Note 1: The person we contacted stated that the \$500. income would not be disqualifying since we have been farming it. This last year we raised four steer and sold them. This year we have four more steer, chickens, and pigs; and we are pasturing a horse. We have harvested apples and berries for several years but have given most of them away.

Rule 2: From 1940-44, my Dad (A.Kenneth Cloake) worked part of the time in the shipyards in Portland. He and my Mother (Marion Cloake) lived with her sister. Then he worked on road construction, and they lived in a camper at job sites. They still kept their household items in their Roseburg home and had it as their home address. Someone lived in the house at that time. I'm not sure if they were caretakers or paid rent.

DESCRIPTION:

The claim of Abraham Jones and his wife Elizabeth Jones of Douglas County, Oregon, Notification No 222 has been established to a donation of one half section or three hundred and twenty acres of land and that the same has been surveyed and designated according to the official plat of Survey of said land as returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General as the East half of the North West quarter, the East half of the South West quarter, the West half of the North East quarter and the fractional South East quarter (being) (the North East quarter of the South East quarter and Lots two and three) of Section fifteen in Township Twenty seven South of Range six West in the District of lands subject to sale at Roseburg, Oregon, containing three hundred and twenty three acres and forty six hundredths of an acres.

The following described premises towit: Beginning at a point 6.00 chains west of the quarter section corner between sections 15 & 22 Town 27 S., R. 6 West, being a point from which a black oak tree 8 inches in diameter bears N 70° E 13 links distant, thence West 14.00 chains; thence North 7.14 chains, thence East 14.00 chains, thence South 7.14 chains to the place of beginning, containing ten acres more or less.

Abraham and Elizabeth Jones homesteaded the property.

They came from Indiana in 1852 and settled here in 1853.

My Grandmother, Henrietta Jones, was born on the property in 1858. Her father gave her and her husband, Arthur Cloake, part of the property.

My father, Arthur Kenneth Cloake, was born here in 1900.

He took over management of the property in 1921. He was the 10th child of Arthur and Henrietta Cloake.

On his death in 1989, I (Marion J. Scheleen) inherited the property--it is approximately 40 acres now.

My son, Donald K. Scheleen, is managing the property now.

Jacob and Elizabeth migrated to Morgan Co., Ohio in 1812 after their marriage. Jacob was wealthy, operated Inns and Hotel in Indiana, a farmer, Republican, Methodist, of stocky build and a ruddy complexion. Jacob lost the site in one eye while whittling with a hawkbill knife. He operated a hotel in Roseburg. They migrated to Boone County, Indiana between 1833-34. Jacob was a pioneer in Ohio, Indiana, and Oregon. To Oregon in 1852.
