Sixty-six Oregon farms owned operated continuously by the s family for a century or more 1 been added to the state's "Cent Farm" list this year.

The addition to the "Cent Farm" list of these new farms bri to 630 the number of Oregon fa certified as "Century Farms" si the program was started in 1958 the Oregon Historical Society and Oregon Department of Agricultury Among those added to the list the 33 acre farm of Homer (Archie) Dowell, located at Route Box 395, Marion Road, Jefferson

The farm, originally 62 acres, settled by Dowell's grandfather, A ley West in 1876. West had came the Willamette Valley directly fi Kent, England. and his wife, An was also a native of England. A West died in 1914, and Ashley W in 1928. Both are buried in the J erson Cemetery.

The Wests had five children, raised on the Marion Road farm the present house which was build 1891. Among the five children Alice West, who, as a young wom married William Dowell. Homer their only child and the family mo onto the farm when he was abou years old and still lives there r with his wife, Hazel.

William Dowell died in 1919 an ice West Dowell passed away in 19 They too are buried in the Jeffer Cemetery.

Homer Dowell is the 3rd generat to reside on the farm which was one time a part of the Bates Donat Land Claim.

Dowell is uncertain but he belie that the barn on the farm could po bly be one of the original buildin
