ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

John B. Ferguson, great-grandfather of Burke Lane McFadden, Jr. was born in Richland County, Ohio on June 29th, 1925. He moved to Lane County, Oregon in Sept. 1848 and drove the first wagon team up the Long Tom Creek. In 1875 he and great-grandmother, Elizabeth C. Ferguson, purchased the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of Sec.36 T.15 S., Range 6W of the Willamette Meridian in Lane County, Oregon, containing 320 acres, for the purchase price of \$1416.38. He sold the land to their son-in-law and daughter, Joel A. Pitney and Mary Ann Ferguson, Pitney for the like amount. Upon the death of their mother and father it was inherited by the daughters, Myrta Pitney McFadden and Inus Pitney, Flanigan. Myrta McFadden purchased the inherited rights of ownership and at 89 resides with her son, Burke Lane McFadden, Jr., the present owner on $\frac{1}{2}$ of the original ranch. The other half having been deeded to his sister.
