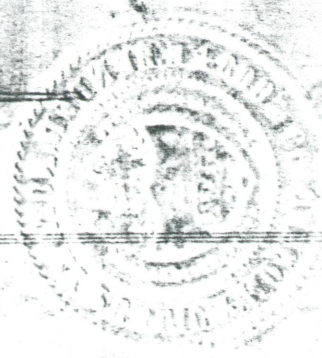



Gentlemen:

James D. Hayes purchased the Robert Y. Phillips donation land claim in 1889, Township 30, Range 12, Section 26 and 27, located in Coos County.

James used water from the South Fork of the Coquille River, starting in 1889, for domestic and agricultural purposes. The Coquille River also supplied him with water for the water wheel at a sawmill which sawed lumber for the farm buildings.

His youngest son, Kermit, operated the farm for 54 years after his father's death in 1928. Kermit's son, Gordon, is now operating the farm since Kermit's death in 1982.

I, Juanita Hayes Bartlett, daughter of James D. Hayes, being first duly sworn, know the contents thereof, and that the same is true.
