## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

My mothers maiden name was Nettie Jurgens. My grandfather and his two brothers came west. \*\*Mé/btbét\*/\* after settleing in Michigan.\*\*
The brothers settled in California and my grandfather joined the army and served in the northwest. He was discharged at Fort Vancover, his discharge in the last few years has didappeared. The army records were sent to Washington, except a record of the dead. He married a Bohemian girl at the age of 33, the girl was 18, they couldn't speak the same language, but raised 9 Children.

I'm proud to say at one time i owned a large part of the family farm. The original farm, had three acres cleard and a good log house. Fir trees grew so thick the sun couldn't shine through. They got 125 cords of wood to the acre which was valueless. They fell the trees by boring with an auger near the base of the tree straight in, then another hole at an angle meeting. Hot coals were put in and started with bellows. Another way was to char pit them which I have done all my lide. The great storm in 1980 lift logs all to the north still are visable. Regardless of what you hear, the Indians buried their dead. Two places were found by early settlers, one was plowed up by Bill Moore, in the city of Tualatin and artifacs were found by the thousands. I have arro w heads from three or four civilazations.
