Franklin & Powell on March 25, 1974 purchashed the South half of the Benjamin Whiteaker Donation land Claim no. 15 not. no 2272

He lived on the place and farmed it. During his later years in pardnership with his son Jay Powell after he retired Jay Powell farmed it until it was divided up in 1908. Jay Powell continued to farm part of the place.

My father Perry O Powell started farming his part in 1908 and moved on it in 1911. He farmed it until 1930. Part of the time in partnership with his son Frank B Powell raising Jersey Cows. In 1930 he sold it to Frank B Powell, Wilmer D Powell and Perry N Powell.

at different times we purchased other parts of the origanal farm. 200 acres more or less is now owned by Frank B Powell and Wilmer D Powell. Frank B Powell has retired. I am now farming it.

The place when my Grandfather bought it had Oak trus on it part of it. Some of it was cleared by the family. Part of it by Chinese who camped on the place, grubing : trus by hand.
