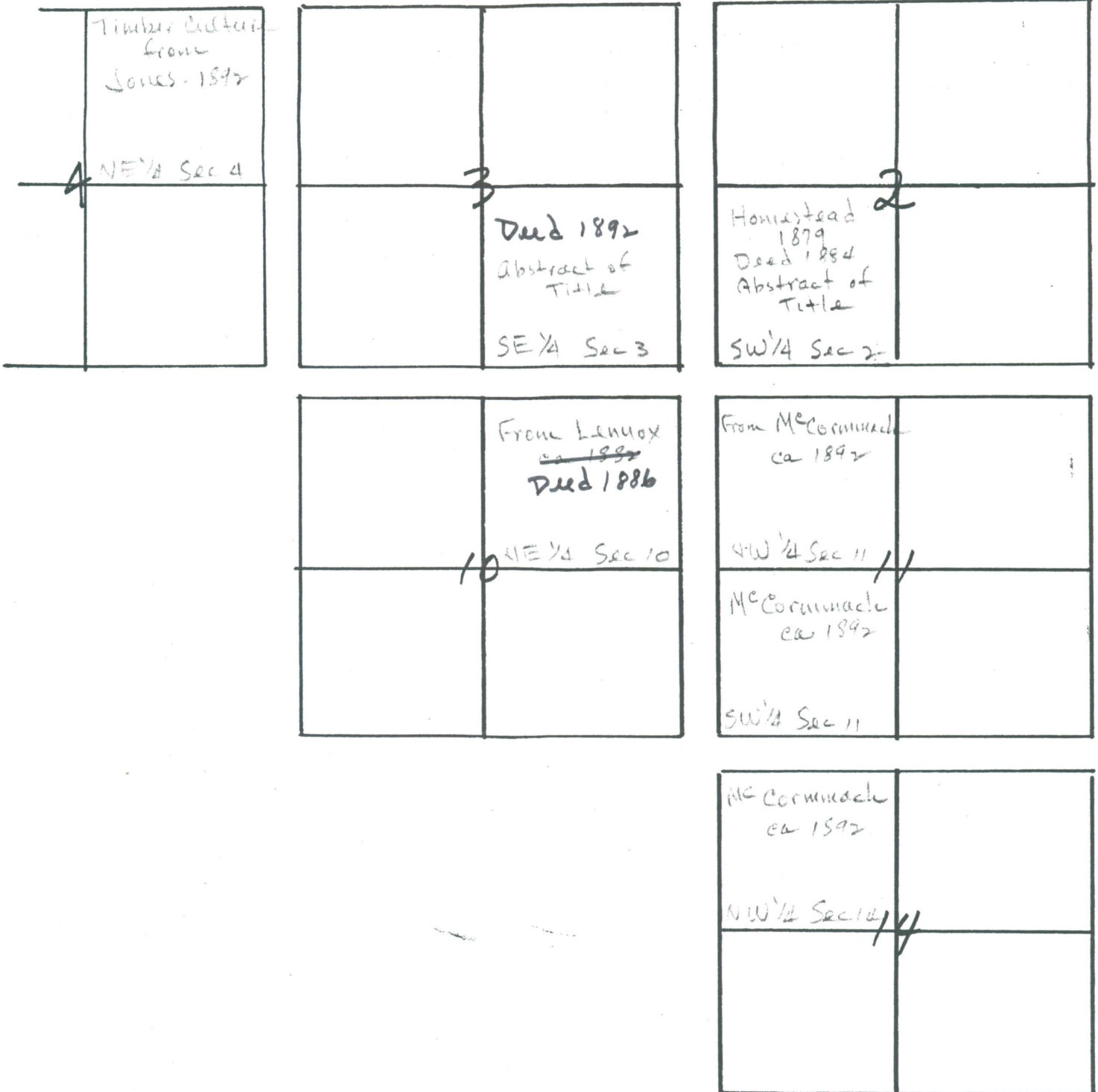


1895 - "new" barn still in use
