Johan Enbusk 1819- - 1902

Johan Enbusk was born in Finland on 15 September 1819. Both Johan and his brother Karl came from lower Nidre Tornia, Finland to Neiden, Norway. Reason they left Finland was that Russia was taking over that area and as soon as any young man reached the age of 18 years old they were taken into the Russian army. Many Finnish boys went to other countries, mainly Norway to escape going into the Russian Army. Karl settled in Bygoynes (Northern Norway) and Johan settled in Neiden, Norway.

Johan was married three times.

Peter's first wife was a daughter of Paul Kristian Ekhdal from Daden Kyela, was a preachers son, she came to Neiden 1830-1840.

Johan died 17 June 1902 in Neiden Norway and was buried in Neiden Cemetery.

#### PETER KRISTIAN ENBUSK 18Aug1853-25July1930

Peter was born in Neiden, Norway. He left Neiden and went to Hemmerfest and raised raindeer. Jakala, Peter's brother went to Hammerfest later to help Peter. The reason Peter left home was that he did not like his step-mother. Feter had heard of the great opportunities available in America. He built up his heard of raindeer and raised enough money to come to America. Do not know if Jakala came to America at the same time or later. Peter immigrated to the United States in 1871, probably through customs at Ellis-Island. From there he went to Calumet, Michigan and worked in the Copper mines until 1877. He heard of good land available in Oregon through friends that had left Calumet earlier and went to Oregon. Peter evidently married in Michigan as dates of children indicate. His first three children were born in Calumet, Michigan and last five children were born near Adams, Oregon.

Peter did not like working in the mines as well as several of his friends. They (a group of six men) Matti Deinning, Sakri Hendricksen, Feter Enbusk, Matti Kononen, John Pakkala, Oli Hendricksen and their families left the Lake Superior area early in July 1877 and followed a route taken by others that had went to Oregon. Trip took around 25 days. Upon their arrival in the Fendleton area some homesteaded and others bought the places they wanted.

Peter engaged in farming near Adams, Oregon a place called "Greasewood".

As times went along Peter acquired more land around the area and also in Canada. He was one of the largest of all Finnish-American farmers at that time. He retired from active farming in 1919 and moved into Pendleton.

Teter was a capable business man, farmer, carpenter and a jack of all trades. He built a large show of which he had a forge that he used to sharren plow shears for himself and his neighbors. One year he was so 'very s'appening plow shears for his neighbors that he did not get his

his own wheat seeded. Along came a cold spell and froze other farmer's grain that they had seeded. Peter was lucky and only had to seed once. Feter was always building things in his shop. He built a grain grinder that he used to grind grain with and he was very proud of the grinder and he enjoyed showing it off every chance he got. Peter loved to hunt and fish, but time was limited due to farming. He also enjoyed raising and racing Hamiltonian buggy horses. Sometime in the early 1900's Peter and his wife went to visit Finland and Norway, they were gone four months. It is said that when Feter arrived in the Gld Country, he was wearing a new wool suit and gold ear rings in each ear. Everyone thought he was a very wealthy man.

Feter was married three times.

When Johan and Karl went from Finland to Norway the name of Karsikko was changed to Enbusk, Reason being the King of Norway ruled that the Finnish families moving to Norway must change their names to typicial Porweigian names. Farsikko was changed to Enbusk, which was named after a shrub (ENEBUSH) from which the Enbusk name is derived. Anyone with the name of Enbusk ( with a N or M, U or Y) in Finland is related to us here in America. According to Cordon Enbusk's book" Origins-6000 years Ago, Half a World Away", 250 Enbusk families still living near forms of Fibland.

of the United States in Judge J. Ballary Circuit Courtof the State of Oregon for Umatille County. Peter's witnesses were: John Hermo and John Harala. Peter took oath prescribed by law, he was then admitted and adjudged to be a citizen of the United States of America. (Name of Peter C. Emsbsk- MIS-SFELLED- on oath according to copy in my possession. The hotary Fublic, State of Oregon, Umatila County, Frank Sailing, County Clerk certified that the foregoing letters of Citezenship of Peter C. Emsbsk were compared with the Original application and was a correct transcript and same appears of record on file at his office. he set his hand the 11th Day of April A.D. 1910. By Deruty R.T.Brown, Frank Sailing, clerk. (Note: Notary signed 2 days, 4 months, 27 years after Feter become a Naturalized Citizen).

I made a request for a Cory of the Declaration of Intent for Admission to Citizenshir on Peter to Immigration Service, Fortland, Oregon. IMS stated in their reply that is has only records created after 27 September 1906. Naturalization records prior to that time may be requested directly from the clerk of Court in which person was Naturalized.

A request was made and a search made in the Umatilla County Court House records for the Declaration of Intent, none was found. The Declaration of intent was a requirement 2 yrs prior to taking the oath. Therefore; we can only assume that the clerk made a mistake in the spelling of the name when he typed Peter's name to the oath of Admission to Citzenship. Surely, Peter knew how to spell and write his name on the Declaration of Intent. Peter went by the name of FETER C. ENBYSK.

A letter has been written to National Archine of Norway for his Immigration dates in order that a search of records in U.S. Immigration can be made on Peters name and family.

search of records in Umatilla Court House did turn up a Declaration of Intent on Feter Enbysk's brother Jacob Enbusk. Jacob's Declaration of Intent to become a IS Citizen was taken in Umatilla County, State of Oregon on 14 October 1884. Information received in the future will predate this

Now on this day came into open Court Feter C.Emsbsk, and makes application to be admitted a Citizen of the United States, and it appearing to the Court that said applicant declared his intention to become a citizen of the Untied States more than two years prior to this date. And it further appearing to the Court by the testimony of John Hermo and John Harala both citizens of the United States, and both of good moral character, that said applicant is a man of good moral character, and attached to the principals upon which the Government of the United States is founded, that he well disposed to the peace and good order of the same; and that he has resided in the United States more than five years prior to this date.

And the said applicant in open Court having taken the oath prescribed by law, he was thereupon admitted and adjudged to be a citizen of the United States of America.

JAMES WALTER ENBYSK

Peter C. Enbysk was a member of the "Wild Horse Rangers", Company B, 3d Regt of the Oregon Volunteer State Militia of Umatilla County and the State of Oregon. The group was organized on 2l December 1878. The Company was organized shortly after the Bannock-Paiute Indian War, which saw several volunteer Militia units temporarily organized in N.E. Oregon during July and August 1878.

Attached is a copy of the Muster Roll which the orginal is located in the Oregon State Archives Military Collection, container 89A-12-126, Folder 46. The collection also contains a copy of the minutes of this company covering a

period of several months.
