# THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No. 387

APPLICATION 1133

### Whereas

There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Oregon City, Oregon, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of George Harris has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South half of the North West quarter and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section twenty four, in Township two North, of Range two West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Oregon City, Oregon, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and ninety nine hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said George Harris the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George Harris and to his

heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twelfth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four, and of the Independence of the United States the ninety eighth.
