Witnesseth that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Five thousand Dollars to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has and by these presents does hereby grant bargain sell, and convey unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns the following, described real estate situated in Union County State of Oregon to wit commencing at

the south east corner of sec 17 in T 2 S of R 39 E thence running North two hundred and thirteen $2\frac{1}{3}$ rods Thence West two hundred and forty (240) rods. Thence south two hundred and thirteen $2\frac{1}{3}$ rods. Thence East two hundred and forty (240) rods to the place of beginning and containing Three hundred and twenty acres. 
The Case family obtained century farm status several years.
