This Indenture Witnesseth that Joseph R. Mendenhall and for the consideration of the sum of Seventeen Hundred (\$1700.) (U.S.C.) Dollars to me paid have bargained and sold, (4) by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto John B. Nayworth the following described premises to wit commencing at the N.E. corner of Ingram land claim, running East Sixteen Rods, Thence North Eighty Rods, Thence West One Hundred and Sixty Rods, Thence South Eighty Rods, Thence East One Hundred and forty four (44) Rods to the place of beginning, containing in all Eighty acres more or less, in R. (11) N. T. (16) S. Sec One also in Sec two T. 16. S. R. (1) N. a piece of land described as follows, commencing thirty three Rods West of Sec. line running West, ^{with} said Ingrahams land claim, fifty two Rods and fourteen feet, Thence South Sixty Rods and Twelve feet, Thence East fifty two rods and fourteen feet, Thence North Sixty Six Rods and twelve feet, to the place of beginning containing Twenty Two acres more or less, all situated in the County of Union State of Oregon.
