## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Alston Martindale was born February 28, 1829 in Switzerland County in Indiana; married Nancy Katherine Fitzhugh on September 1, 1855. He came to Oregon via the plains in 1850 and took up a Donation Land Claim in Camas Valley.

Nancy had one daughter, Austria (Aussie) Shambrook by a former marriage. Children of Alston were: Ella Mira, Tulla Ann, Henry, Robert Lee, William Alston, Nettie Jane, Nancy Violet, James Dickey, and Rolla (Pete).

Alston gave his log cabin to be the first school house in the Valley. He later donated land to the school district, and he set aside an acre to be a cemetery. When he moved from the cabin he built a stockade about one hundred feet square where the people of the community gathered during Indian attacks. Some of the Martindale children were born in this fort.

The Alston Martindales kept the stage station at their home for many years, and Alston was the postmaster for the Valley from June 12, 1879 to December 3, 1898.
