The Original house was remodeled in 2002. The remodeled house has incorporated the original wood floors. The barn and machine shed were built in the 1940's by Elmer H. Schneider.

History of crops or livestock raised on farm or ranch:

What were the early crops or livestock?

Early crops on the farm consisted of those similar to other early diversified farms such as hay, cereal grains, and livestock.

How many acres were included in original farm or ranch?

The original farm consisted of 202 acres in 1887.

How did the crops / livestock / use of farm or ranch change over the years?

In the early years the farm was operated as a typical diversified Willamette Valley farm where John Schneider and then Arthur worked and raised their families. The farm was operated as a grade A dairy in the 40s and 50s by Elmer and Ruth Schneider. When Elmer and Ruth discontinued active dairying they continued to raise replacement heifers. They diversified in to other crops. They raised strawberries, field and sweet corn in the 60s and wheat and grains into the 70s. Upon Elmer's death in 1974, Ruth continued to manage the farm with the assistance of others. Ruth worked on the farm as the Secretary and Deputy Clerk for School District 91. In the early 80s Kathleen and Norman Charpilloz began raising sheep and soon transformed into a purebreed operation. Ruth provided her record keeping expertise during vaccination time.

Kathleen and Norman's middle son Michael produces grass seed on the majority of the farm.

The purebred sheep operation continues today with the day-to-day work managed by Lisa Charpilloz Hanson and her family, Char-Land Farms sheep have produced many class winners. In 2006, Char-Land Farms and the honor of winning the coveted "Gold Bell" at the Oregon State Fair as well as having a Champion or Reserve Champion for the Hampshire breed at the Oregon, California, and Western Washington State Fairs.

SCHNEIDER FAMILY FARM ESTABLISHED 1887

The Schneider family farm is located in Clackamas County, Oregon between Needy and Monitor and is bordered by the Willamette Meridian to the West, Schneider Road to the North and Barlow Road to the East. The farm was purchased by John E. Schneider on August 30, 1887 and contained approximately 200 acres. The farm was part of a land donation claim established in 1851 by William Kiser that a contained a total of 617 acres.

John Schneider was born in Saxony Germany, April 19, 1833. John completed an education as a physician and lawyer but never really practiced those professions. Instead he chose to live on a farm in Russia for a short time and moved back to Germany but found that conditions in Europe did not afford the kind of opportunities that he desired. In 1874 he boarded a vessel bound for the United States and eventually located in Kearney County, Nebraska where he established his homestead of 80 acres. After farming in the Midwest for several years he, like many others looked to the west for more opportunities and relocated his wife and children to Oregon purchasing the farm between Needy and Monitor. John raised grains, fruits and vegetables on the farm. In a published biographical record about John it stated; "He believes in conditions where everyone has equal chances providing they know enough to avail themselves of them".

John and his wife Maria had five children all of whom located in or around Clackamas County. The children's names were: Alfred, Paul, Arthur, Bertha and Minnie.

John eventually deeded pieces of the original farm to his children. In 1905 Arthur obtained from his father approximately 55 acres most of which remains in the family today. Arthur and his first wife Anna sold one-half acre of the farm to brother Alfred in 1909. This piece of property eventually was deeded back to Arthur. Arthur and his first wife Anna had two daughters: Pauline and Eveline. The couple divorced in 1911. Arthur remarried, and he and his second wife Velma had seven children: Wilber, Elmer, Elnora, Wilma, Bertha, Maxine, and Roberta. Elmer eventually would purchase the farm from his father Arthur.

It is evident by the Clackamas County deed records that the children John wanted to keep as much of the original farm in the hands of the Schneider family. Various pieces of the property were deeded to Paul, Alfred and Bertha by Arthur.

Arthur's brother Paul Schneider petitioned the county in 1906 to have a road built from the corner of section 13 and 18 to the corner of section 18 and 17 of Township 5 S. Range 1 E. The establishment of the road was approved by the County Court of Clackamas County and named "Paul Schneider Road" number 628. This road, now known as Schneider Road, exists today and borders the current farm.

Arthur and Velma maintained the farm and rural residence until 1943 when the farm was deeded to Elmer and his wife Ruth. Arthur passed away on December 7, 1946.

Elmer and Ruth were married on or about 1939. In the 40's and 50's Elmer began to operated the farm as a Grade A Dairy. Operating a dairy was hard work, and eventually Elmer and Ruth discontinued running an active dairy but continued to raise replacement heifers. Elmer and Ruth had one daughter, Kathleen who was born on May 26, 1947. In the 60's they diversified the farm operation into other crops such as strawberries, field corn, sweet corn and in the 70's wheat and grains. Elmer passed away in 1974, which left managing the farm to Ruth. In order to preserve the farm it was necessary for Ruth to work off the farm as secretary and deputy clerk of School District 91. With the off farm work and the assistance of others the farm was able to stay in the family.

Kathleen Schneider married Norman Charpilloz on September 10, 1966. They were actively involved in the farm operation, while maintaining off the farm jobs. Kathleen and Norman began raising sheep and in the early 80's transformed the farm into a purebred Suffolk and Hampshire operation. The sheep operation was named Char-Land Farms. The dairy barn was modified to accommodate the needs of the sheep operation. Ruth often would assist her daughter and son-in-law by providing her record keeping expertise when it was time to vaccinate. Kathleen and Norman had three children, Lisa, Michael and Jeffrey. During their children's youth they were actively involved in 4-H and FFA and benefited from the families efforts to breed and produce high quality livestock.

Ruth established a deed record transferring the farm to Kathleen prior to her death on February 19, 1993. Ruth maintained her residence on the farm until her passing, when Michael moved into the farm residence. Michael and his wife Susan lived on the farm until the summer of 1997, when Lisa and her husband moved to the farm. During Michael's tenure on the farm he recognized a growing market for tall fescue and began producing grass seed on the majority of the farm. Michael continues to manage the majority of the farm today.

Lisa and her husband Alan married on November 13, 1993. The purebred sheep operation continues today with the day-to-day work managed by Lisa Charpilloz Hanson and her family. Char-Land Farms has produced many class winners. In 2006, the farm had the honor of winning the coveted "Gold Bell" at the Oregon State fair as well having a Champion or Reserve champion Hampshire at the Oregon, California and Western Washington State fairs.

As the farm sits today it is approximately 120 years old. The direct ancestry of the farm is as follows:

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
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
