ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Our farm was established by a very progressive 1976 style woman. Margaret Letham Radir came from Pittsburgh, Pa. looking for new farmland. in 1875. She selected and purchased approximately 350 acres two miles southeast of Corvallis, Oregon.

Her husband, Adam, son, William T. and daughters, Mary A., Sarah E. and Permillia E. came west after the purchase of the farmland. The family built a very substantial home, barn and grainary; all of which are in continuous use. The Radir's grew wheat, oats and barley on their new farm.

After the death of Margaret and Adam Radir, the farm was divided among the children. Permillia (Millie) Smith, the youngest daughter, purchased her brother's and sister, Sarah Whitemore's shares. Mary Graham kept her share of the farm.

The Smith part of the farm now consisted of 220 acres. Millie's only child, Richard L. was born in the house. She and her son raised grain and introduced cattle to the farm. After Dick's marriage to Mae Z., the young couple lived in the old house and Millie moved to another farm she had purchased. Dick and Mae raised grain and turkeys. They had two sons, Clarence Z. and Merle R. Smith. Merle was also born in the house. The same bedroom saw two births and at least one death.

Dick's health forced him into retirement in 1946 and Merle and his wife, Lorraine D. and children, Steven M. and Judy A. moved into the farmhouse. They have raised registered Hereford cattle, alfalfa and grain.

After Dick's death, the farm was again divided between the sons, Clarence and Merle Smith, each having a farm of 110 acres.

Four generations of descendants of the Radir family have resided in the same house and made their living from the same farmland. We hope soon the fifth generation, Steven M. Smith and his wife, Kay H. will follow in the footsteps of his forebears.

The house is listed in "Oregon for the Curious" on page 103, as a home to note as one is traveling south on Peoria Road.
