The community was greatly shocked to hear of the death of Owen Keerins. He was sick only a few days and was taken to the Grant County hospital where he died, January 26th, of pneumonia, at the age of 85 years, four months and 13 days.

• "Uncle Owen" as he was known by his many friends was a kind and loving neighbor and will be sadly missed.
