The Smith Farm is located at Mt. Pleasant, near Scio, and Stayton, Oregon. It has fields extending up Mt. Pleasant. It has a beautiful setting, with view property encompassing the entire Jordan Valley.

A nice hike takes you down the hill to Bear Branch Creek, with pastureland and natural forest trees. My Dad and I used to enjoy fishing for crawdads on a hot summer's afternoon.

Our parents, Fred and Mabel Smith, worked hard and constantly on the farm to make a living for the family. They milked cows and sold milk and cream to the Mt. Angel Creamery. They raised chickens for eggs which we sold in exchange for groceries and other necessities. They raised oats and wheat which we harvested, threshed and ground into "chop" for our livestock.

Our Dad farmed with a team of horses for many years, and was one of the last in the neighborhood to acquire a tractor, a John Deere "A". For some extra cash, our Dad worked for a neighbor in his sawmill for 50 cents a day.

Our Dad also dug graves with pick and shovel at the Mt. Pleasant cemetery adjoining our property. He and Mother are buried there, as well as his parents Angeline and Ed, sister Edith, and also Mabel's parents, John and Anna Schultz.

Electricity did not come to Mt. Pleasant until about 1950, with electric lights in the house and barn instead of gas lanterns, and an electric range for Mother to bake her wonderful fragrant big loaves of bread, which we spread with the tasty home churned butter.

About 1960, our Dad built a large, sunny utility room onto the house where Mother had lots of room to do laundry and store her canned fruits and vegetables. They also acquired a roomy deep freeze. Until then we didn't have fresh meats, but had the wonderful canned beef, and smoked bacon, ham, and sausages.

As our parents neared retirement age, they raised beef cattle, and later, as Dad's health began to fail they raised sheep.

Our father Fred Smith passed away in 1980, and in 1986 our Mother rented out 19 acres for growth of Christmas trees. We continue to rent out acreage for Christmas trees which is a source of income.

Our Dad's father, Joseph Edward Smith, was born in Derby, England, in 1852. With his sister Catherine he came to America in 1874, and during the next several years, worked his way across the entire North American continent. He lived and worked for several years in Illinois, then moved west to Nebraska, to a town called Liberty. Here the 41-year-old bachelor met a young widow from Tennessee, Angeline Wright Johnson, and in 1893 they were married. Angeline had a daughter, Rose Mae, and soon two more daughters were born to the couple—Mary Ethel and Margaret.

Four years later they moved to Oregon, where they lived for a time in each of three communities: In the Roberts area of Salem, then near Stayton in what is now called Coon Hollow, and finally settling on a farm in Mount Pleasant. In 1905 they built the house where our father lived his entire life.

Two more girls, Dorothy and Maude, then their long awaited boy, Fred, arrived, as well as a daughter, Edith who died at an early age after ingesting matches. They built the farmhouse and moved in shortly before Fred was born.

Grandpa Ed died in 1927, shortly after his 75<sup>th</sup> birthday. He had spent a hot July day working in the hayfields, then that night he passed away in his sleep.

His son Fred married Mabel Schultz, who came from South Dakota as a teenager, on May 22, 1929, and they purchased the farm from Angeline. Two daughters were born to Fred and Mabel–Barbara Fay on November 19, 1930, and Carol Ann on May 31, 1938. Both daughters were born at home in the present farmhouse.

Mabel and Fred lived at Mt. Pleasant until Fred died in 1980, then Mabel remained on the farm until 1992, when she became too ill to stay alone. She passed away in 1996.

Ed Smith was born in Derby, England, on March 7, 1852. In 1874 he and his sister Katherine came to the United States by steamship and migrated westward. On October 19, 1893, he married widow Angeline Wright-Johnson in Liberty, Nebraska. They continued traveling and after crossing nearly the entire United States, they found the place they could call home. Perhaps the green rolling hills reminded him of his home in England. He purchased the Mount Pleasant farm in 1905 and built a home and there he spent the rest of his days.



Ed Smith built a new house in 1905. In later years it has been remodeled, but the house is still standing. The farm lies between Mount Pleasant on the west and rolling mountains in the distance to the east.





The red barn and machine shed were built by Fred Smith and neighbor Joe Pietrok in 1948. The barn contained milking stanchions for eight cows plus a calf pen; box stalls for four horses; a granary; and a haymow. During the first years loose hay was stored, then later baled hay filled the haymow.

The machine shed held farm equipment and later a John Deere tractor was kept there.
