Some History about the Farm being handed down 3 generations,

This is part of an article that was written in the "Dine Mountain Legacies" book, which was published last year. (1998)

The Grange hall on Dine mountain, with a heartiful view of the valley. Joshua R. adkisson homesteaded 163.51 acres on October 17, 1890. He + his wife M. J. adkisson sold this section of property to George B. Zimmerman on March 9, 1895. (The family was told the land was traded for a good team of horses.)

Samuel C. Sinder chomesteaded 164.11 acres about a year later, and that acreage was acquired by John P. Joos. In January 1903, George B. Zimmerman bought it, and together these 2 parcels made up the Zimmerman farm.

Genteville, Oregon. He married mary ann Jose in 1897 and they had 6 children, most of them form on the place. Their earlier years were spent on the farm where they planted a large orachard, some of which still exists.

About 1920 They gave up farming + moved to the Dhatcher Community, but continued to care for the farm. In 1927 Their son George M. married and took oner the farm. after 5 years + 2 children later, they moved to the valley near Hilshoro and continued to receive thay, bernies + timber on Dixie mt.

Then son George H. took care of the cattle & farm for years. In 1971 George H., his wife many and children built a new home on the farm + still line there. Then son Dan raises christmas trees now on the property known as Windy acres Tree Farm and hopes his son will one day be interested in continuing farming, would be the 5th generation.
