I am faxing two copies of deeds, one dated 1878 conveying 40 acres to Edwin Crook, our great grandfather's brother, and one dated 1879 having Edwin selling 320 acres to my Great grandfather, Ace Crook. I know there are earlier deeds when Edwin purchased the property but the 1878 deed is the only one I can find at this time. Edward Crook was Edwin Crook's twin brother. A deed made out to him in Jan. 1879 was made out in error as Edwin was called Ed and somehow the state fouled up. It was later corrected to be in the name of Edwin Crook. Therefore I should have put Edwin's name instead of Edwards on the application.

Congratulations on receiving this prestigious honor for the <u>Edwin Crook Farm</u>, founded in 1879. A total of 23 farm and ranch owners submitted applications this year and *all* of them met the requirements for Century Farm status. This brings our grand total of Oregon Century Farms to 921 (recognized since 1958 when the program started).

Now that all 1998 applications have been reviewed, we can begin the process of creating the award certificates. These special documents, signed by Gov. Kitzhaber and dignitaries from the Oregon Historical Society, will be available in the late summer or fall.

To recognize your family's accomplishment, it's customary that the certificate be presented in a meaningful way. If you already have an event in mind—such as a special family reunion—please share that information with me so I can have your Century Farm certificate ready by that date (and attend if you wish).
