Received of Louis Muller the sum of Four Dollars cents being the balance of payment required by law for the timber-culture entry of the NE<sup>4</sup> of section 30 in township 5 N of range 33 E W M meridian containing 160.75 acres under the act of March 3, 1873 and March 13, 1874 and the act of June 14, 1878 amendatory thereof entitled "an act to amend the act entitled 'an act to encourage the growth of timber to the western prairies'".

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting  
wheras there has been deposited in the general land office  
of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land  
Office at La Grand Oregon whereby it appears that pursu-  
-ant to the acts of Congress approved March 3. 1873 March  
13. 1874 and June 14. 1875. To encourage the growth of timber  
on the Western Prairies the claim of Louis Muller has  
been established and duly consummated in conformity  
to law for the north east quarter of section thirty in  
Township five north of Range thirty three East of  
Willamette Meridian in Oregon containing one hun-  
-dred and sixty acres

according to the official plat of the survey of the  
said land, returned to the General Land Office by the  
Surveyor, General:

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the  
United States unto the said Louis Muller the tract  
of land above described: To have and to hold the said  
tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the  
said Louis Muller and to his heirs and assigns  
forever: subject to any vested and accrued water  
rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing  
or other purposes and rights to ditches and reservoirs  
used in connection with such water rights as may  
be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs  
laws, and decisions of Courts and also subject to  
the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to  
extract and remove his ore therefrom should the  
same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises  
hereby granted as provided by law

In Testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the  
United States of America have caused these letters to be  
made patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be  
hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of  
Washington the twenty third day of March in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety two<sup>nd</sup> of the Independence  
of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth.
