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

## Century Farm & Ranch Program Application of <u>Mary (Kraxberger) McKay</u>

Much of the information provided here is from The History and Genealogy of the Kraxberger Family by Verlyn Kraxberger et al.

The original homesteaders, Johann and Rosina Kraxberger, were from the Upper Austria region of the Austro-Hungarian Empire near the city of Linz. Born in 1833, after serving his obligatory enlistment in the Austrian Army, he turned to farming, owning a forty acre farm near the town of Wels.

Somehow, pamphlets advertising some of the desirable opportunities to be found in America appeared in their home, descriptions of different states, such as Kansas, Dakota, Missouri, California, and other places. Perhaps, most appealing of all, was the literature telling about receiving 160 acres of land just for the taking. This looked very good to the boys. Ferdinand and William got the American fever and visited their brothers at the gun factory in Steyr. After much discussion and planning, in May 1889, Franz, Carl, and Ferdinand arranged to take the long journey, even though they were of military age and subject to the draft. And it was especially dangerous for Carl to leave as he was on furlough. Nonetheless, they boarded the steamer "Main, North German Lloyd" on May 1. With success, they landed May 14, 7:00 A.M. in Baltimore.

They traveled to Stover, Missouri, remaining there until 1890. Since the State of Oregon was spending a lot of money to lure people to their beautiful state, Franz and Carl took the advice of Horace Greeley, who said, "Go west and grow up with the Country". Consequently, the boys continued the last leg of their journey to Portland, Oregon. They liked this country very much, for it reminded them a great deal of their old Austrian valleys and hills. The mild climate and evergreen forests only spurred them on, with greater resolve to make this their permanent home. During the summer of 1890, Franz, his wife Julia and their son Edmond, along with Carl and Ferdinand sought residence in north Portland's Peninsula area. This was accomplished through the influence and direction of a Pastor Dieterich, who later organized the Evangelical St. Johns congregation.

Later on in 1891, father (John) came to America to persuade the boys to return, but found each of them unwilling to leave. So he sent his wife instructions to sell the farm and to bring the rest of the family to America. She succeeded in selling their 40 acres in 1892, and with the children (Rosina, William, Marie, Adolph, John and Otto) bade farewell to the old country, which had for so many years been their home. They left Austria on the 16th day of May and arrived in Bremen, the place of embarkation. Leaving Bremen on May 25th on the steamer "Darmstadt", they arrived in New York on June 5th.

Two days later, on June 7th, they boarded the newly constructed Canadian Railroad and arrived six days later, June 13th, at 7:00 A.M. in the City of Portland. At last the family was united again and gave thanks to God for His protection during the past month's journey. But the joys of reunion were soon coupled with problems of finding a new home for the family. A solution was assured when father (John) met a man by the name of Henry Kummer. For it was he who offered 156 acres of land for sale. With a bit of good salesmanship on the part of Henry and a good share of shrewd buying on the part of father,

both came to eventual terms. And, in July 1892, the place was purchased for the sum of \$5000.00. By July 15th, preparations were made to move the family to their new home at Macksburg.

Since then, the original farmstead has been under continual agricultural cultivation with the majority of the acreage still under the control of the Kraxberger family, one hundred years later. This particular application covers 50.65 of the original 156 acres. Ownership of this land parcel is set forth below:

John (Johann) Kraxberger:	Ownership from 1892 to 1909
Adolph Kraxberger (his son):	Ownership from 1909 to 1949
Oscar Kraxberger (his son):	Ownership from 1949 to 1982
Mary McKay (his daughter):	Ownership from 1982 to 2001

Over the years, the agricultural aspects of this farm have varied. Cattle and livestock first graced the land. For many years, wheat and other grains were also grown. Then in the 1950's, Oscar Kraxberger began to raise turkeys, which became his main source of income for over 30 years. Next came years of growing onions, and then grass seed, which is still being farmed here today.

With this application, this makes the farm in question the third farm on S. Kraxberger Rd., to apply for Century Farm status. The other two being the Century Farms of Siegfried Kraxberger and Phil Kraxberger.










