This Document shows Homestead in 1887 by my Grandfather Mathias Eischen. He actually had a contract of sale from the Rail Road in 1884, but for some reason he & Holtz chose to also file for the Rail Road thus challenging ownership.

Mathias Eischen made homestead entry of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 29, T. 1 S., R. 3 W., at Oregon City Oregon, on the 8th of Feb. 1887 and on the 4th of Feb. 1888, Ludwig Holtz made pre-emption entry of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the same section. On the 17th of November 1894, the Commissioner of the General Land Office, rendered a decision holding both of these entries for cancellation and both parties have appealed to the Department. In his decision the Commissioner finds from the records in his office that both of these tracts were included in the Indemnity withdrawal made in 1870, under the act of Congress of July 25, 1866, granting lands to aid in the construction of the Oregon and California Railroad ~~XXXXXX~~ on the 21 of June 1876, approved by the Department and patented to the said company on the 20 of February 1893, that both of said tracts were subject to such selection at the time the same was made, that both of said entries were inadvertently and erroneously allowed and ought to be canceled, and holds that since these tracts have been patented to the Railroad company he has nonjurisdiction over them. There is no error in the decision of the Commissioner and it is affirmed, and the entries will be canceled.

The papers in both cases are herewith returned.
