Burial at Hereford, Oregon on the hill over looking his homestead. The cemetery is maintained by the family.

Cause of John's death: flu-influenza

At the time of John Trimble's death the farm-ranch was inherited by his son, James Trimble. At the time of James's death the family farm-ranch was passed on to his wife, Lena Trimble and his three children, Elsie, Alfred and Arthur. Arthur and his wife Elaine purchased his mother's and his brothers and sister's share in the farm left to them by their father, James. Since that time the farm-ranch has been under his ownership and management. Currently Arthur and Elaine are semi-retired with son-in-law and daughter Allen and Bev Duby managing the coveted family farm.

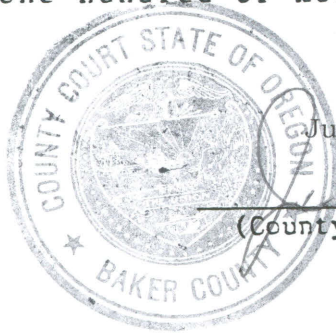

## THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

CERTIFICATE

No. 994

Whereas John Trimble of Baker County, Oregon

had deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Grande, Oregon, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Trimble

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the north half of the south half of section twenty six, in township thirty eight east of Willamette Meridian, in Oregon, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said John Trimble

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Trimble

and to his heirs, the said Tract also described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said John Trimble

and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and reserved water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietors of a vein to mine and to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof

I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the City of Washington, the tenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty four, and of the Independence of the United States the hundred and eighth.
