Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Roaring Oregon, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved May 20th 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain", and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of James G. Walker has been established and

deed, consummated in conformity to law for the West half of the South west quarter and the South west quarter of the North west quarter of Section seventeen, and the South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section eighteen in Township thirty-eight South of Range fourteen West of Willamette Meridian in Oregon containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the Said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now Know YE, That there is therefore, granted by the United States unto the said James G. 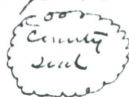

Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register
of the Land Office at Roseburg Oregon whereby it
appears that full payment has been made by the said
James G. Walker according to the provisions of the
Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An
Act making further provisions for the Sale of the Public Lands
and the acts supplemental thereto for the last half, of the
South east quarter and the lots numbered three and
four of section eighteen, and the lot numbered two of
section nineteen in Township thirty eight, south of range
fourteen west of Willamette Meridian, in Oregon, containing
one hundred and seventy eight acres and twenty two hundredths
of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the
said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the
Surveyor General which said Tract has been purchased by
the said James G. Walker,

And Whereas, That the said United States of America
